For the school year 2023-2024 the Child Nutrition Program (CNP) of the Mobile County Public School System will continue to provide breakfast and lunch meals to all students at no charge through the USDA Community Eligibility Provision (CEP). In order to receive USDA Reimbursement; Mobile County School District must follow the guideline that requires all meals to be accountable. All students will be issued an identification badge that will be scanned at the Point of Sale; this will identify the students and the meals served.

The Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) program does not require student meal applications, therefore all students will receive breakfast and lunch meals at no charge. The school system will receive reimbursement for a complete reimbursable meal per student. If a student selects a partial meal, he/she will be required to pay for those items separately. A la carte items may be purchased at the food prices approved by Mobile County Public School District's Board of Education.

Meal Prices for School Staff and Visitors are listed below:

Adult Staff: \$3,00 (breakfast); \$4.50 (lunch)

Visitor Child < 10 years: \$3.00 (breakfast); \$4.50 (lunch)

Visitor Adult: \$3.25 (breakfast); \$4.75 (lunch)

Holiday Adult\* \$550

\*Holiday meals would be Thanksgiving, Christmas, Grandparents Day, Black History Month, etc.
