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TK and Kindergarten

This week kindergarten is finishing up the third unit in reading. They should know the sound of the letters a, m, c, d, g, i, o, and t. Students are learning how to sound out three letter words using the sounds they learned. We continue to work on identifying the beginning, middle, and end sounds of short words. Kindergarten is learning about the five senses by learning about parts of the eye, how we smell, and how we hear.



Kindergarten finished learning about the numbers 6 through 9 in math. Next, they will work with the number 10. .

TK is finishing up the All About Me unit. They learned about the five senses, different body parts, and different shades of skin. They use movement, songs, and hands on activities during their lessons. Next, they are going to learn about families. TK is working with the numbers 1 through 5 and how to recognize the letters in their own name.

I am looking forward to meeting with families next week. It's amazing to see all the growth that has happened in the first couple of months!

First and Second Grade Explorers

This was a very busy week for our class. 3rd graders started their math unit on understanding multiplication through the use of manipulatives and drawing pictures. They are so excited to finally be doing this! The 4th graders finished up on multidigit multiplication and have now started to work towards what it looks like to divide larger numbers and what a remainder looks like. We will continue to instill our multiplication skills through the use of games and review throughout the year.

Our class also participated in two field trips this Wednesday. We went to Winolequa park for our fall water testing. Testing things such as nitrate and dissolved oxygen levels as they relate to Salmon. In addition they joined the rest of the school for our annual trip to the pumpkin patch!

This week 5th grade finished up their math chapter in division. They learned many different ways to do division and are getting really good at it! 6th grade started a new chapter in math this week on integers and understanding negative numbers. They are getting close to plotting on coordinate planes and solving linear equations.

In ELA we will be finishing up our unit on Native Americans and will be soon doing a favorite unit of mine on Shakespeare and his Midsummer Night's Dream. They will also be practicing the Winter Play during ELA so please have your students practice their lines at home so they can memorize them and do great on stage!
