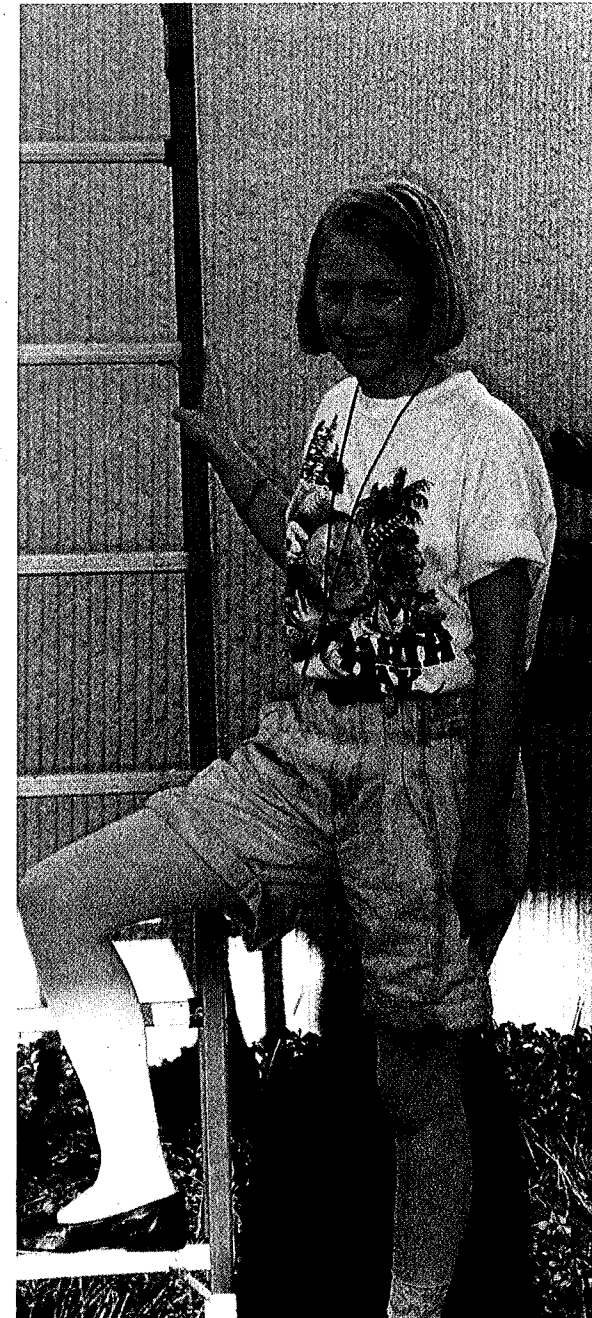
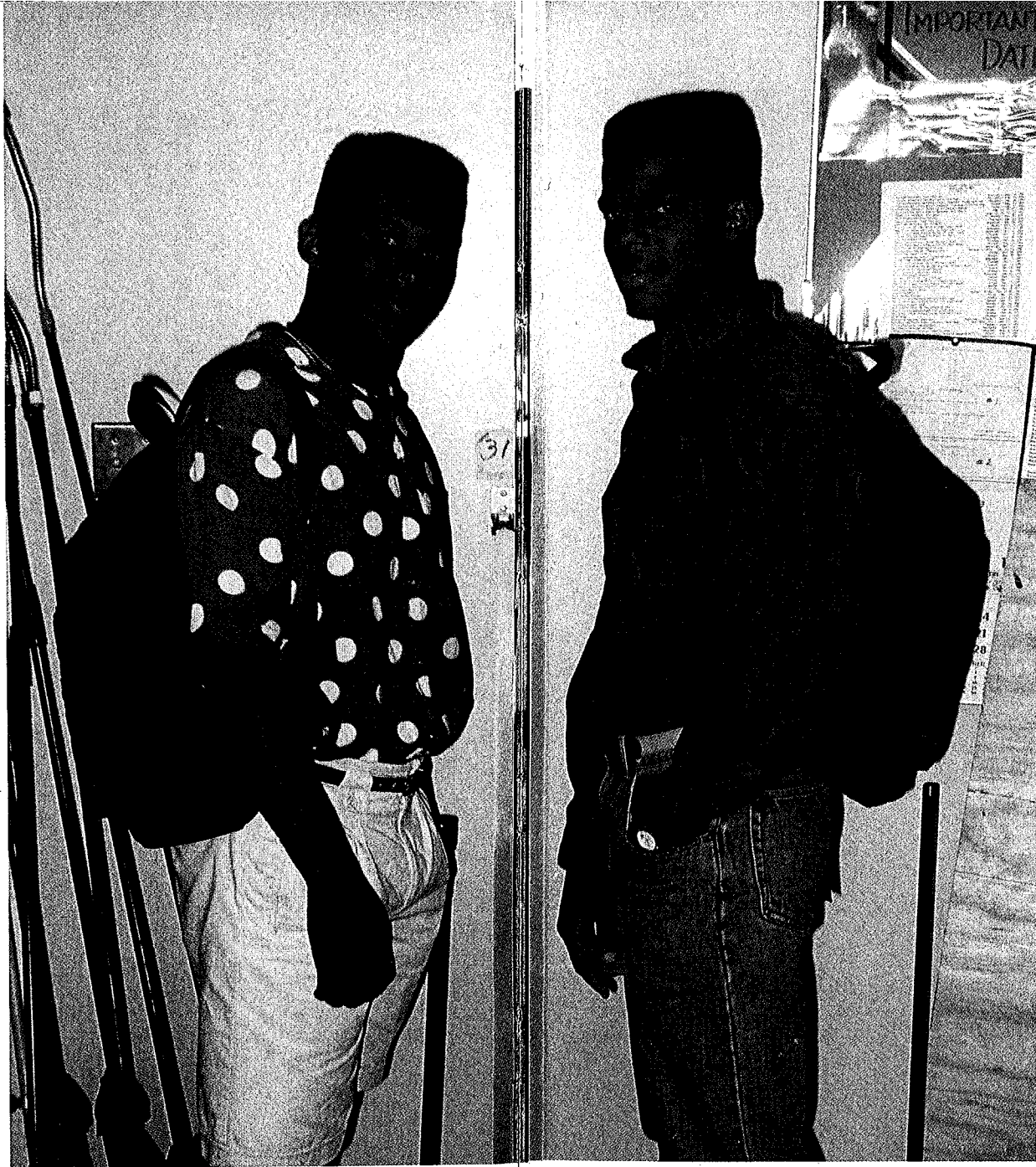
Everyone Marches to a different beat!

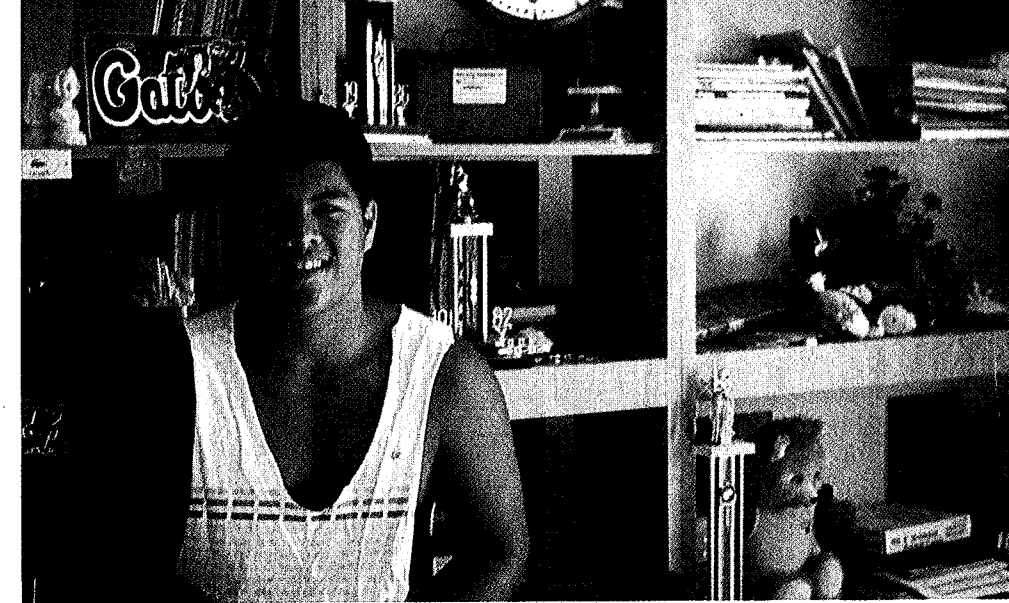

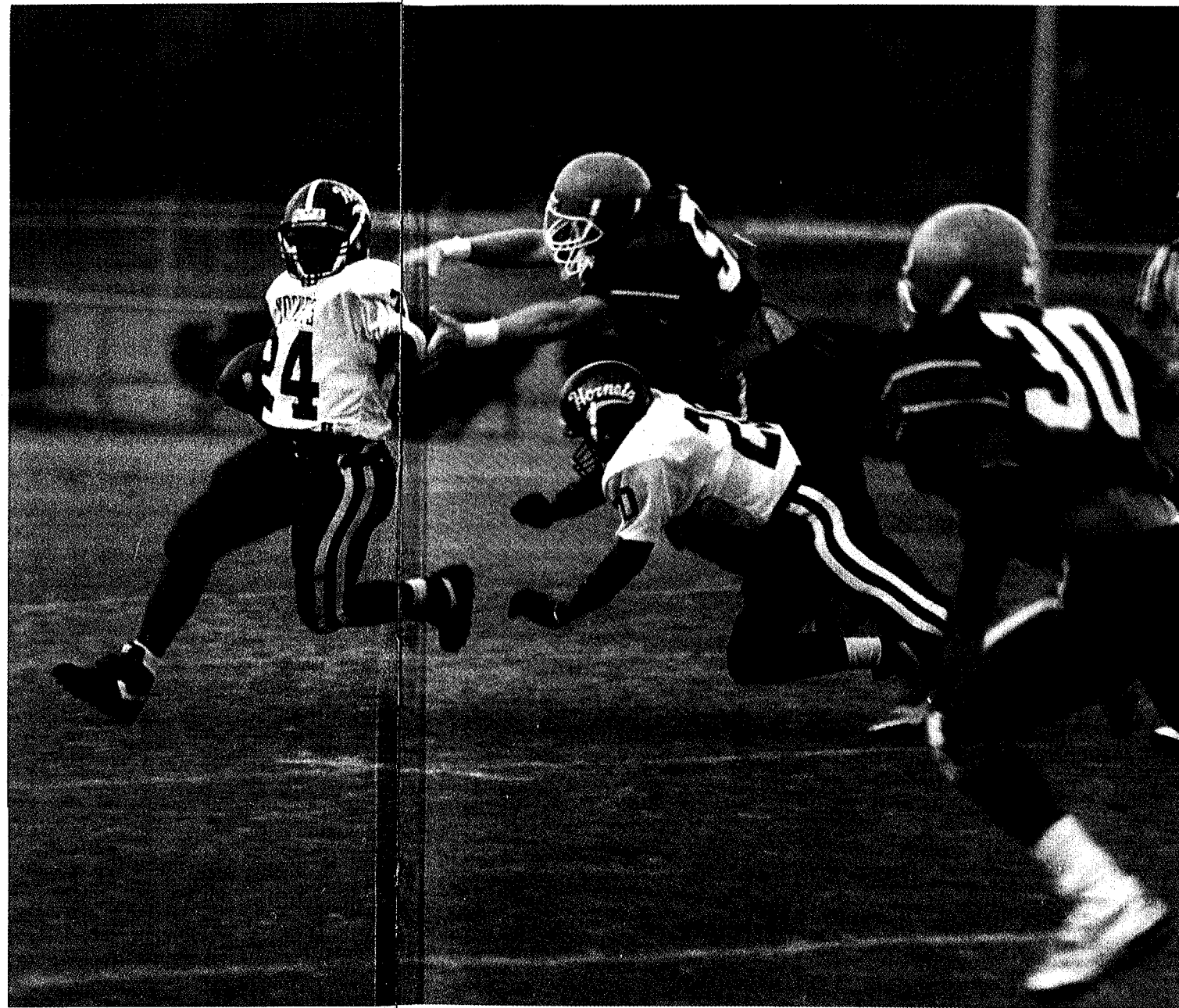
Prayin' for a Cold Front

Although many thought the time change would put a damper on spirits, the Highlander spirit could not have shown brighter.

