## Did you know that every Georgia student gets 30 hours to use towards Dual Enrollment?

\*Dual Enrollment (DE) is open to all 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> grade students who meet the requirements set by the college.

\*10<sup>th</sup> grade students can qualify if they have a 1200 SAT or a 26 ACT Score

## **Dual Enrollment Opportunities in Houston County:**

**Houston County Career Academy (HCCA)** ~ This is a county program that services all high schools, transportation is provided, and there are limited slots. The HCCA offers specific technical programs through DE with Central GA Technical College (CGTC) and Middle GA State University (MGA) on the HCCA campus for students who qualify. To apply students must register during the advisement process and see their counselor. Students are selected based on criteria set forth by HCCA and availability in the program. Some of these programs are a two year commitment and will require the use of *two* periods in the student's schedule each semester. These slots are competitive and not everyone is guaranteed a seat in the program.

**On-Campus DE** ~ There are four on campus DE opportunities taught by the high school teachers, credit awarded through Central GA Technical College (CGTC).

- US History Taught in 11<sup>th</sup> grade HIST 2111 (fall) HIST 2112 (spring)
  \*Both are required if taking on the high school campus
- Economics and Sociology Taught in 12<sup>th</sup> grade ECON 1101 (fall)
  SOCI 1101 (spring)
  \*Both are required if taking on the high school campus
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\*\*Each of these course uses 3 DE hrs. A student who takes all SIX on-campus DE courses will utilize 18 DE hours.

**Traditional DE** ~ DE can be taken at several colleges in the state of GA, a full list of participating colleges and courses offered can be found on GAFutures.org. Students are responsible for applying to the college of their choice, having their high school transcript sent, and registering for coursework at the college (available DE courses at each college are also on GAFutures.org). Students must also let their counselor know they are applying for DE and bring their counselor their registration document for the college classes each semester by the deadline set by the Houston County Board of Education to qualify for DE funding. Students are responsible for transportation and any fees not covered by DE funding (lab fees and book fees may apply).

\*\*Hours used in this format will depend on how many courses students take.

## All three of these options require students and parents to complete the DE Funding Application on GAFutures.org once a year to receive funding for course work at the college level.
