

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Students are expected to attend, and ACTIVELY engage in, all Google Meets.

- Students must remain in a Google Meet for at least half of the required time to be counted "present" for the class.
- Parents and students should send all "absence notes/emails" to Mrs. Pugh (c1pugh@randolph.k12.nc.us)
- Recorded lessons are available through Canvas (a secure LMS) for students to review if/when they are absent.
- Students will be marked tardy when they enter the Google Meet after 5 minutes and/or leave the Google Meet early.
- ❖ Attendance letters are sent to families when students reach 3 unexcused absences, 6 unexcused absences, and 10 unexcused absences. If you receive a letter and are unsure about any of the dates listed as "unexcused absences"-please contact Mrs. Carter (336-318-0076).





CLASSROOM EXPECTATIONS:

Students are expected to login to their Google Meets ontime. To maximize learning and increase engagement, we recommend that your student turn his/her camera on. Students will have the ability to change their background and/or blur their backroom to protect their home environment. Students are to use the "chat" for instructional purposes only. Students engage in live instruction, synchronously, and independent instruction, asynchronously.

VIRTUAL TOOLS:

- → Google Calendar
 - ◆ Student schedules are loaded in Google Calendar
 - ◆ Students will access live instruction via Google Calendar Google Meet link
 - Students need to review their Google Calendar daily for updates, changes, and announcements
- → Canvas
 - ◆ Canvas is our Learning Management System (LMS) where students will access the curriculum and instruction
 - ◆ Parents can be added to a child's Canvas course as a "Parent Observer" (directions on the website)
 - ◆ Canvas homepage will reveal due dates, announcements, contact information, and the "Week at a Glance" as a way to help students and parents stay organized
- → Shared Drive Folder
 - Every student has a Shared Drive Folder
 - ◆ Shared Drive Student Folders store the following information:
 - Report Cards
 - Progress Reports
 - MAP-it Data Conference Notes
 - IEP Progress Reports
 - District letters
 - State and District Assessment Data Reports
 - Randolph County School System Parent/Student Handbook
- → ClassLink
 - ◆ Students will access Canvas, PowerSchool, and other digital tools through ClassLink
 - Every app and digital tool that is available to students is located, and accessed, in ClassLink

LEARNING COACH:

A Learning Coach is an opportunity for parents/guardians/trusted adults to partner with The Virtual Academy @ Randolph in his/her child's virtual education. The role of a Learning Coach is to assist students at home with the following:

- ★ Create a safe, focused learning environment (minimize distractions)
- ★ Monitor student's computer usage
- ★ Encourage student to ask questions when he/she does not understand or needs additional assistance
- ★ Assist students in communicating with teachers
- ★ Ensure student follows his/her daily Google Calendar
- ★ Ensure student is completing his/her assignments in a timely manner
- ★ Ensure Chromebook is charged and all supplies are returned to black crate and stored in designate school space at the close of the school day



COMMUNICATION:

Our goal at The Virtual Academy @ Randolph is to partner with our families to ensure everyone has a successful virtual learning experience. We use the following platforms to continuously communicate information to our students and families:

→ School Messenger

- ◆ Every Sunday evening staff, students, and parents/guardians receive a telephone message from the school with the weekly announcements and important reminders for the week. An email of the telephone message is also sent to the emails we have available in PowerSchool.
- ◆ All Sunday School Messenger messages are uploaded on our school website

→ Class Dojo

- ◆ Teachers will upload directions to join their Class Dojo as well as the VA@R's Class Dojo
- ◆ Class Dojo is also a tool that our teachers will use this year to communicate positive behavior as well as behavior that needs improvement

- ◆ Our school website is a wealth of information

ONLINE BEST PRACTICES:

The Randolph County School System Parent/Student Handbook and Code of Conduct clearly outline two important policies to ensure a safe and secure virtual learning environment:

- Technology Responsible Use Policy (3225, 4312, and 7320)-see page 77 in the RCSS Parent/Student Handbook
- Internet Safety Policy (3226 and 4205)-see page 81 in the RCSS Parent Student Handbook

Additional ways to ensure a safe and secure virtual learning environment:

- Minimize distractions while your child is on a Google Meet
 - > Personal conversations
 - ➤ Music, TV, and/or YouTube
- ❖ Monitor what your child is doing while using his/her Chromebook
- Use a background or blur the background during Google Meets

Google Meets are the students' virtual classroom; therefore, parents/guardians need to refrain from interacting in the Google Meet





District Assessments all students are required to take:

- → mClass (K-5)-administered virtually
- → HMH (K-5)-administered virtually
- → Writing Assessment (K-5)-administered virtually
- → Summative Math Assessments (K-2)-administered virtually
- → CogAT (screening for AIG 3rd and 5th grade)-administered IN PERSON at VA@R
- → iReady (6-8)-administered virtually
- → ACCESS (select students K-8)-administered IN PERSON at VA@R

State Assessments all students are required to take:

- → Read to Achieve (select 4th graders in the Fall and select 3rd graders in the Spring)-administered IN PERSON at VA@R
- → BOG (Beginning of Grade) (3rd grade)-administered IN PERSON at VA@R
- → NC Check-ins (3rd-8th grade)-administered virtually or in-person
- → EOG (End of Grade)(3rd-8th grade)-administered IN PERSON at VA@R

North Carolina is not an "opt-out" state. As stated in 16 N.C. Admin. Code 06G .0315 (a), "All students enrolled in a public school unit (PSU) in grades 3 through 8 or in high school courses in which an end-of-course (EOC) assessment is administered shall participate in the State Annual Testing Program."

Please know that The Virtual Academy @ Randolph is trying to be responsive to parents' concerns, yet we must adhere to state and federal guidelines that address the educational needs of all children.
