2.	 Public Comment Beth Basher, a New Milford resident, said she has two daughters at Schaghticoke Middle School who continue to be bullied both emotionally and physically. The bully continues to get off easy while her children need to change the way they go to school. She has to fight everyday to get her child to go to school because she is afraid for her life. Melody Melendez, a Sherman resident, said her daughter goes to Schaghticoke and they have a new meaning for the word SURGE – survival under a rigorous gruesome environment. She said her daughter's grades plummeted in the second marking period due to the bullying issues at the school. She said parents should not have to fear for the safety of their children when they go to school.	Public Comment
	Olivia Vannek, a New Milford resident, asked the Board not to ignore the bullying issue. She said it is not fair that kids don't want to get out of bed to	

		go to school due to fear. She urged that the Board build a safe school environment. She also urged students to learn to walk away if they are being bullied. McKenzie Basher, a New Milford resident, said she has been a victim of bullying and suffers panic attacks and is scared to go into the classrooms. She said her mother reached out about the bullying and did not receive a call back nor an email in response. Annabelle Martinez, a New Milford resident, said there should be consequences to bullying. She sees shoving in the hallways and witnessed 24 acts of uncomfortable behavior. She said she has seen the bullying getting out of control. Mrs. McInerney thanked the students who spoke up and said they were very brave to do so.

Mrs. Sarich said there needs to be major changes at Schaghticoke in regards to stopping bullying. She is horrified at what happens at the school and thinks it is outrageous that no one reached back out to the parents who complained about their children being the victims of bullying.

Mrs. McInerney said the school is obligated to report bullying and asked if that is being done and asked how the Board could insure it gets done. Dr. Parlato said this policy now has more information than the previous policy and includes definitions, information on what needs to happen, and establishes common reporting forms throughout the District.

Mrs. Herring said bullying sometimes needs immediate action and the child needs to be disciplined right away. Dr. Parlato said there will be some professional development around the bullying policy and what needs to happen once a teacher or administrator is made aware of an incident.
