1st Grade

First grade will be working on subtraction and shapes the next few weeks. We will be working on vowel team sounds and discussing past and present tense verbs. We will be engaging in various holiday activities.

2nd Grade

Second grade is so excited for December! In reading, we will begin a new unit. In this unit, students will continue to learn new spellings and apply those spellings through their reader, "The Job Hunt." They will also continue to practice grammar, spelling, and writing. Be sure to practice spelling words with your student weekly.

In math, we will begin measuring, comparing, and estimating length. This would be so fun to practice at home if you have a tape measure, ruler, or meter stick! As always, your child can practice math skills at home through IXL. Reach out to your child's teacher for login instructions. We are currently reading lots of books about how plants grow. Ask your child about the life cycle of plants!

It is so important that your child reads for at least 20 minutes every day, especially over winter break. Encourage them to find something they enjoy and set a timer. They will get used to it, and will begin to enjoy reading more and more. Thank you for your support!

3rd Grade

Dear Parents,

We have some exciting and important work happening in class over the next few weeks! **Reading and Social Studies**

In **social studies**, we will focus on memorizing key facts and information that are important for our understanding of the subject. This practice will help solidify what we've been learning and strengthen students' recall skills.

In **reading**, we will review essential skills that have been taught so far, including identifying the main idea, analyzing characters and how their actions influence story events, understanding text features, and other critical reading strategies.

As **benchmark testing begins on December 10th**, we will also dedicate time to discussing and practicing test-taking strategies. Our aim is to help students feel confident and well-prepared for their assessments.

Math and Science

In science, we will be learn

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climate. Weather refers to

This distinction will help students understand how scientists study and predict changes in our environment.

In **math**, we are diving into **fractions**! Students will learn how to identify, compare, and work with fractions in different contexts. You can support their learning at home by incorporating fractions into everyday activities, such as:

- Cooking or baking: Have your child help measure ingredients like 1/2 cup of sugar or 3/4 cup of flour
- **Sharing food:** Divide a pizza or a cake into equal parts and discuss fractions (e.g., "You ate 1/4 of the pizza!").
- **Shopping:** Discuss discounts or portions, such as "This sale is 1/3 off" or "We'll save 1/2 for later."

These real-life applications help reinforce fraction concepts in a fun and meaningful way!

4th Grade

In reading we are working on first and secondhand accounts and then summarizing. In writing we are continuing informative essay writing. In math we are working on fractions. Please continue to check your child's folder each night for any important papers, as well as homework. Also, please make sure your child is reading a book of choice for 15 minutes each night and practicing their multiplication facts. Please make sure your child has a coat with their name in it as the weather gets colder. We will go outside most days and they will need a coat.

What are some things you can do as a bystander to help stop bullying?

- Stand up for the person being bullied and say, "Stop. That's bullying."
- Report or help someone report bullying to a trusted adult.
- Include others by inviting others to join in.

We want every child to feel safe when they come to school. Please have a conversation with your child about the importance of telling an adult when bullying occurs, as well as, the importance of treating others with kindness.
