The Franklin County Career and Technical Center offers the following programs to students in the Franklin County School District in grades 9- 12:

- **Agriculture & Natural Resources** (2 years, 4 credits) – Introduces students to agriculture, animal and plant production, and natural resource management.
- **Construction/Carpentry** (2 years, 4 credits) – Provides foundational skills for careers and further education in the construction industry.
- **Cyber Foundations I** (1 year, 1 credit) – Develops technology, critical-thinking, and problem-solving skills through an introduction to computing.
- **Cyber Foundations II** (1 year, 1 credit) – Builds computer science, digital literacy, programming, and cybersecurity skills.
- **Educator Preparation** (2 years, 4 credits) – Prepares students for education careers through coursework and hands-on experiences in elementary schools.
- **Family & Consumer Science (Health, Nutrition & Wellness)** (½ year, 0.5 credit) – Focuses on life skills, leadership, wellness, and decision-making.
- **Health Science** (2 years, 4 credits) – Introduces students to healthcare careers, medical terminology, body systems, and patient care skills.
- **Robotics & Engineering** (2 years, 4 credits) – Explores engineering design, robotics, physics, and related career pathways.
- **Welding** (2 years, 4 credits) – Prepares students for employment or further training in the welding industry.
