Over 17,000 people gathered at the Orange County Convention Center in Orlando, Florida to compete in over 100 business-related competitive events. Competitors from the fifty states, China, Puerto Rico, and the Virgin Islands were represented. In addition to the fierce competitions, students also had the opportunity to meet and network with representatives from more than 100 colleges, universities, and employers. Informative workshops presented by business professionals taught students the tools to being successful in the business world.

This year, the FBLA chapter at Houston County High School had the honor of sending seven students to represent Georgia on the national level. These students are Jonathan Menaker, Ruxanda Malcoci, Deborah Jacklin, Tony Le, Michael Do, John Warren, and Hailey Oneal. Notably, Michael Do serves as the incoming Georgia State Parliamentarian, Hailey Oneal as the former Georgia State Reporter, and Deborah Jacklin represented Houston County High School as the National President. Jenny Jackson was also recognized on stage at the opening session and received an Outstanding Adviser Award for her recognition as the Georgia Adviser of the Year.

The Houston County High School competitors were able to achieve incredible results at NLC this year. Deborah Jacklin placed 3rd in the nation in Future Business Leader, Jonathan Menaker earned 8th place in Introduction to Financial Math, Ruxanda Malcoci won 4th place in Business Management, and the Parliamentary Procedure team of Tony Le, Michael Do, John Warren, and Hailey Oneal placed 4th. This remarkable success is a testament to the hard work and dedication that these students invested into their FBLA journey. 


