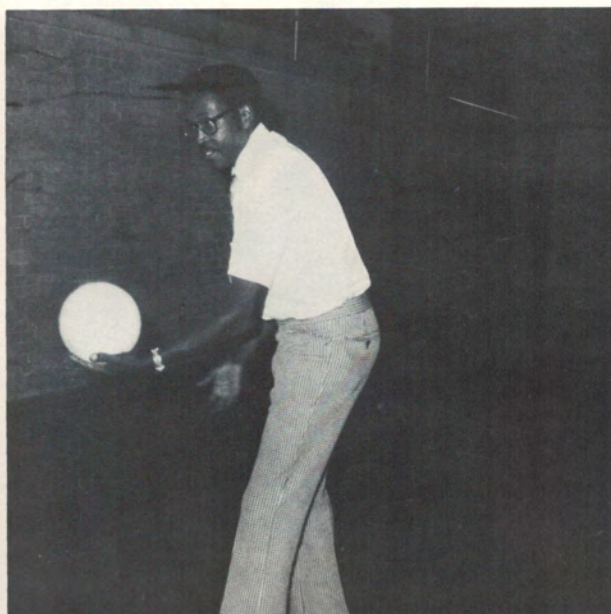
Elvin McCann — Principal

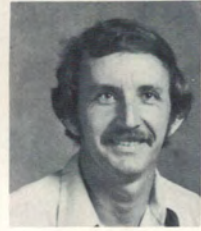

