## Serving With Compassion: The Heart Behind The DuBore Funeral Home

Growing up in the quiet corners of Warren where everyone knew his name and his father's legacy, Mike DuBore, WHS Class of 1984, always felt a quiet pull toward the family business. While his peers steered clear of its somber halls, Mike was never uneasy around the Quanrud Funeral Home. He found a peaceful element in the calm demeanor his father possessed while helping families through their most difficult days. Now, years later, he's stepped into that same role—not just to carry on the business, but to honor a tradition of compassion, dignity, and service that's been a cornerstone of his family for generations.

Mike recalled the stories of when his Great Uncle Rudy Quanrud first served the Warren area as the local barber. At the time, there were two mortuaries in Warren and Rudy was serving the community as a barber. When both those businesses closed their doors, Rudy decided to enter mortuary school in Minneapolis to fill the community need. In 1937, he opened the doors to the newly established Quanrud Funeral Home. Mike's grandmother, Inez DuBore and Rudy's wife, Jennie Quanrud were sisters, a connection not every local knows.

So, how did the DuBore family find their way into the art of funeral directing? Pour yourself a cup of something comforting and settle in as we trace the successful career path of Mike DuBore, whose compassionate heart continued the ongoing legacy in Warren as a respected mortician and funeral

director for are communities.

Mike's father, Chuck, grew up the son of a judge in Roseau, Minnesota. Upon entering St. John's University before transferring to the University of Minnesota, he fully anticipated a career as an accountant: soon realizing his calling was in another direction; mortuary science. While in college, Chuck worked at a funeral home in St. Paul, gaining knowledge and experience. With the completion of his degree, Chuck went to work with his Uncle Rudy at the Quanrud Funeral Home in Warren in 1958.

Chuck and his wife of nearly 60 years, Delores, raised their three children in Warren, living first above the funeral home itself for nearly a decade. Monique DuBore Colette, mother of Jocelyne and Mollie, - fills her days as a Speech Language Pathologist in Eau Claire, Wisconsin. Mike DuBore is married to Betty (Bjorgaard) DuBore and the couple have two adult children, Madeleine and Cameron. Patrick DuBore is currently working in sales & marketing in Shakopee, Minnesota. He and his wife Jennifer have three children: Carter, Sydney and Max.

During his years at Warren High School, Mike balanced his busy schedule of sports and family responsibilities. He was active in football, basketball, track, band, choir, and student council. History class with Bob Mattson was his favorite high school class, but he recalls having so many great teachers at WHS. He highlights working alongside Phil Beving at the Peppermill, a local hangout, learning many valuable lessons. Not only his employer, Phil was also his football coach. He comments that his children learned their mathematical skills from Betty's and his own teacher, Rick Schmiedeberg. He shares one of his favorite memories at WHS was when we played the Argyle Eagles in ANYthing! The rich rivalry made for excitement and athletic challenges and the fan support was always vibrant. Going to state in basketball in 1984, under coaching legend, Gary Schuler, is a favorite discussion among all classmates. Everyone has memories about those years at state tournaments. Lastly, the musicals, led by Mark Maruska, were another highlight of his time at WHS.

As a high school student, Mike also pitched in at the family funeral home by washing cars, mowing the lawn, and vacuuming floors. Eager to help wherever he could, Mike began assisting with funerals by the time he was just 16. He vividly recalls his father's round-the-clock dedication, always on call and ready to respond to a family's need at a moment's notice. Mike has maintained that level of diligence throughout his own career. He understood from a young age that being in the mortuary business was a "family" commitment. He credits his wife and children for being understanding when his schedule was not compatible with family plans. Holidays and weekends were times when Mike was always on duty.

After attending college at UND, then University of Minnesota, Mike returned to Warren in 1988 completing his mortuary science internship at the family funeral home, stepping fully into his role alongside his father as a licensed mortician. Arriving at the U of M, Mike was greeted by two fellow classmates, also pursuing degrees in mortuary science: Jay VanSickle and Mark Leverington, both of whom have had successful careers as morticians as well.

Mike and Betty started dating in 1984, heading to Shakey's Pizza in Grand Forks and taking in the "Karate Kid" movie. In 1990, Mike and Betty (Bjorgaard), (WHS Class of 1986), married and together the two cultivated a life centered on family, faith, community, and lasting values. Raising two children—Madeleine (AJ) Hensel of Langdon, ND, works as an account manager and Cameron (Erin), a remote financial analyst, who will soon be making their home in Warren this coming June. The DuBore's appreciate Warren, where the values run deep, neighbors look out for one another and every child is everyone's child.

Betty, now retired, dedicated more than 20 years to shaping young minds as an elementary teacher at WAO. She will occasionally sub within the school, but fully enjoys her retirement. Mike and Betty instilled the same strong work ethic in their children, who, like their father, began helping with the family business; both Madeleine and Cameron started

In 2024, through her hard work and dedication to her job, she was selected to receive the Minnesota Association of Secondary Schools Principals Office Professional of the Year Award. Minnesota has 459 high schools and 236 middle schools. Through the lengthy process of all those schools nominations, Kelsey was one of eight finalists nominated for the award. Her second year at FGCU, she helped the team to a 34-0 record before falling in the Division II National championship which was played on ESPN. Jen hit a 3-pointer early in the game before having to go to the bench with stress fracture injuries. Here's a bit of irony for you, Jen's dream as a little girl was always to play for the University of North Dakota women's basketball team. She went to numer-

ous UND games while growing up. In the National Division II Womens Tournament semi-final game, her FGCU team defeated none other than UND to eliminate them from the National Tournament and send her team to the National Championship game. After graduating, she spent a year each assistant coaching at a couple of smaller colleges before becoming a top assistant coach and spending eight years at the University of Indianapolis. From there it's been seven very good years as Head Coach at Wisconsin-Parkside.