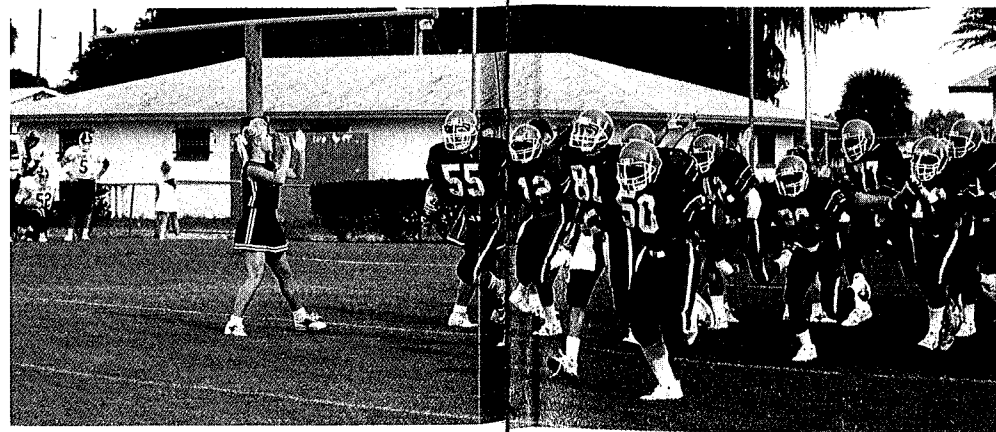
In the first quarter the Highlanders held the Hornets at a 0-0 score while they geared up for the second. Daniel Williams threw a seven play, 47-yard drive with a 21-yard touchdown pass to Willie Larkin for 6. Then Thomas Shuler made a two-point conversion run which made it 8-0. Just seconds later the Hornets fumbled at their own 19-yard line. Williams then threw a perfect pass to Melvin Pearsall to make the score 14-0. To end the half, Paul Byrd made the kick to end the half at 15-0.

To open the second half the Highlanders

busted onto the scene. They made their way down the field in just eight plays when Larkin added to their rising score. The Hornets still had not managed to make a break through the mighty Highlander defense. They did attempt to make a forward pass towards the sideline but it was knocked down by Matt McMaster. The pass looked like a horizontal forward but was ruled as a backwards lateral and Sylvester Carmichael fell on it and the Highlanders got possession. With 4:36 left in the third quarter Larkin took a pitch from Williams and made the score 27-0. In the fourth quarter the Hornets started their comeback but it was too late. The Highlanders had their foothold and would not let this win slip away from them. The Hornets managed to make two touchdowns but the line was drawn there. The Highlanders defeated the Haines City Hornets 27-14.

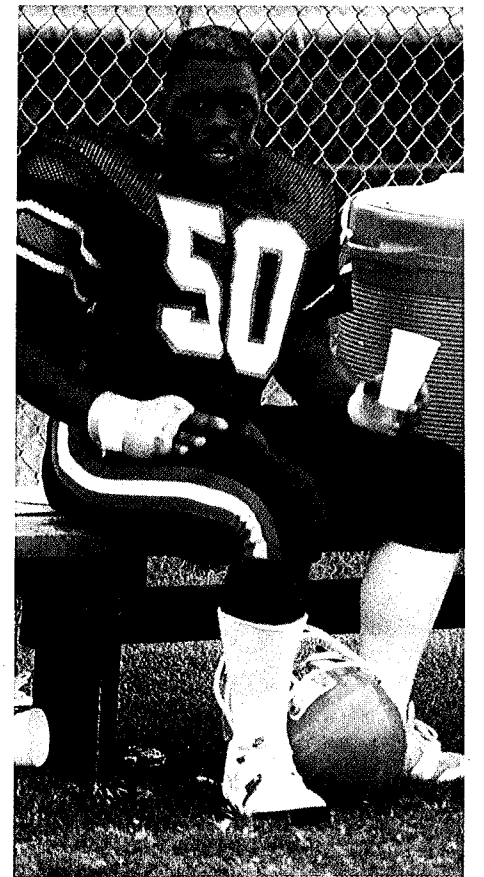
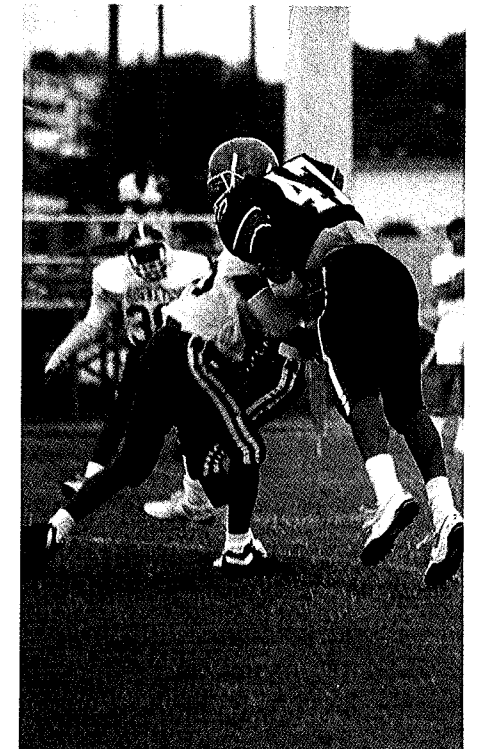

