Students identified as struggling with reading are assigned to a Study Skills class that utilizes the Reading Horizons program to remediate skills deficits. Students will receive the following as needed: remedial math support for 47 minutes 1-3x's weekly with a classroom teacher, part-time tutor, instructional coach, interventionist, or paraprofessional.
- 2. Hold parent-teacher conference during which this compact will be discussed as it relates to the individual child's academic achievement. Conferences will be held: (Describe when, where, and how staff will be available for consultation with parents must be at least annually.)
 - Certified staff will be available for parent-teacher conferences Monday-Friday from 7:40-4:00 by appointment. Conferences can be held in person or virtually through Microsoft Teams or by phone via SchoolStatus.