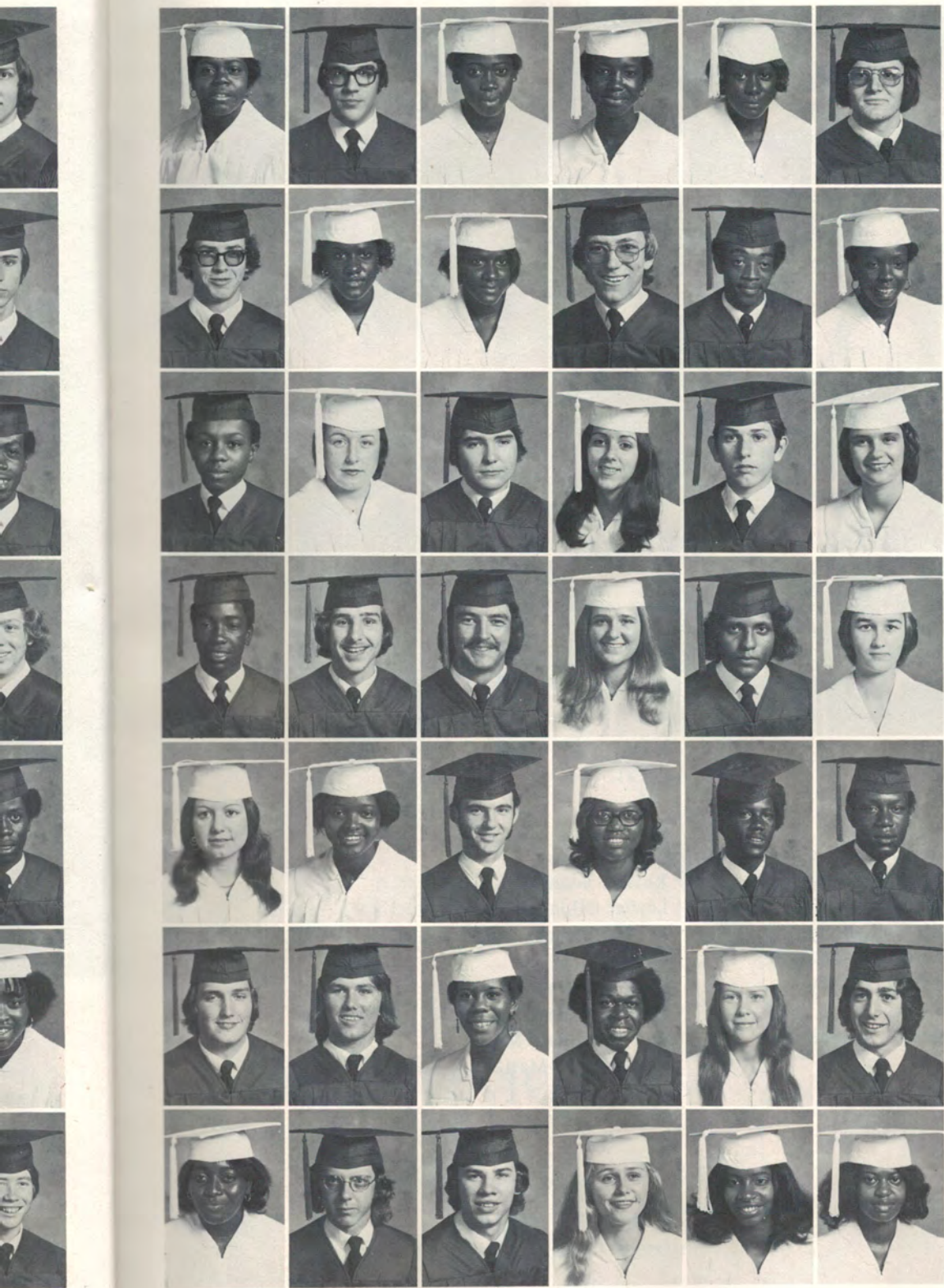

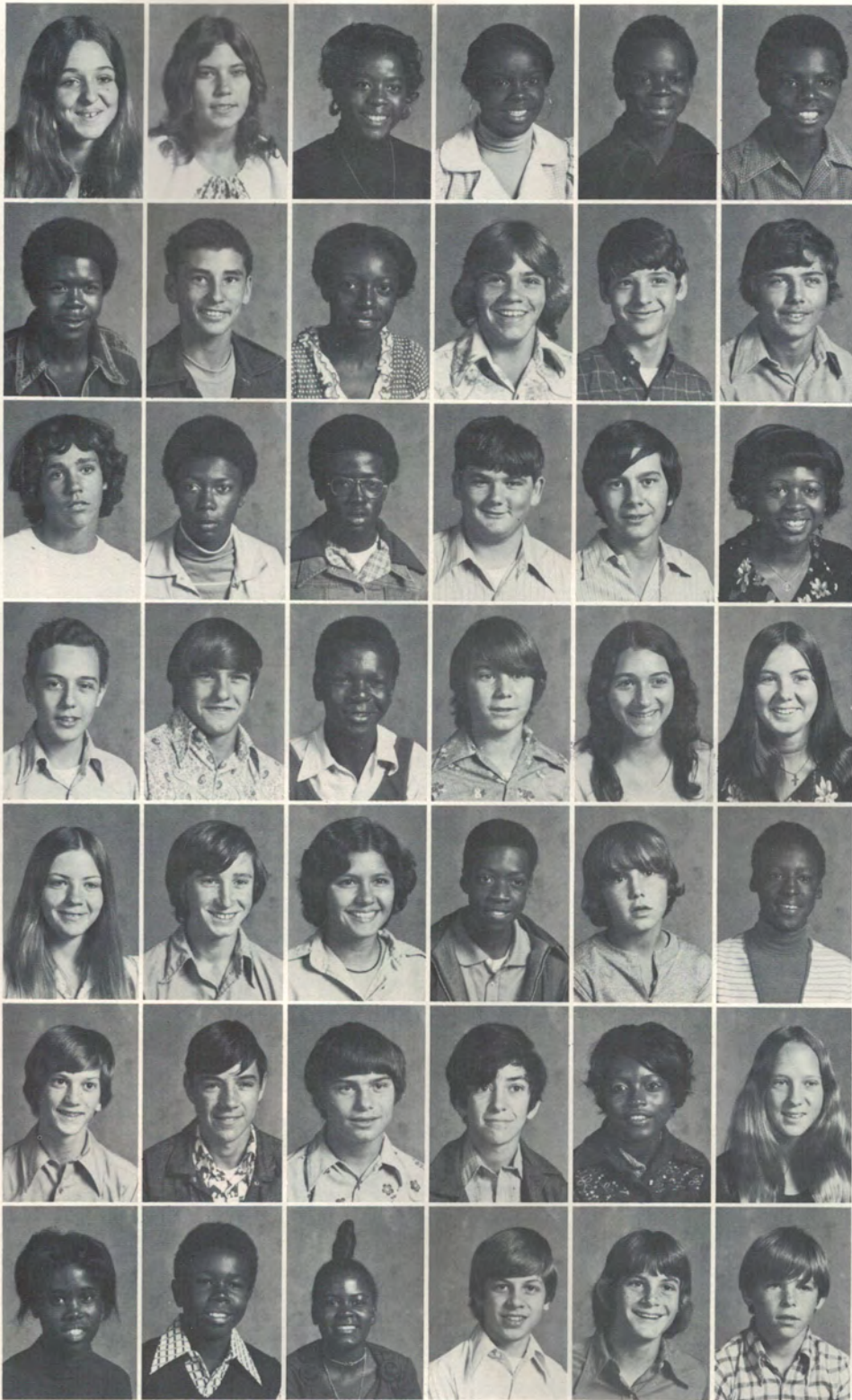