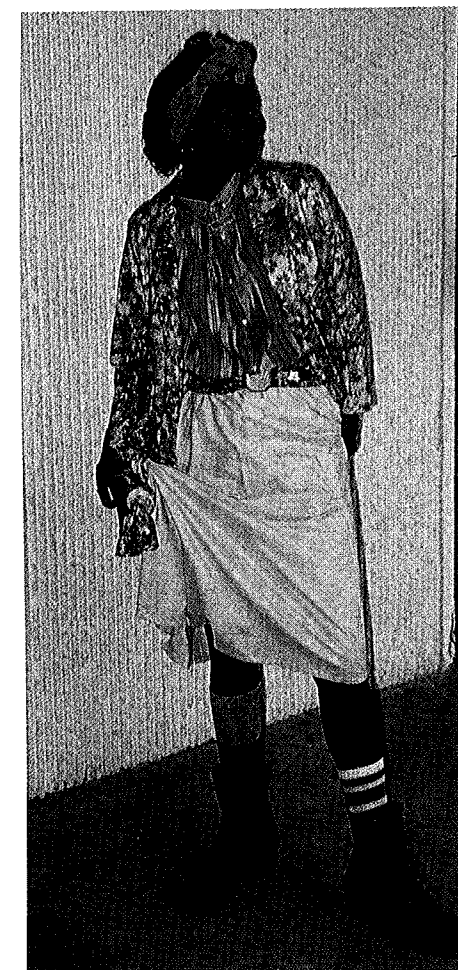

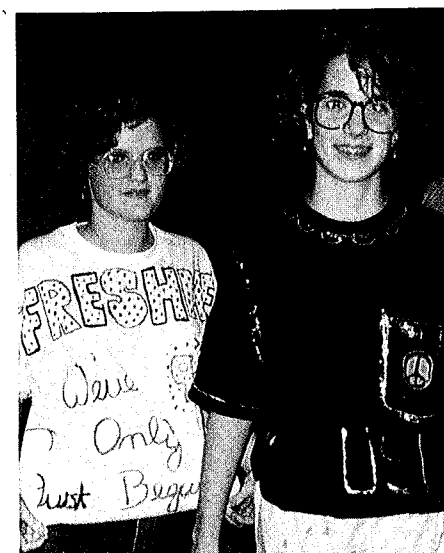

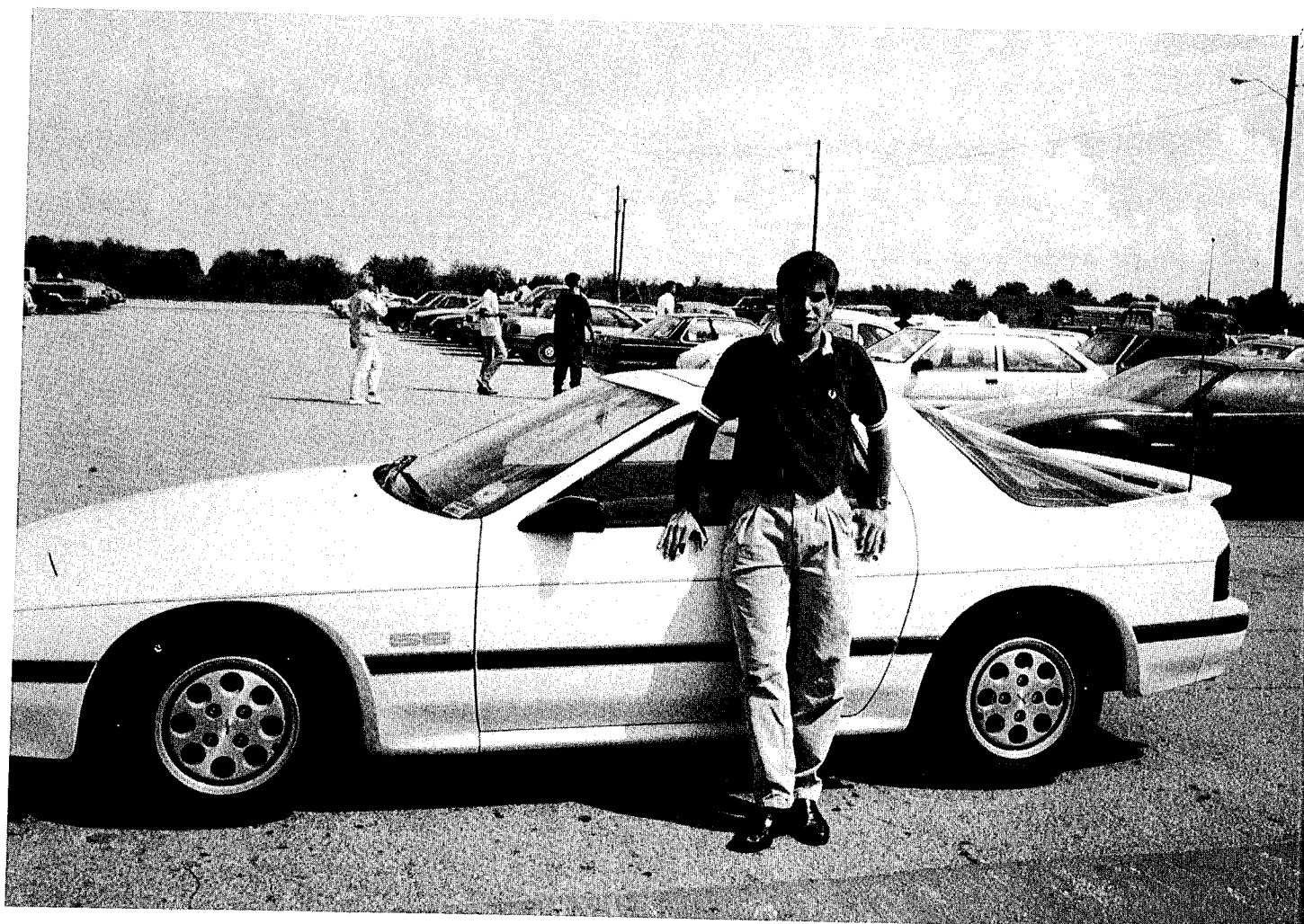

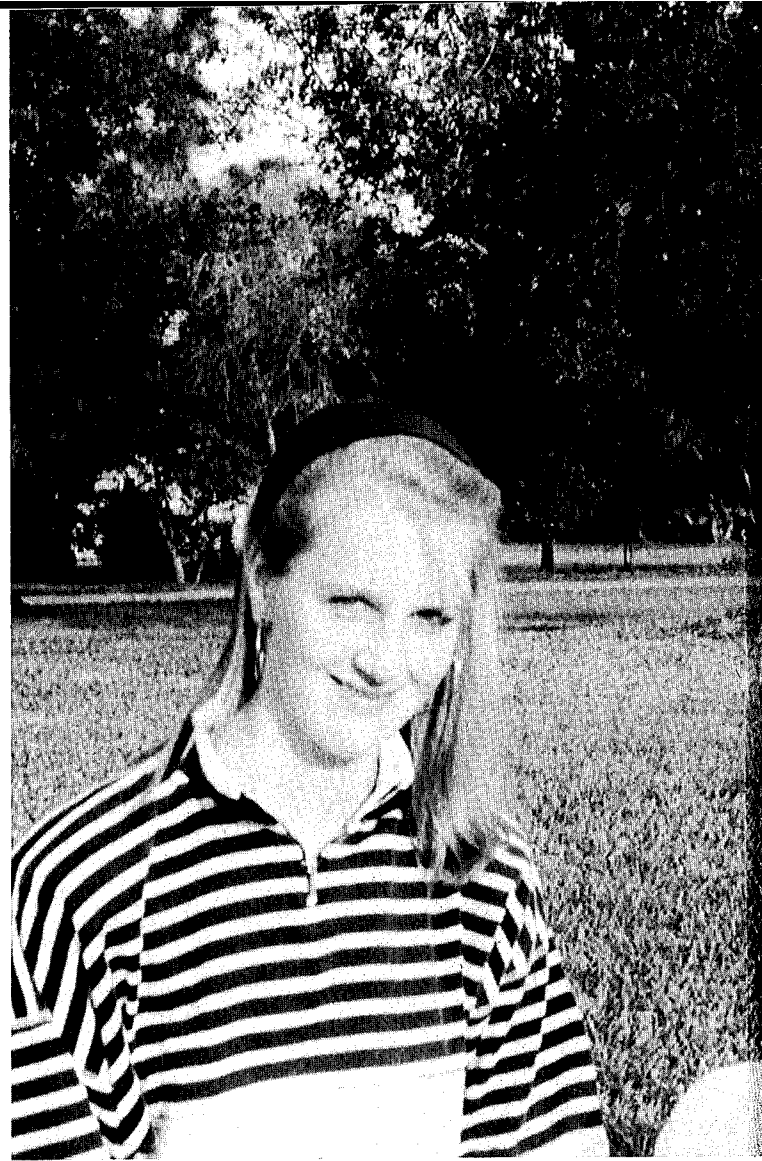
Other activities which she has enjoyed here in the United States are tennis, aerobics, and horseback riding.

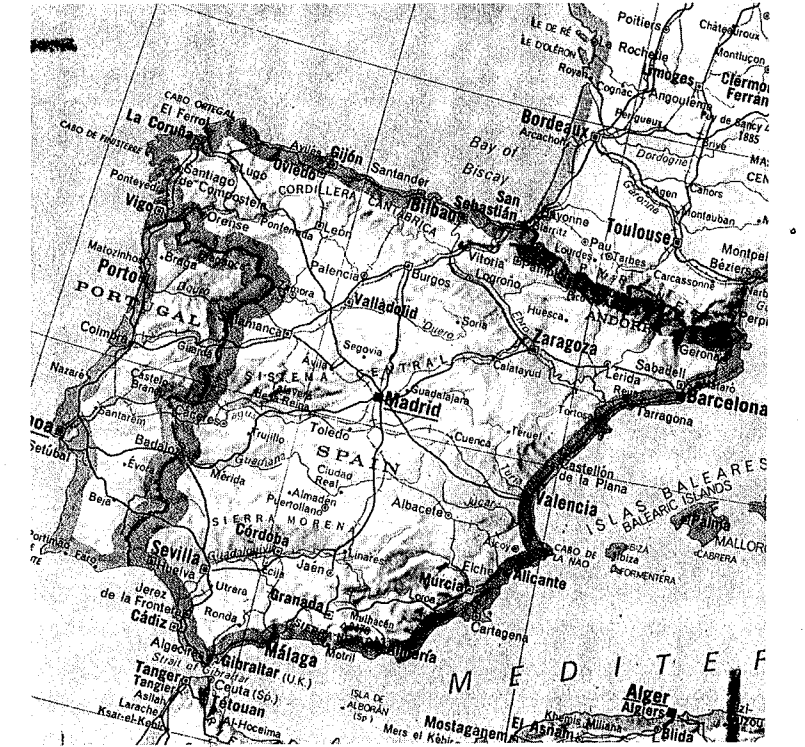

JOBS STRENGTHEN THE HEART

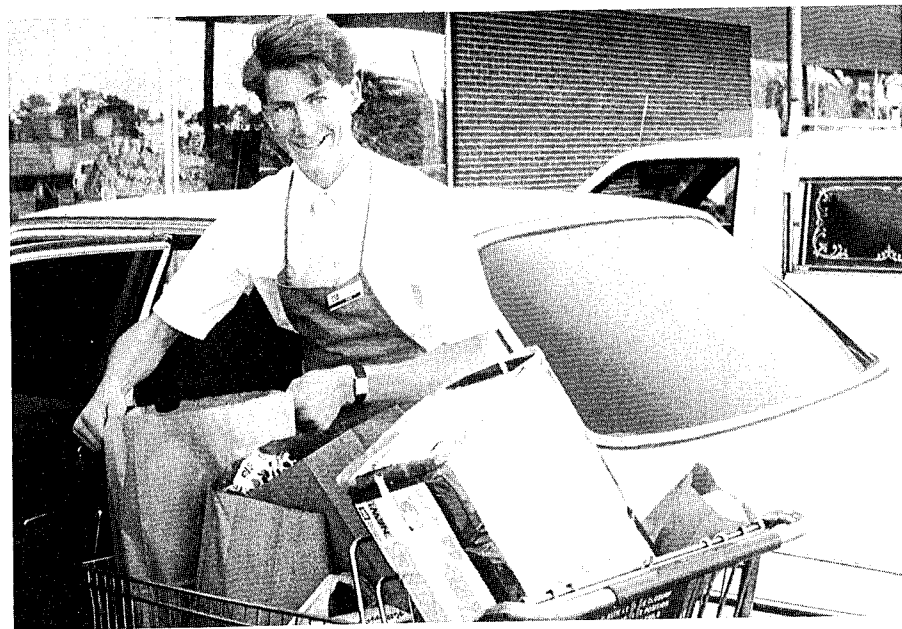

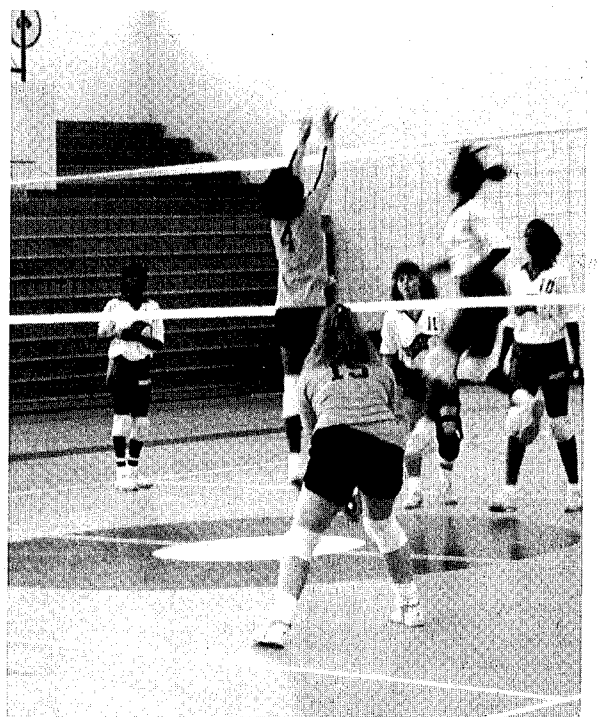
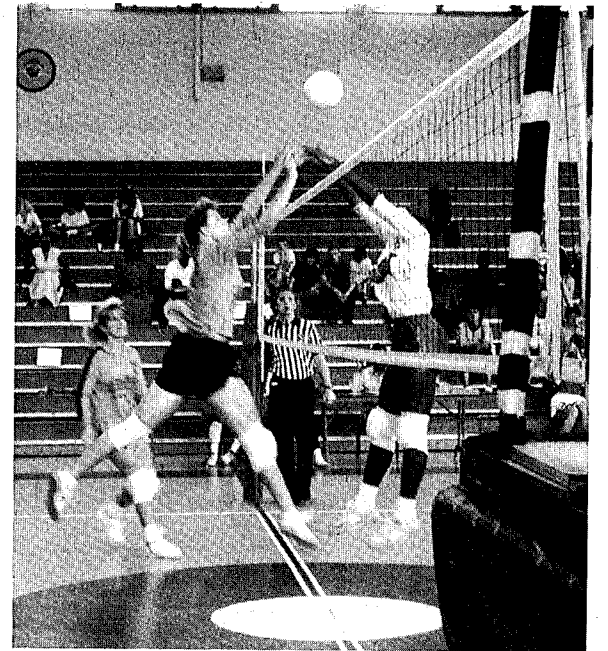

