 - Parents or guardians will pick up the first quarter report cards. All other report cards will be sent home with the student.
 - Student progress can be monitored online through Schoology.
 - Provide parents reasonable access to staff.
 - Contact the school at 251-221-3233 to schedule an appointment. Teachers are available during their planning period, appointments can also be scheduled for before and after school meetings.
- 5. Provide parents opportunities to volunteer and participate in their child's class and observe classroom activities.
 - Ben C. Rain High School has an open-door policy in which parents can volunteer and visit classrooms. All parents must report to the front office to request a visitor's badge.
