Greetings! After two months of early head start, I am happy to say that our children seem to be comfortable with entering their classroom. We've had one or two criers; however, the children settle a little easier and sooner than before. Our Cozy Corner may become more of a Cozy Cave as we have children who seem to prefer closed-in spaces, this will be our safe place where children can settle down when their emotions take over. We have begun using the I Love You Rituals to engage with children on a one-on-one basis. The Teddy Bear Activity Board allows the child to choose what activity they want to help create a relationship with us. We will share these activities with our families during the parent-teacher conferences.

This month we will celebrate two of our kiddos turning 3! Happy Birthday JB and PH! They will take along with them their portfolio of the first 3 months of school; and, fun memories of their last days of EHS.

October is a fun month to have: the season is a little cooler, there's an energy of change & wonder, and, lastly, imagination & play is all around. As we look forward to singing new songs, saying different rhymes, and playing new games, we will begin a study about clothes. The children will engage in matching games, design socks, and learn about sizes. The dramatic play area can have different child-size clothes that are similar to the community helpers we see in Laguna.

Our Cultural Lifeway will introduce the time of harvest. Our children will learn the process of harvesting and possibly taste test some produce like pumpkin and squash. As they learn about harvesting, we will begin our Greenhouse Planting activities. We'd like to show our children how to cultivate vegetables and fruit, from seeds to plant-it will help children see how patience is needed to grow and nurture plants.

Health / Nutrition Activities: We tried some guacamole dip, some liked it and some gave it a little taste and didn't want to finish. And Teacher forgot the tortilla chips, haha.

Achievements / Goals: Kuddos to S.A. for using those gross motor skills and wanting to walk everywhere, she is now moving freely around the classroom. Continue to encourage your children to use their walking feet/legs, it helps them daily.

Parent Recognition / Well Wishes: Thank You again parents for your time in completing the at home activities, we appreciate what you do for your child.

Creative Curriculum: In this month our study will focus on "Clothes". Of course, we will get to observe the many textures, the many colors, and the different sizes of clothes. We will discuss when we should wear a certain type of clothing, especially with our weather changing into the cooler/colder weather. Please also make sure to check your child's cubbies, to see if they have extra clothes on hand, and to make sure they have a jacket. It is that time of year that we never know what our weather is going to be like.

Cultural Lifeways: Children will learn the process of "Harvest time"; looking at pictures of gardens where the vegetables grow; being able to have hands on with the vegetables such as corn, squash, melons, carrots, pumpkin, and chili. This month our color is Orange.

STEAM: "The colors in Nature". When the weather changes to the much colder weather, we start to see the leaves on the trees change color, the weeds on the ground turn from green to brown; we will also observe through pictures the different colors that are out there in our natural world.

Conscious Discipline: Power of Attention: What you focus on, you get more of. What is it that we truly value, that we would want our children to focus on; walking more independently, increasing our vocabulary, using our hands and fingers to build our fine motor skills.

Health / Nutrition Activities: For our activity we will be making Pretzel and cheese broomsticks. **Parent Tips:** Establish routines-consistent daily routines help toddlers feel secure and understand expectations; include meal times sitting at the table, 8 to 10 hours of sleeping (on weekends or school days off, make sure they are taking naps); allow play time instead of screen time.

- Encourage communication- foster language development by talking (refrain from using baby talk), reading books, and singing songs with your toddler, encourage them to use words, repeat words for them.
- Promote independence-encourage self-help skills, such as washing hands, throwing away their trash, picking up and putting away their toys.
- Set clear boundaries- use simple clear rules and explain to them the reason behind the rules; be consistent with discipline to help toddlers to understand consequences.

Parent Engagement: look out for flyers sent in your child's folder for upcoming events or at home activities for you all to do, as always don't forget to send the in-kind sheets back. Thank You!! Again, please keep your child home if they are having illness symptoms, this helps to keep it from spreading to others (friends and staff). This group of children are at the age where everything and anything goes straight to the mouth, including boogers ©. Thank you and we appreciate the help. 

I thank you parents for your quick response to get your children picked up when we had to send children home early and close school due to the health epidemic. Our custodians were able to give our campus a thorough cleaning and sanitization to keep your children free of the virus. Please help us reinforce the importance of handwashing by talking to your child and encouraging them to practice this simple task at home.

TIPS

Supporting Children's Speech and Language

Helping young babies and toddlers develop language skills can be joyful and surprisingly simple. Here is an engaging, & developmentally appropriate activity families can do at home to boost those communication skills:

TALK, TALK, TALK

- Narrate daily routines. Describe what you're doing ("Now we're washing your hands") to build on words your child can learn.
- Name objects: Point to and name toys, foods, body parts and household items.
- Use real words: Avoid baby talk-use clear, simple language to model correct speech

Helping your children ages 3-5 yrs. old doesn't have to be an overwhelming task. Here is one effective activity families can do at home to support your child's speech development:

• Play Interactive games. Games like "Simon Says" or Charades, or Board Games that require conversation can be both fun and educational. They promote listening skills and expressive language.

Why it works: * These games require children to follow directions and express themselves clearly, encouraging communication in a playful setting.

TIP: Maintain the game to your child's interest so they stay engaged and excited about participating.