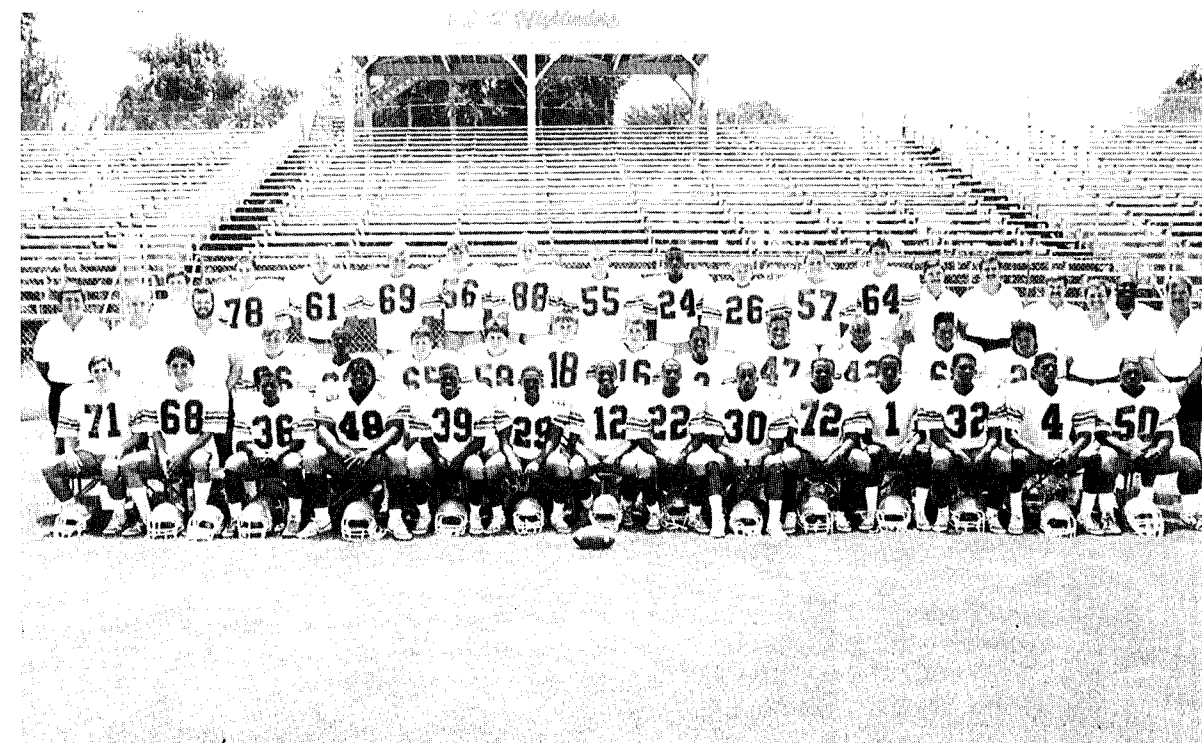
fans came and supported the team, anyway.

