# What is Dual Enrollment?

- Dual Enrollment gives you college credit while you are still in high school. Most classes give you 1 credit instead of ½ credit.
- This can be a good or bad thing.
- If you earn an A or B – that’s great!
- If you earn a C or D- you earn high school credit but the grade will not transfer to a college upon graduation and may not be high enough for a particular degree field.
- If you earn an F – You have a failing grade FOREVER on your high school and college transcript. The grade will not go away even if you retake the course!

- Earning a D or F (below a 70) in a class can affect your Satisfactory Academic Performance (SAP) which affects your ability to get financial aid for DE and after graduation. You can become ineligible for funding, be suspended from the college, or put on probation. This affects you after you graduate!

# What do I need to do by May 9?

- Choose the college you want to attend and apply.
  - Middle Georgia State University (apply online at [mga.edu](http://mga.edu) – search dual enrollment and apply now) 3.0 GPA
  - Central Georgia Tech – You should have already applied for fall semester in your world history class. If you are taking DE US History, you have already applied and been accepted. If you haven't applied, go to [centralgatech.edu](http://centralgatech.edu), click on apply now for dual enrollment. 2.0 GPA
  - Georgia Military College – Go to [gmc.edu](http://gmc.edu), search for dual enrollment and apply online. 2.3 GPA

# How to register for DE off-campus classes:

## MGSU

- Check your email for an email from MGSU. It will include how to set up your MGSU account and how to contact your advisor.

# GMC

# CGTC

- Registration will open on March 17. You will receive an email with a link for you to register.
- If you are planning to attend summer semester and are not currently in a DE class you need to fill out a paper application TODAY. The application you filled out online is for FALL/SPRING semester and will not cover summer.



# Gafutures.org

You must fill out a gafutures.org dual enrollment funding application before you are officially registered for your classes. CGTC came to your history classes a few weeks ago to help you fill out the application. Make sure you add the correct college to your form.

1. Go to [gafutures.org](http://gafutures.org)
2. Create an account if you don't have one.
3. Click on dual enrollment funding application in the box to the right.
4. Submit the application.
5. Make sure your parent completes the Parent Participation Agreement that you will send to them when you fill out your application.

# How do I know what classes to take?

- If you are in an AP class, you do not want to take that class at the college if you score high enough on the AP Exam.
- Finish your high school graduation requirements.
  - Juniors – American literature, US History
  - Seniors – Economics, English 1101, college algebra
  - You cannot take College Algebra without finishing Algebra 2
- Look at what the college you want to go to when you graduate requires and chose a class that you need for your undergraduate degree.

# Will classes transfer?

- It is your responsibility to check and make sure your classes transfer.
- Most colleges have a transfer course equivalency page on their website or you can use [gatransfer.org](http://gatransfer.org).

- You can drop one DE class without penalty as long as you drop by the date the college requires. You will receive a “Z” on your transcript to show you dropped the course. If you drop a second class, you are ineligible for DE funding.
- DE will not pay for the class twice. Example: You drop (or fail) English 1101 you will have to repay to take the course.
- DE pays for 30 semester hours or 45 quarter hours. This includes DE classes at HCCA. Any additional hours are self pay.

# DE TRUTHS

- Yes, you can fail. We've had grades ranging from a 7 to a 100.
- Online classes – you have to login and turn in work by the time and date the work is due. They don't take late work!
- There are no do overs or test retakes or extra credit or final exemptions.
- The college will not talk to your parents.
- You are responsible for checking your own grades, the high school does not have access to these.
- PHS cannot help if you are struggling in your classes. We cannot call the college or provide tutoring.

- We have students who did not graduate due to failing a DE course.
- Do not take DE because your parents want you to, take the courses because you want to.
- DE does not give TOTs and has a different attendance policy.
- Do not let your mom/dad/grandma/girlfriend apply for you. Do the work yourself to register and apply.
- You must be self motivated to do well in an online class.
- PHS counselors cannot tell you what you need for your major, we do not work at the college. We can tell you what you need to graduate high school.

- If you know that you are too busy to do the work, don't take the class.
- Passing 5 out of 7 classes is required per semester to be eligible for GHSA activities. (If you take 2 DE classes and fail them both, you will not be eligible for sports or other GHSA events!)



# Summer Classes

- Summer classes are 8 weeks instead of 16 weeks and are very fast paced
- Colleges do not recommend you take more than one class over the summer
- If you go in person, class times may conflict with football/band/cheer practices.
- If you go on vacation, you still have to complete your classwork.

## Before you leave:

1. Fill out the interest form and turn it in before you leave the theater!
2. Take the DE checklist with you. This must be returned by May 9 along with your course schedule!
