These students were following classroom rules and being kind to friends! Way to go. We look forward to having more




Jefferson County Early Head Start



they thought they would create when they mixed them together. We wrote down their prediction to use during reflection. They then mixed those two colors using pipettes and clear cups.

Once they had completed their experiment they were asked to reflect on their original prediction and compare the results. They students seemed to enjoy this activity. The next few days the same items were put out for the students to experiment with on their own during their free choice time.

Health and Wellness

Starting the first day of school is a BIG adjustment for children, parents, and the whole family! There are lots of new things to learn, including new names and faces, places, and routines. Learning some of these things may come easier than for others. There are times when children or families struggle with change. As your child's first teacher, you know them better than anyone else! So, if at any time, you have any concerns for your child's behavior, adjustment, or expression of feelings, you can request assistance the program. We are here to help! What is infant and early childhood mental health consultation?

Early childhood programs use infant and early childhood mental health consultation (IEC-MHC) to help staff, families, and children. A mental health consultant is trained to help the adults in young children's lives. They make sure all children have the skills to talk about and manage their feelings, make friends, and solve problems. These are important skills for doing well in school. When they work with mental health consultants, adults are better at helping children, and children do better in school.