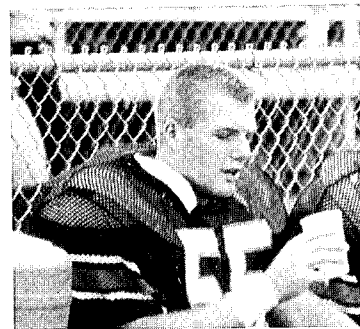

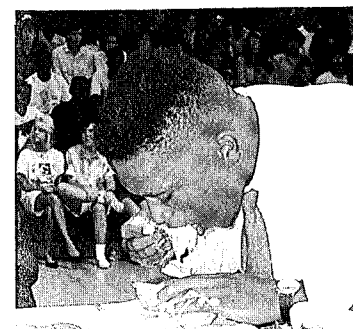

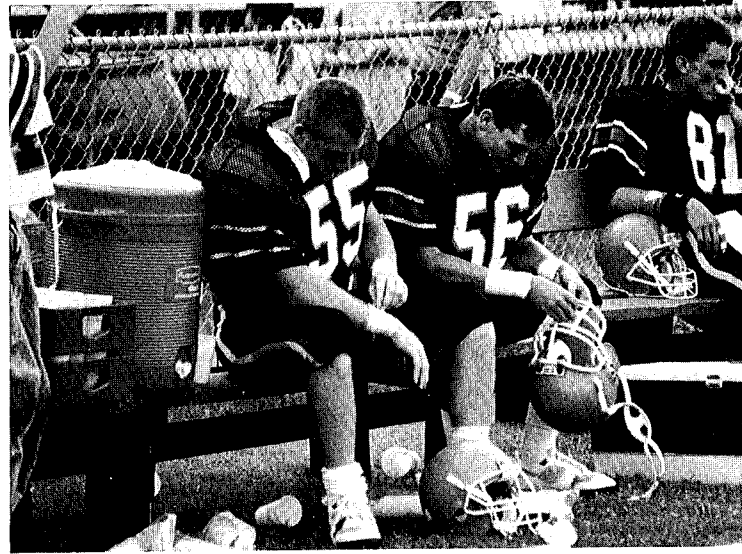

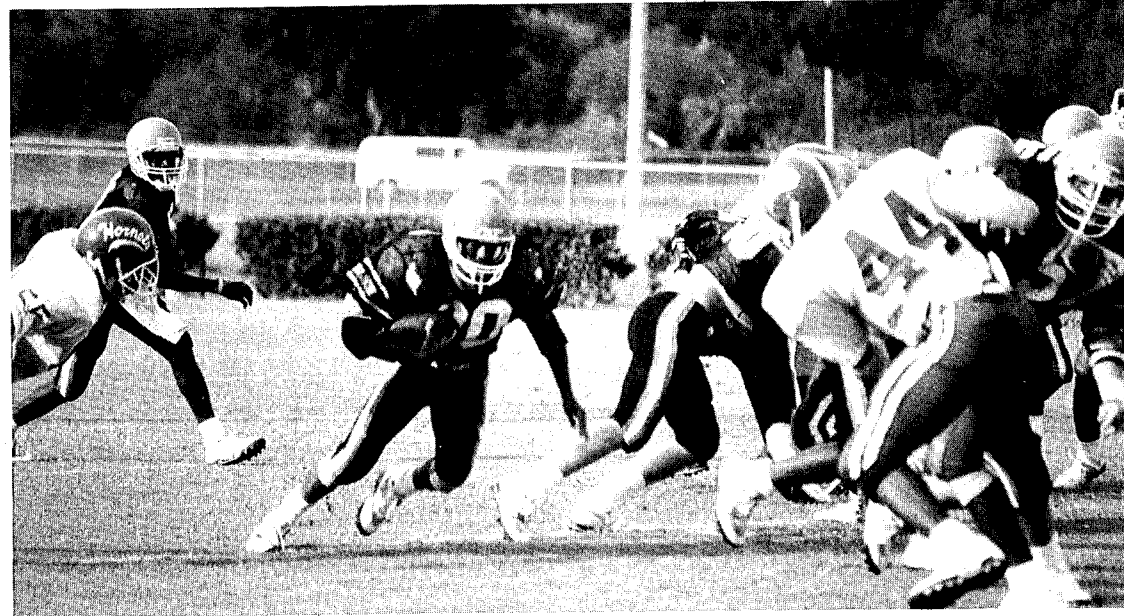

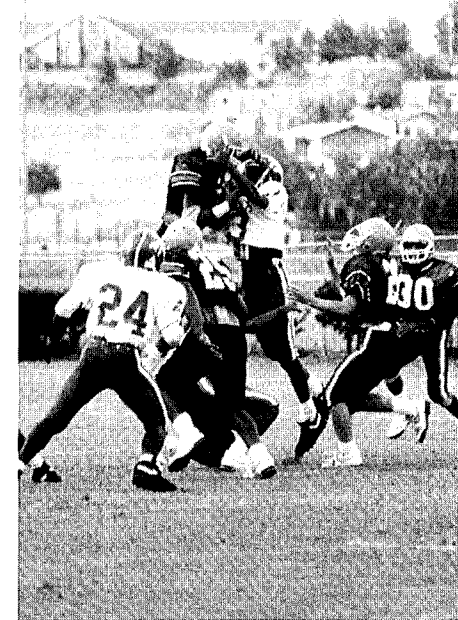

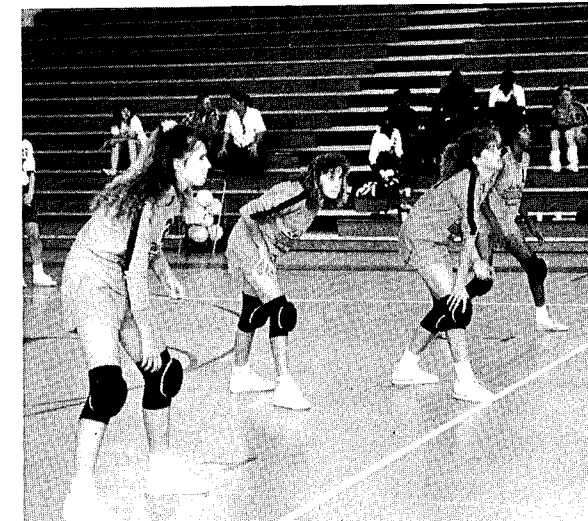


WITH STYLE

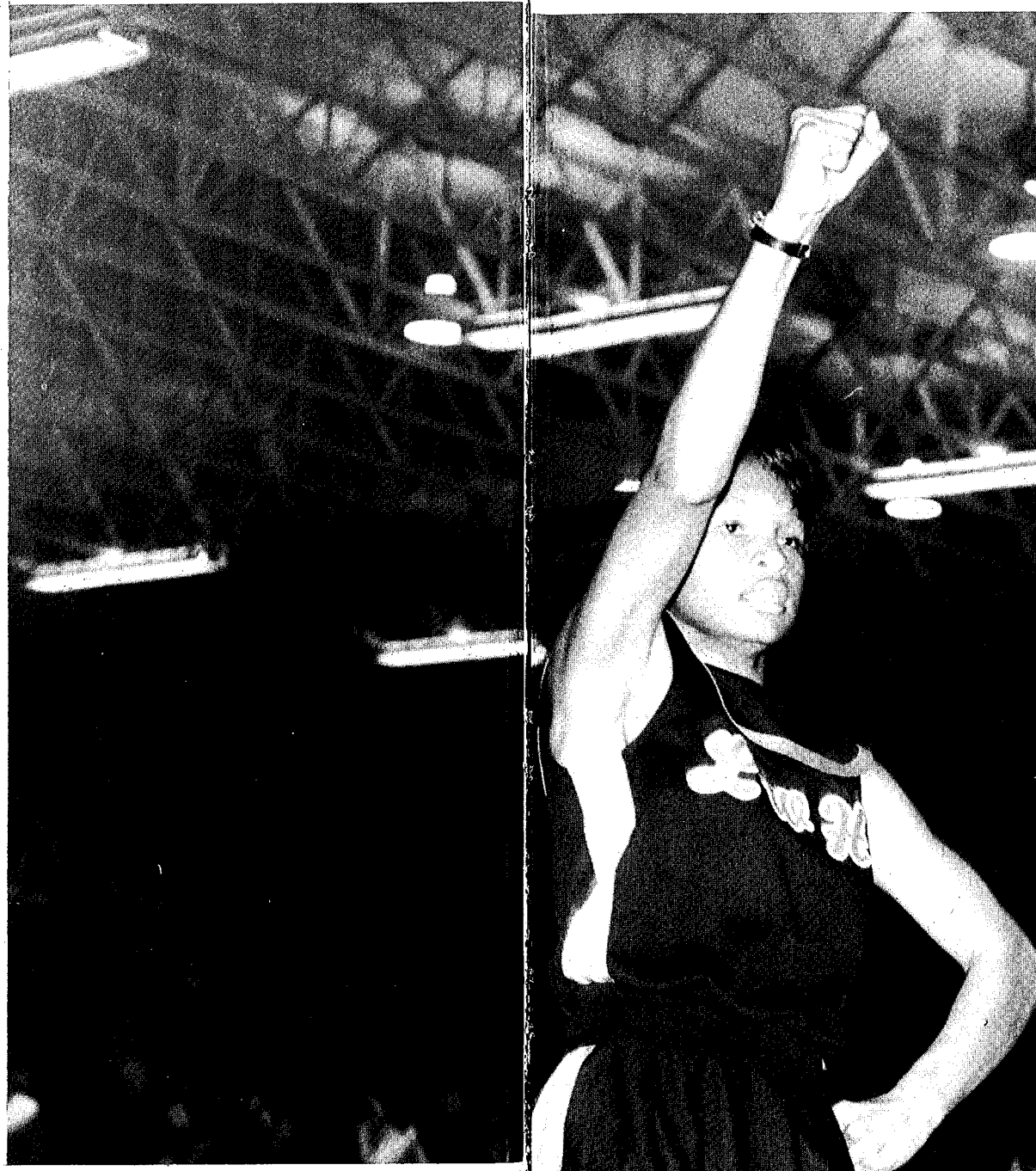

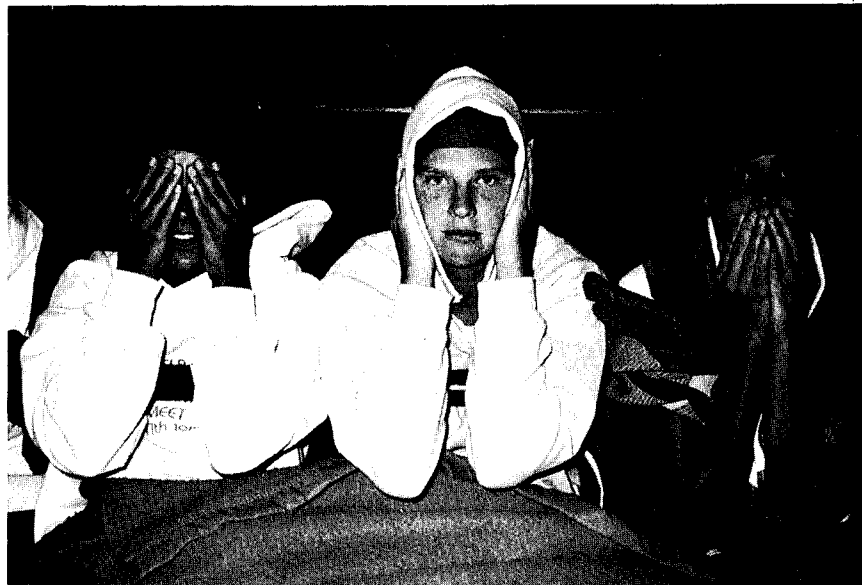

The boys school record was set by Guy Hallack, Steve Kirouac, Chris Tew and Roger Duffield. In Diving the county changed the requirements from 6 dives to 11 dives. Joel Kirouac scored 218 points and established a new school record. Tammy Bair placed first with 296 points, set the new school record and a county record. Tammy Bair was also chosen for the All-Area Swim and Dive team, while Dawnie Beeson recieved Honorable Mention.

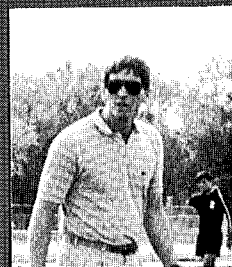

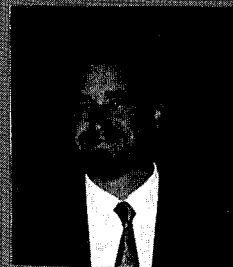

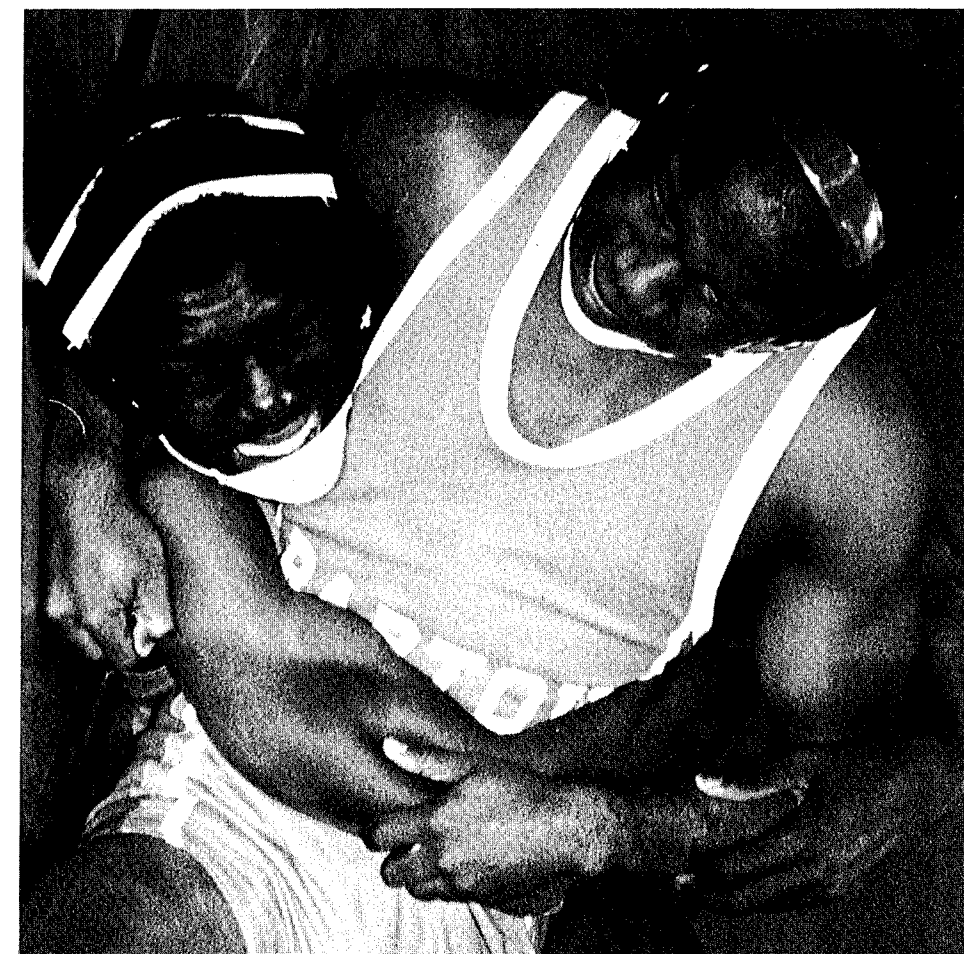
WRESTLING

years that he has been coaching, his guys would come out and play their first year, but would not return the next year due to the lack of interest. He concludes hopefully the next year it will be better for them.

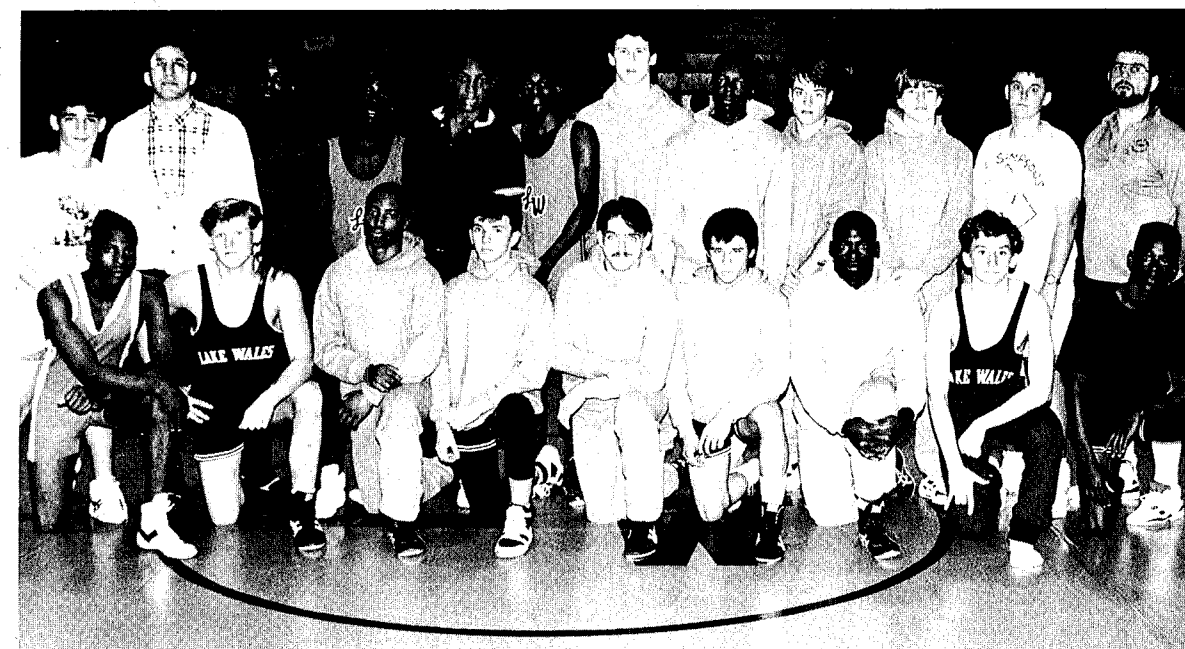
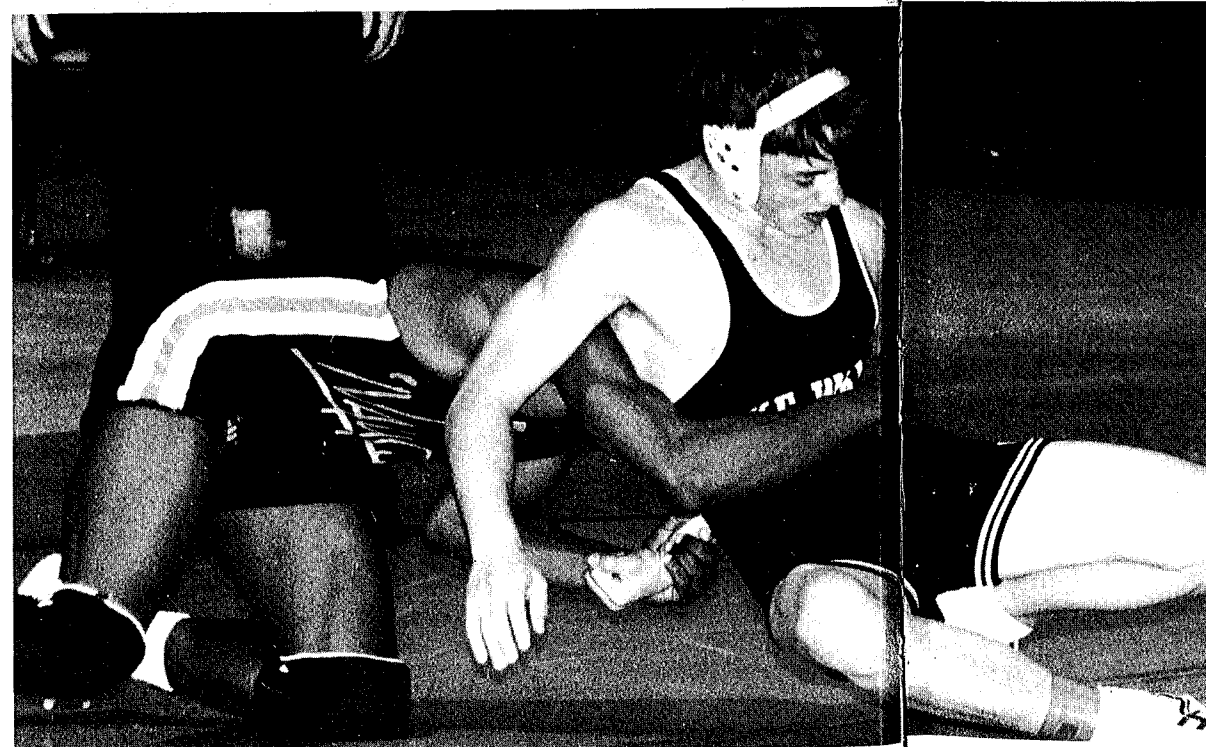

