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
Evaline Events and Traditions! We've had a busy Fall

Mrs. Tinnin and Mrs. Mittge took students from their TK-K and 1-2 classrooms to visit the **Cowlitz Fish Hatchery and** learn all about salmon.

In January, Mrs. Mittge's 1-2 classroom orders salmon

eggs from the hatchery. They study them as they raise them in a large fish tank in their classroom and then finally release them into the Olegua creek when the salmon are ready to start their journey!







Mrs. Mars takes her 3-4 classroom and HiCap students to the Olegua Creek to do stream testing twice each school year. Then in the spring they all travel to the Evergreen State College in Olympia and join hundreds of other students, who have also done stream testing in their regions, at the Student Green Congress.

During the Congress students present and discuss their findings. They identify data which exceed optimal water quality standards, discuss possible causes of pollution or poor conditions, and make recommendations for improving the health of the watershed and Puget Sound.

Our 1st - 6th grade students participated in a week of swimming lessons at Thorbeckes during the first week of October. This event has been provided by our awesome Booster Club for many years!





The Winlock Fire Department visited Evaline school and brought over their smoke house. They showed our

students how to be safe

and get out of a house safely in case of a fire. They reminded students it's also important to have a plan on where to meet



your family once you get out of the house. Thank you Winlock Fire Department!!

On May 18th, 2024 former and current students and staff gathered at Evaline School to share about their school experiences while having the opportunity to take a closer look at many curated displays representing the ebb and flow of the life of the school over the years. These displays included photographs, videos, news articles, and other historical documents. During the program our school's Community Liaison, Susie Duren shared a summary of the overall history of the school, and later in the program Mrs. Reep, one of our long-time teachers, likewise shared a detailed review of her years teaching at Evaline.

State Grants Support Evaline Students

Our covered play area was dedicated on the first day of school this year! This wonderful structure was made possible by two "Healthy Kids" grants that our school district applied for and received from OSPI.

We received \$200,000 to build a covering which was completed in the spring of 2023, and an additional \$200,000 for our playground equipment and basketball court. These grants are at no cost to local taxpayers.

We are thankful for this new facility. Most importantly, our students are getting to play outside more often and on a modern, fun play structure!



Replacement Levy for Educational Programs and Operations

On October 15th the Evaline School Board approved a levy amount of \$269,000 at a rate of \$0.92/\$1,000 to replace the expiring 2 year levy that was approved in 2023. The replacement levy will be on the February 11, 2025 ballot.

This levy is an essential part of the school's budget. It maintains small class sizes, supports student academic growth and helps us instill the strong character in Evaline Students that our community values.
