C. TICKET SELLERS & TAKERS INFORMATION-

The following passes and procedures should be followed to allow free admission for;

1. Staff members {no other family members} that carry a permit issued by the office.
2. Board members {no other family members}.
3. Police officers in uniform, working press members, and local physicians.
4. Persons carrying a membership card in one of the following organizations:
 - a. MN Association of School Administrators.
 - b. MN State High School Coaches Association.
 - c. MN Principals Association.
 - d. MN Music Educators Association.
5. Participating teams, their coaches, cheerleaders in uniform, bus drivers and team managers.
6. Coaches' spouses at the events that spouse coaches.
7. Band members shall be admitted free to any activity in which they are participating.
8. Elementary students participating in half time demonstrations or other events where admission charges are made may be given admission passes for the event at the discretion of the administration. Parents must pay to attend the event.
9. Fee rates will be set each year.

XX. BILL COLLECTION

Students, parents and staff should be held accountable for paying bills owed to the school district for fees, damage to books, loss and/or destruction of property, unpaid lunch tickets, etc.

The collection procedure shall be as follows:

- A. Principal verbally informs the student of the amount and reason for the charge. If not paid within 30 days, principal informs the parent, in writing, of the amount and reason for the charge.
- B. If not paid within 30 days, Superintendent contacts the parent, by phone or in person, to discuss the bill and encourage payment.

If still not paid within 30 days, the bill may be forwarded to the Credit Bureau for collection.