SECRETARIES ARE THE HEARTBEAT

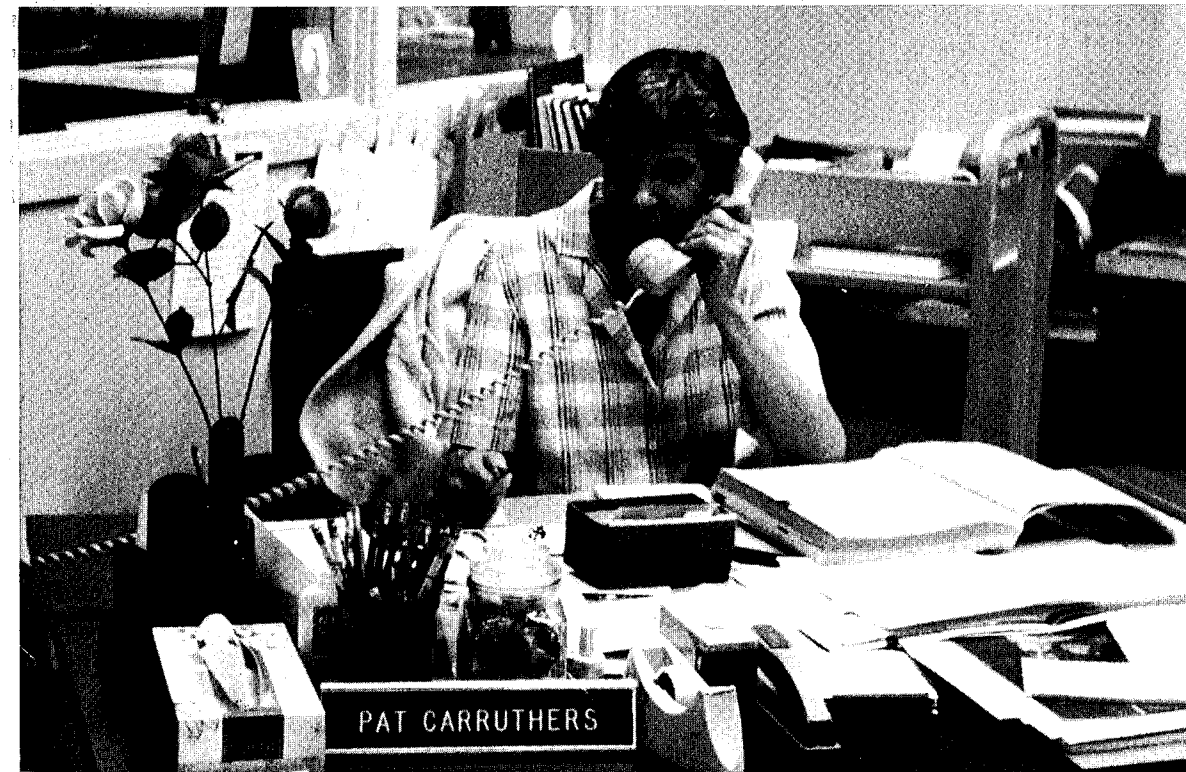

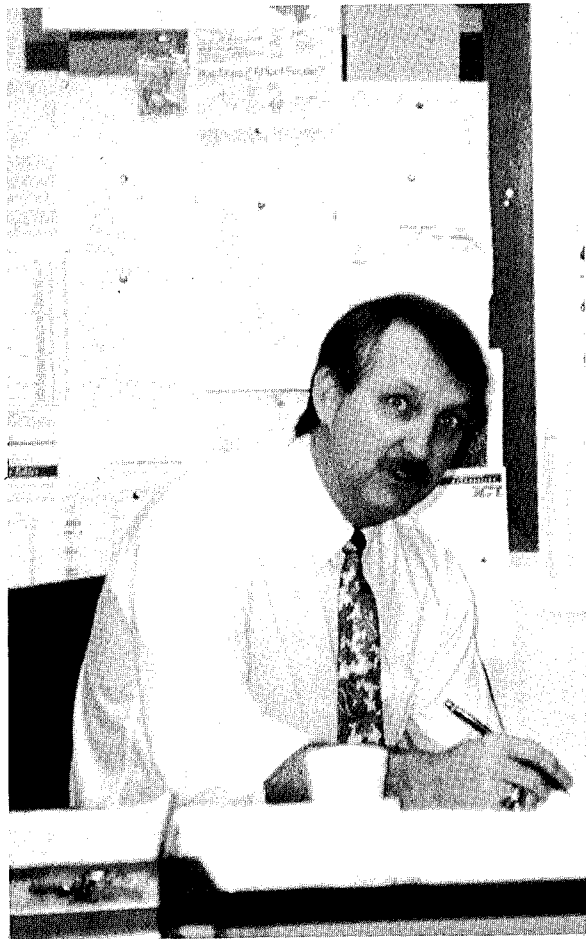

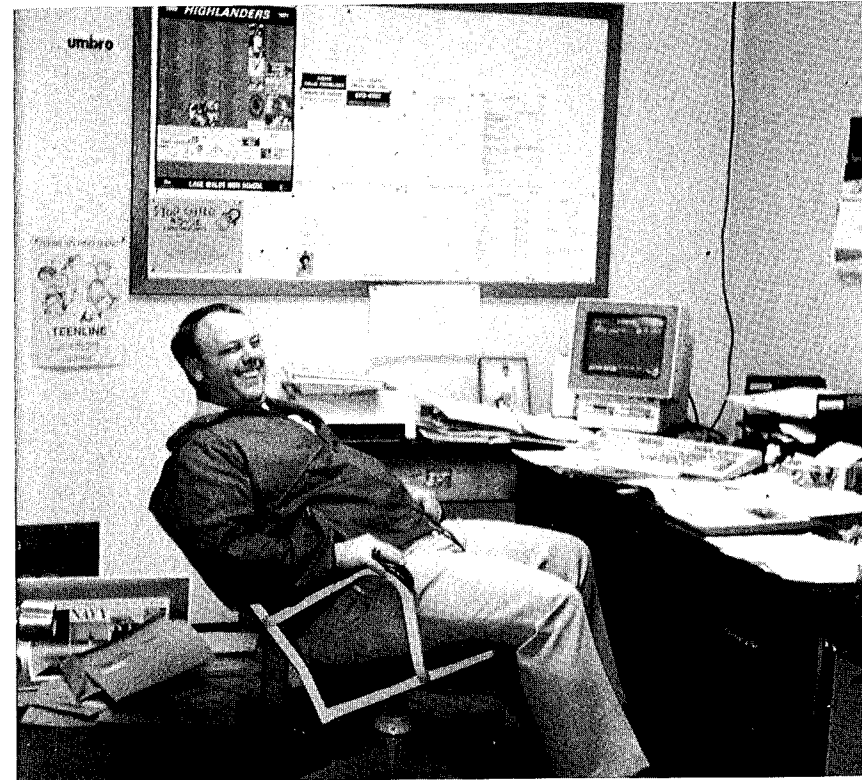
GUIDANCE . . .

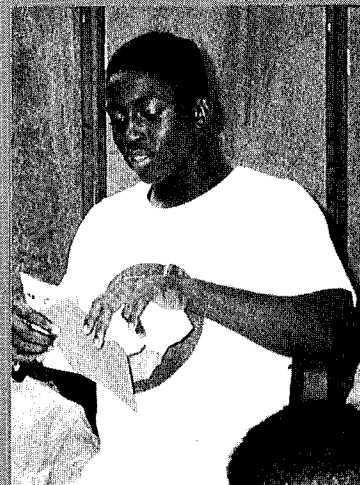


HOME ECONOMICS

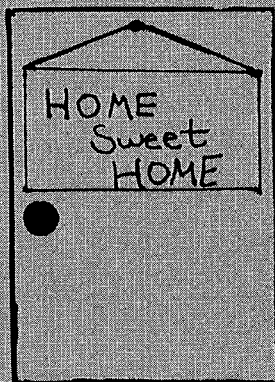

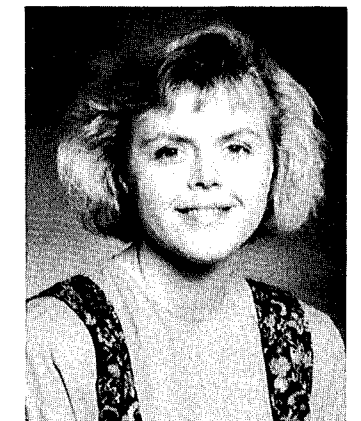

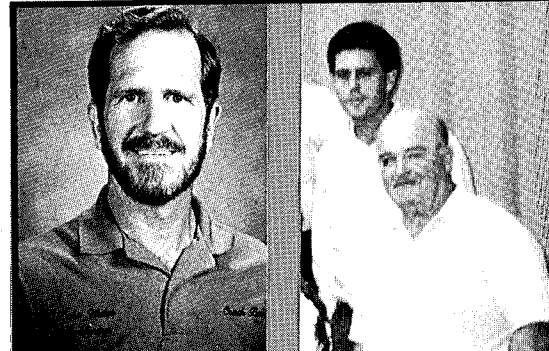
Exceptional Students Excel

skills which help to make each of them special in their own way.

