Students will be laying the foundations for high school chemistry and physics in this class through lab investigations, discussion, writing, reading, technology, and homework assignments. You will be expected to master the science content in order to achieve each standard, so you will need to be an active participant in your education and learn everything you can! I encourage you to ask many questions and get help anytime you struggle.

Policies and Procedures: What should I know?

Classroom Procedures:

- There is no gum or eating allowed during class or lab. Students may only drink clear water while in my class. This should be in clear, plastic bottles with lids. No food or drink will be taken to the lab.
- Students MAY NOT use their cell phones or digital devices during class for any reason. If phones or devices are out during class, students will receive an office referral. These devices should be off and in child's backpacks, not on their person.
- Per Elmore County any students completing academic work dishonestly will receive a ZERO with NO opportunity to make it up.

Lab Procedures:

- You are to follow all of the regular behavior expectations and are to adhere to the safety rules in the lab safety contract.
- You will be required to have a signed safety contract on file and to wear proper safety gear during labs this can include, but is not limited to closed toe & heeled shoes, gloves, googles, and lab coats/aprons.
- There will be NO HORSEPLAY. Students will stay in their lab group. No Exceptions.

Science Notebooks:

- · Your science notebook should be used for science class ONLY.
- Each entry in your science notebook should be listed in the table of contents.
- Never tear pages out of your SNB! This will cause pages to fall out of the other side of it.
- Always write notes or assignments on the next available page. All entries should be added in chronological order. Do not skip pages.
- Always label your work with the Title.
- Notebooks will be checked and collected periodically. You will use these notebooks to help you study for tests
 and complete assignments. You must keep up with them or leave in your class basket in my classroom.
- Replacement pages are located in the make-up work basket until they run out. When they are gone, they are gone.

Projects:

- There will be quarterly projects will count for test grades. Late projects will be deducted ten points for each day they are late.
- All students in grades 5-8 are required to complete science fair projects this school year. The final project can be digital (PowerPoint or Google Slides) and will be a test grade during 2nd quarter. Projects will be due before Thanksgiving Break. Projects also have to be pre-approved before beginning. Students are allowed to work with a partner or two other people. Projects will have components due at different times from September thru November. Some of these components will count as daily grades. Students who are selected to compete in the school science fair will have to complete a backboard and, or digital poster.

Attendance and Make-Up Work:

- Please complete makeup work within THREE DAYS of your absence(s). A written excuse must be on file with the
 office for students to be able to make up work. Per the Elmore County BOE policy, unexcused absences for
 grades result in zeros in the gradebook.
- Arrange a time with me to make up missed tests or lab assignments. Sometimes, an alternate assignment will be assigned.
