## WARRIORS AT FLORENCE

FLORENCE HIGH SCHOOL, 6:30 P.M. OCT. 10, 2024

After an 0-6 start to the season, there may be plenty of pessimism surrounding the Ingram Tom Moore High School football program, but heading into this week's matchup against Florence on Thursday, the Warriors are optimistic.

The reasons are simple: subtle improvements and gains through the first six weeks, including playing a tougher-than-expected schedule. The Warriors faced teams with a 24-9 record to start the season, including two unbeaten teams. Crystal City, which was 2-9 last year, is off to a 5-0 start, while Randolph is 6-0.

The Warriors face teams with a 10-14 schedule to finish the 2024 season, and they need at least three games to snap the program's six-year drought of missing the UIL playoffs.

Some of the other factors favoring the Warriors this week include:

Quarterback Logan Spalding is finding his rhythm. The junior quarterback is 27-of-41 passing with 274 yards and four TDs during the last two games. While Spalding has thrown two interceptions, the Warriors are finding incremental success throwing the football.

With Spalding improving at quarterback, that's freed up senior Kye Hightower to shift to running back — although, he still sees snaps at QB — and his production is up over the last two games, rushing for 288 yards on 48 carries.

The Warriors are finally converting on third down after a dismal start. In the last two games, Ingram was 9-of-23 on third down, effectively extending drives. In the first four games, the Warriors were 6-of-43 on third down.

By converting third and fourth downs, the Warriors are racking up first downs, with 29 in the last two games as opposed to 37 in the first four.