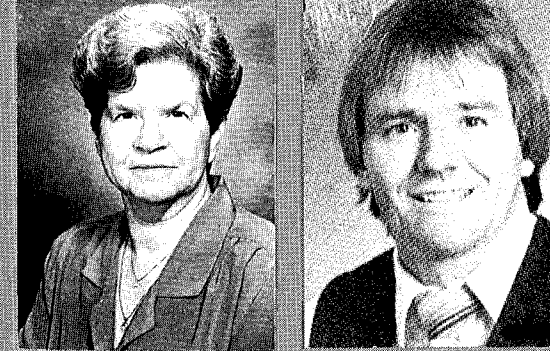

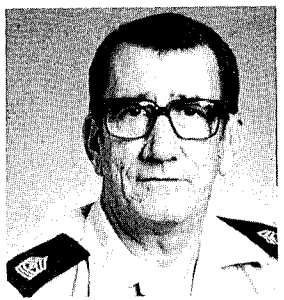
JROTC

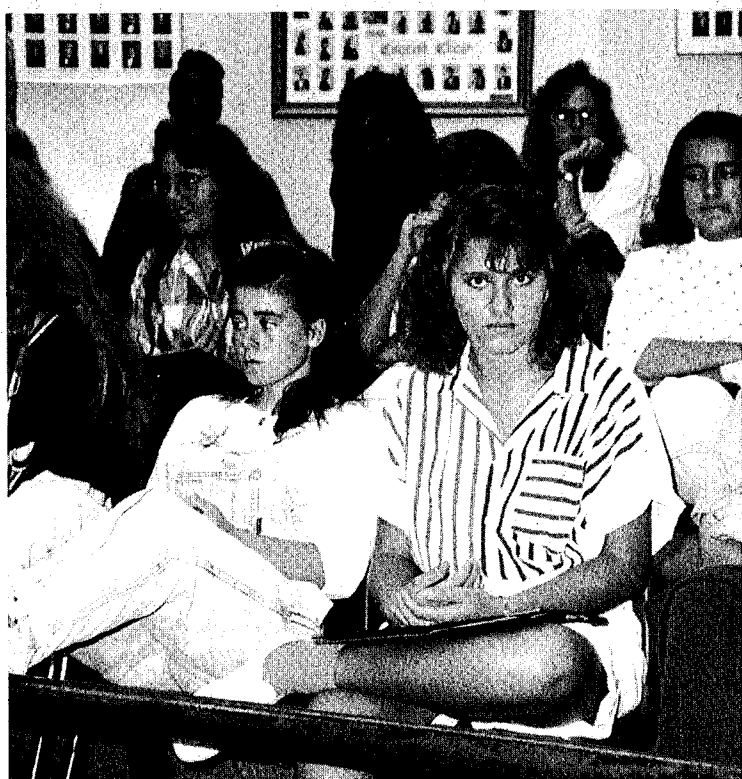
INSTRUMENTAL AND VOCAL TECHNIQUES

busy performing for local clubs and other elementary schools.

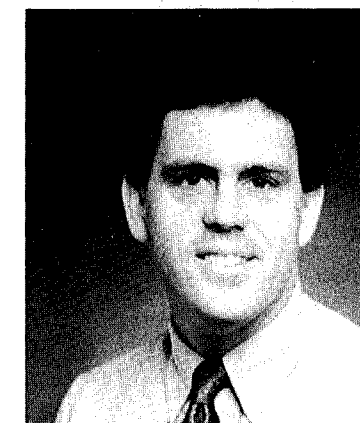

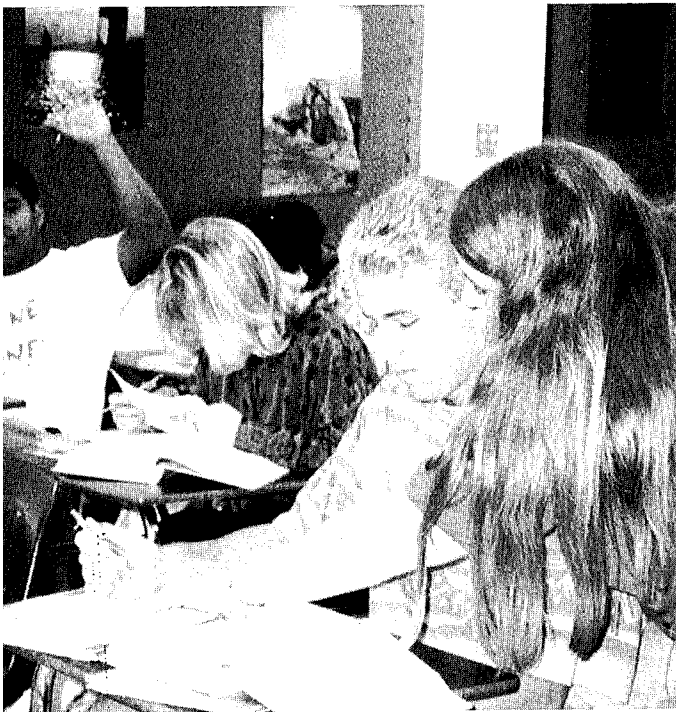
MATH HAS A BEAT OF ITS OWN

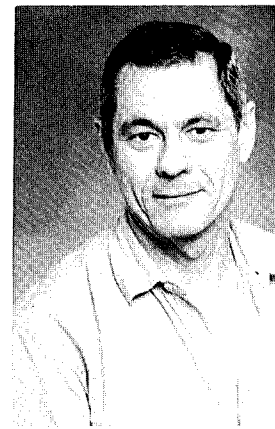

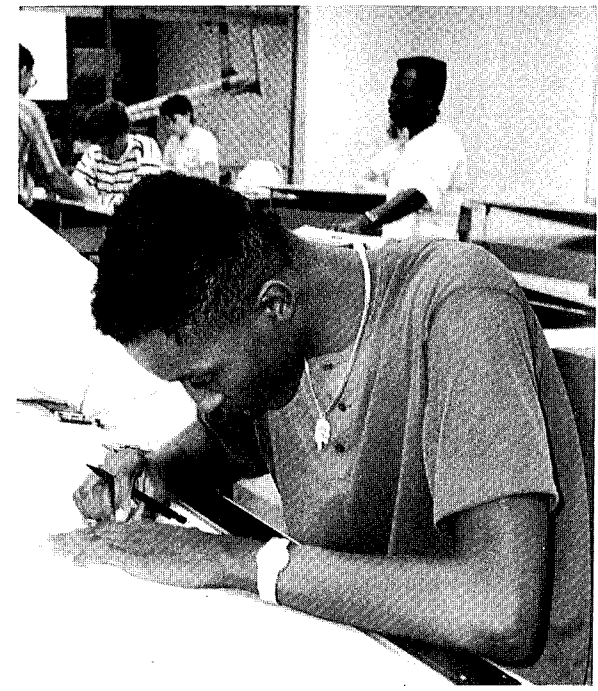
AGRICULTURE

'90-'91 was not an extraordinary or eventful year for the sophomore class, but it was a good year for the class to take a break and come back stronger for the '91-'92 school year.

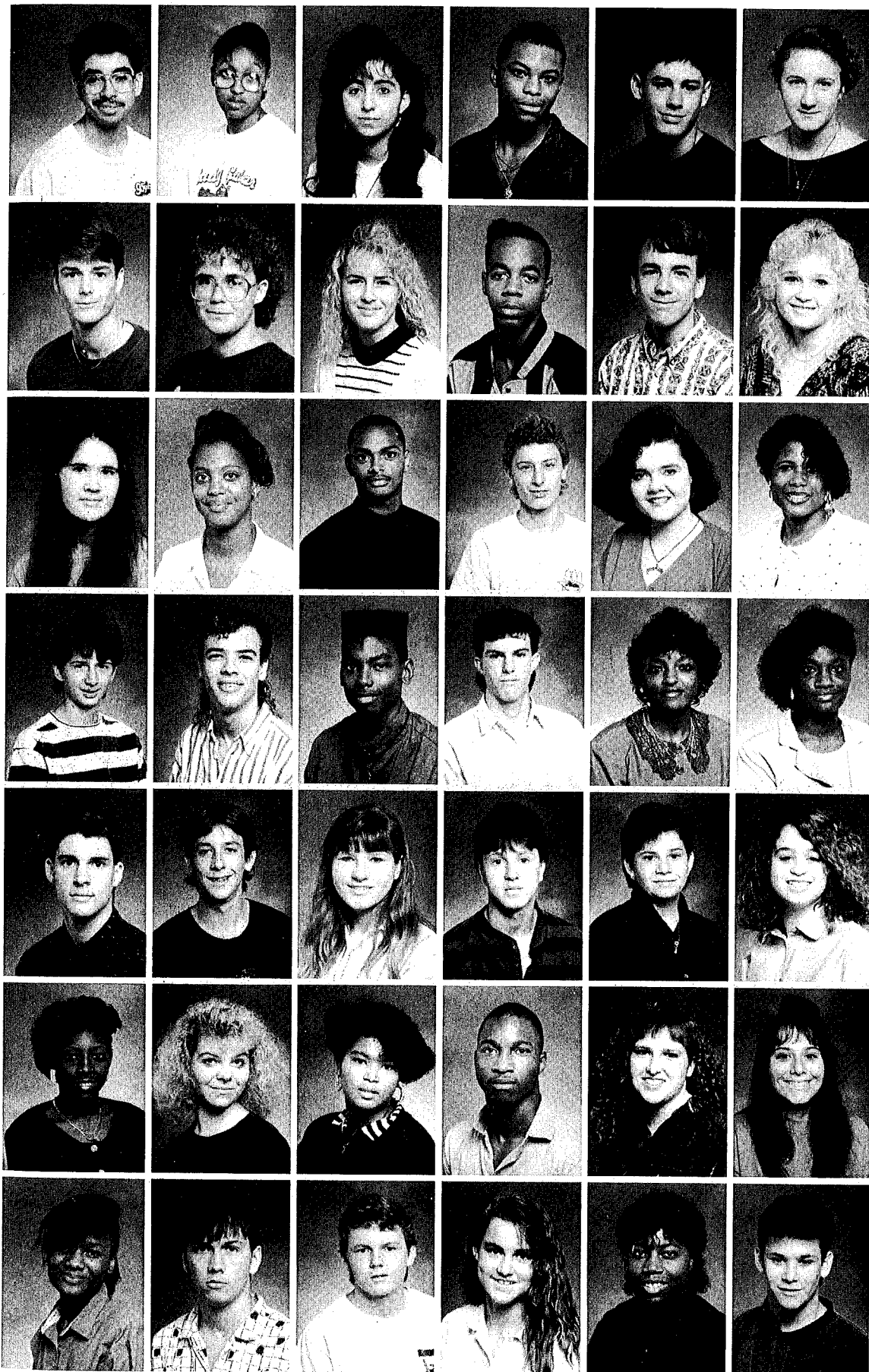

The students were separated into small groups and representatives from different businesses spent the morning with the students explaining their jobs, their business, and how the free enterprise system related to them.

