On April 10, 2024, Houston Healthcare's Emergency Medical Services (EMS) visited Houston College and Career Academy's Emergency Medical Responder and Athletic Training students to promote their new program which allows high school graduates who are 18 years of age to work with the EMS Department.

EMS Director of Houston Healthcare (HHC), David Borghelli, spoke with students about EMS careers at HHC and described how the new career offering works. He, along with Keith Williams, HHC EMS, took students on a tour of an ambulance and described how it is practically an emergency room on wheels. For many students this was their first time being in an ambulance and they were amazed by the massive amount of healthcare equipment that was there and that new ambulances could cost around \$250,000.

While some students were touring the ambulance, HHC's Lead Recruiter, Kasey Osborn, led students in a beachball activity to get them talking about their future careers.

Cara Seibert, HHC Talent Acquisition and Growth Manager, arranged this event with Houston County School District's Youth Apprenticeship Coordinator, Sandi Couillard, who also hosted the event.

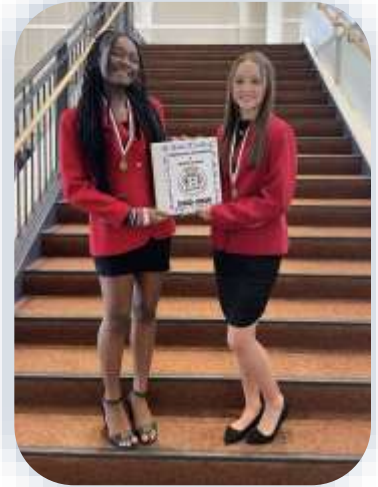