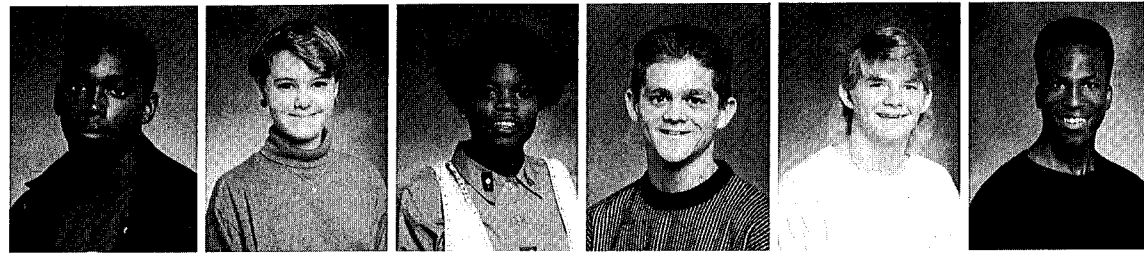
Afterwards, everyone reunited again at the Lake Wales Country Club for lunch and further discussion of the system. A panel of the areas business men and women answered questions asked by the students.

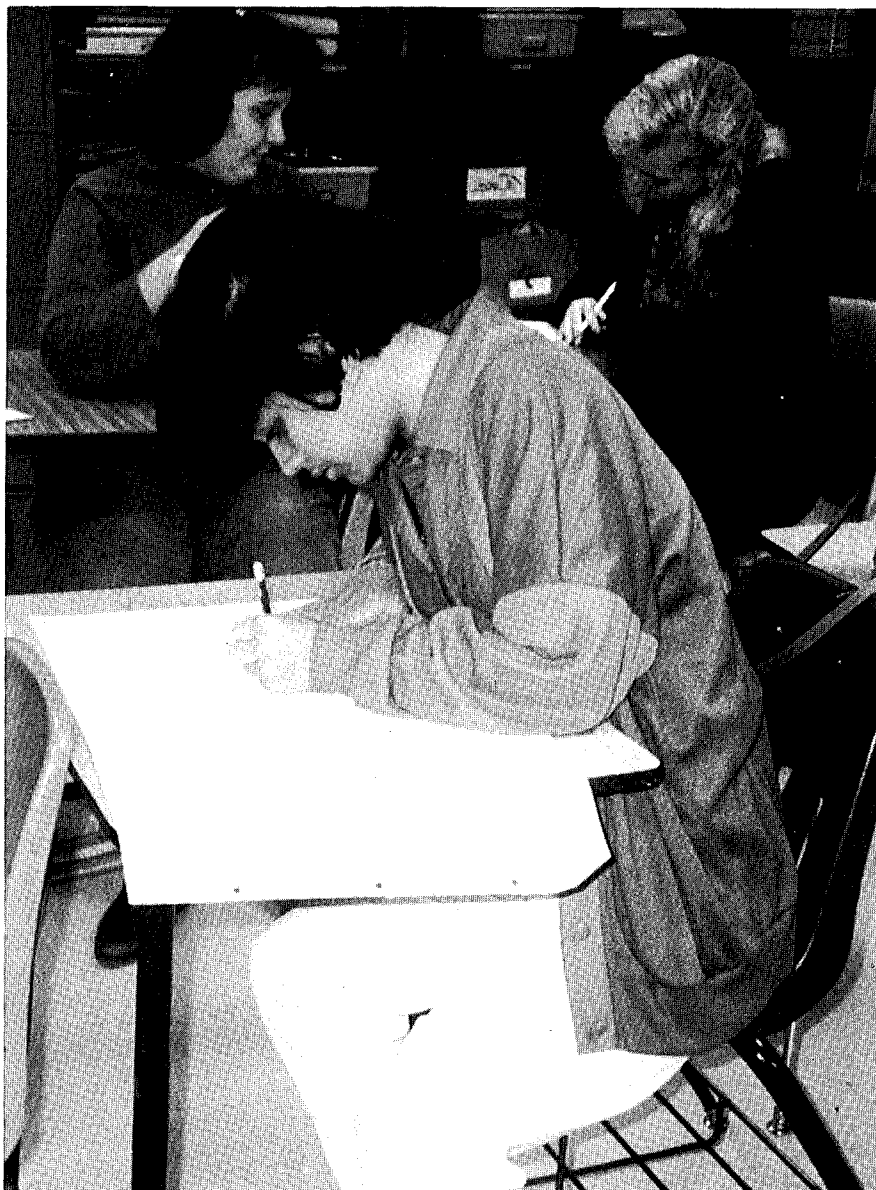

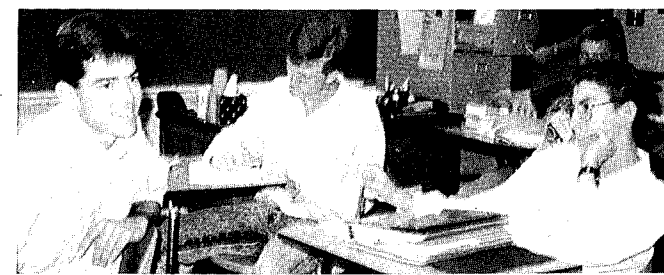
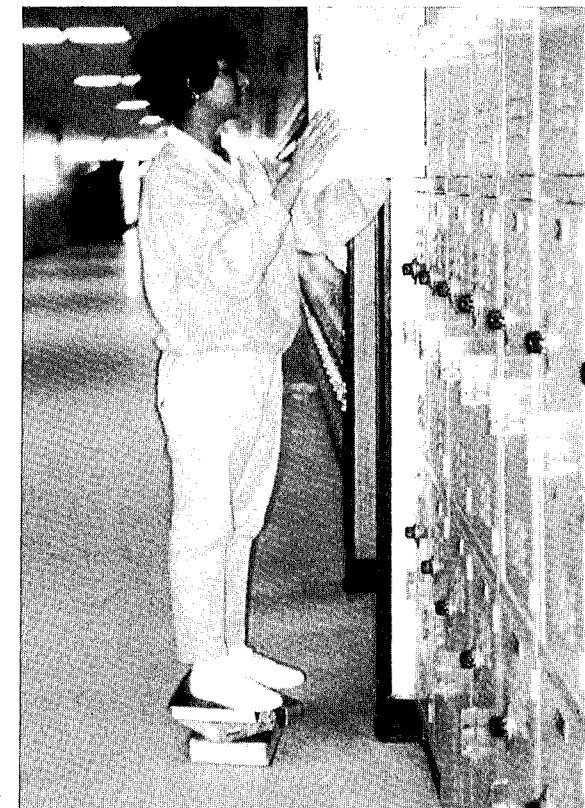
The A-Team:

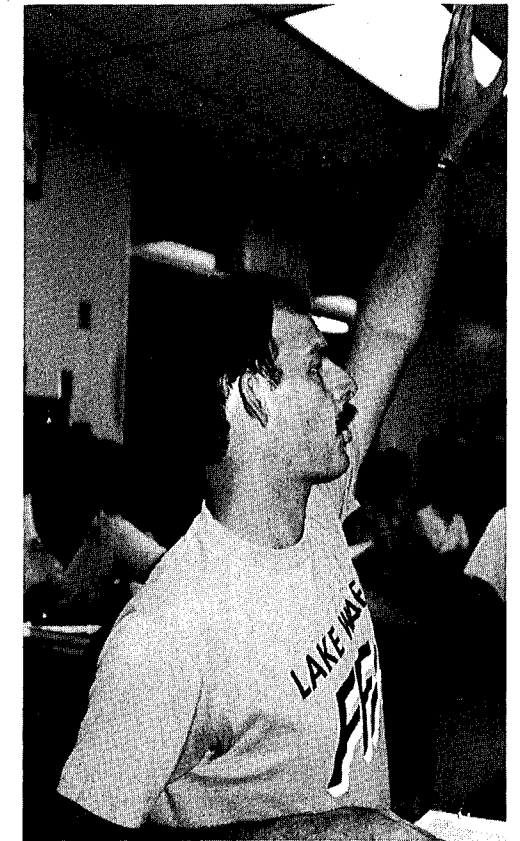

CONCERT CHOIR

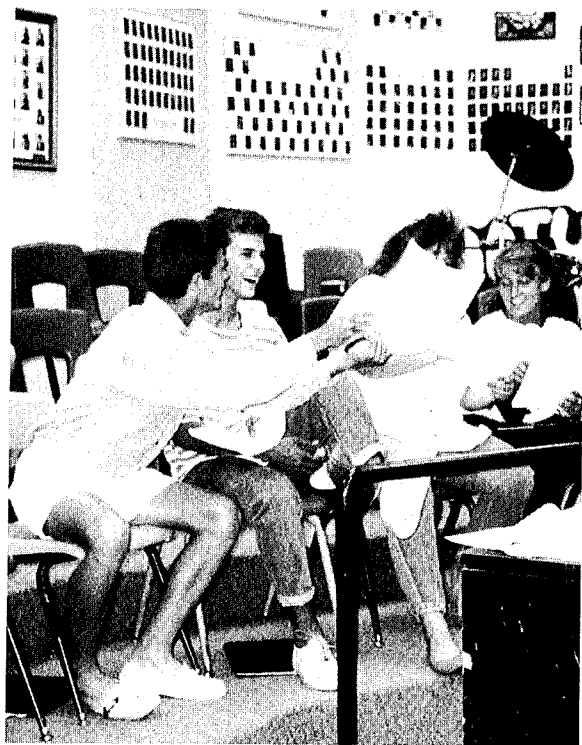

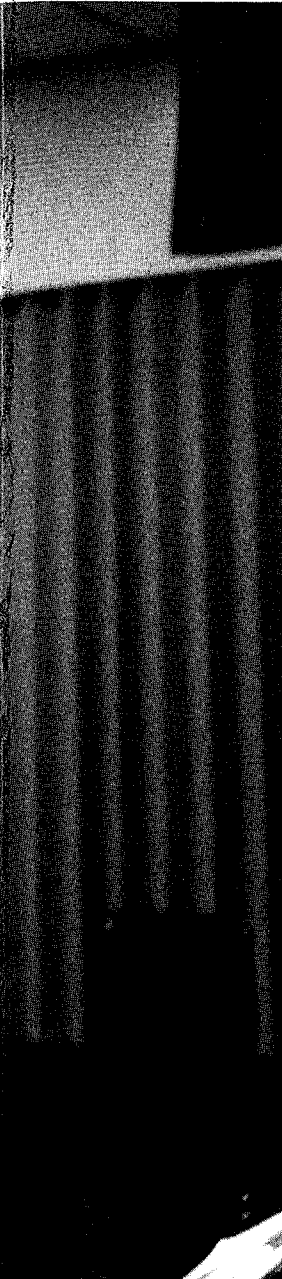
The choir hosts the district singing contest this year at our High School in March. They work all year to perform superior!
