Adopted by the Santa Maria Joint Union High School District April 11, 2001

THE BOARD

School districts and county offices of education are governed by boards, not by individual trustees. While understanding their separate roles, the board and superintendent work together as a "governance team." This team assumes collective responsibility for building unity and creating a positive organizational culture in order to govern effectively.

To operate effectively, the board must have a unity of purpose and:


- Keep the district focused on learning and achievement for all students.
- Communicate a common vision.
- Operate openly, with trust and integrity.
- Govern in a dignified and professional manner, treating everyone with civility and respect.
- Govern within board-adopted policies and procedures.
- Take collective responsibility for the board's performance.
- Periodically evaluate its own effectiveness.
- Ensure opportunities for the diverse range of views in the community to inform board deliberations.

THE INDIVIDUAL TRUSTEE

In California's public education system, a trustee is a person elected or appointed to serve on a school district or county board of education. Individual trustees bring unique skills, values and beliefs to their board. In order to govern effectively, individual trustees must work with each other and the superintendent to ensure that a high quality education is provided to each student.

To be effective, an individual trustee:

- Keeps learning and achievement for *all* students as the primary focus.
- Values, supports and advocates for public education.
- Recognizes and respects differences of perspective and style on the board and among staff, students, parents and the community.
- Acts with dignity, and understands the implications of demeanor and behavior.
- Keeps confidential matters confidential.
- Participates in professional development and commits the time and energy necessary to be an informed and effective leader.
- Understands the distinctions between board and staff roles, and refrains from performing management functions that are the responsibility of the superintendent and staff.
- Understands that authority rests with the board as a whole and not with individuals.



RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE BOARD

The primary responsibilities of the board are to set a direction for the district, provide a structure by establishing policies, ensure accountability and provide community leadership on behalf of the district and public education. To fulfill these responsibilities, there are a number of specific jobs that effective boards must carry out.

Effective boards:

- Involve the community, parents, students and staff in developing a common vision for the district focused on learning and achievement and responsive to the needs of all students.
- Adopt, evaluate and update policies consistent with the law and the district's vision and goals.
- Maintain accountability for student learning by adopting the district curriculum and monitoring student progress.
- Hire and support the superintendent so that the vision, goals and policies of the district can be implemented.
- Conduct regular and timely evaluations of the superintendent based on the vision, goals and performance of the district, and ensure that the superintendent holds district personnel accountable.
- Adopt a fiscally responsible budget based on the district's vision and goals, and regularly monitor the fiscal health of the district.
- Ensure that a safe and appropriate educational environment is provided to all students.
- Establish a framework for the district's collective bargaining process and adopt responsible agreements.
- Provide community leadership on educational issues and advocate on behalf of students and public education at the local, state and federal levels.

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C. BUSINESS

1. INFORMATION ITEM: Update on Solar Photovoltaic (PV) Districtwide Project

In December 2016, the board authorized district administration to proceed with issuing a Request for Proposal (RFP) for installation of solar photovoltaic (PV) district-wide. The District is looking to develop energy conservation, cogeneration, and alternate energy supply sources at District facilities. Accordingly, the District used a competitive process (Request for Proposals or "RFP") to select a qualified contractor to design and build solar photovoltaic generating facilities at four District sites ("Solar Project").

Based on the overall proposed Solar Project cost and cost-savings, among other factors, OpTerra Energy Services ("OpTerra") was selected to negotiate a contract with the District to design and build the Solar Project. In the event that the District cannot reach agreeable terms with OpTerra, District reserves the right to negotiate with another contractor selected from the competitive process. District staff will return to the Board to seek approval of the final negotiated contract, in accordance with the process required by Government Code section 4217.10 *et seq*.

The following Instructional Material proposal is presented to the Board of Education for consent. This instructional material is aligned with the common core. The Houghton-Mifflin-Harcourt 'Collections' curriculum was selected by a team of ELA teachers representing each site in the district as part of a year-long selection process. Three different publisher curriculums were piloted in classrooms during the 2016-17 school year, with 'Collections' being selected in April. This new curriculum is to be used district-wide in all ELA classrooms at the 9^{th} , 10^{th} , and 11^{th} grade levels.

I. Authorization to Piggyback on Palo Verde Unified School District for Flooring Materials and Installation District-Wide for the Length of the Extended Contract through June 30, 2017.

Section 20118 of the Public Contract Code provides an alternative for obtaining supplies, furniture, and equipment, commonly referred to as "piggybacking", where notwithstanding Section 20111 and 20112 of the Public Contract Code, the governing Board of any school district without advertising for bids and if the Board of Education has determined it to be in the best interest of the district may authorize the purchase of such supplies, furniture and equipment.

Palo Verde Unified School District has extended their flooring materials and installation bid with Tandus Centiva Inc. (Unit Bid Contract #B-111202) which expires June 30, 2017, and with Board approval the district may "piggyback" on their bid.

J. Authorization to Utilize TCPN for District-wide Purchases of Janitorial Products for the length of the Contract through February 29, 2020.

Section 10299 of the Public Contract Code provides an alternative for obtaining supplies, furniture, and equipment, whereby notwithstanding Section 20111 and 20112 of the Public Contract Code, "school districts may, without competitive bidding, utilize contracts, master agreements, multiple award schedules...established by the department [DGS] for the acquisition of information technology, goods, and services." Section 10299 further authorizes state and local agencies to "contract with suppliers awarded the contracts without further competitive bidding." District administration recommends that district-wide purchases of Janitorial Products be made utilizing the provisions of the Public Contract Code that allow purchasing from a TCPN Contract (The Cooperative Purchasing Network), Contract #R162101 through Network Services Company as the vendor and Waxie as the distributor, effective March 1, 2017 through February 29, 2020.

April 2017 Activities

1. Santa Maria High School Construction Projects

SMHS EPA Marquee Replacement – Support Services

• Work completed this period includes the installation of concrete footings, steel frame structure, electrical, and one sign component. Completion is expected to occur in late May.

SMHS Paving Areas A, B, C – Flowers and Associates

• The project design package is expected to be complete May 8, 2017 with bids to be issued May 12, 2017. Construction is scheduled to occur during July and early August 2017.

SMHS Reconstruction – (Architect to be determined)

• Four firms participated in Architect interviews held April 24, 2017. There were elements of each proposal that the committee liked. One firm emerged as front-runner after ranking. CFW and the District's administration are evaluating the front-runner's proposed design for adjustments to better suit District needs. Upon completion of this evaluation, discussions will be held with the Architect firm to review the design changes. To allow for the evaluation and adjustment discussions, the June 13, 2017 Board meeting is now being targeted to present the final conceptual design and make an Architect recommendation.

2. Ernest Righetti High School Construction Projects

ERHS New 38-Classroom Building – Rachlin Partners

 Site construction activities occurring this period include continued rerouting of existing utilities, excavation of footings, and installation of south-side column footings concrete. Offsite fabrication of steel columns is underway with initial shipments expected to arrive on site the second week of May. (Photos)

ERHS Cafeteria Walk-In Freezer Project – Rachlin Partners

• A job walk was held April 27, 2017. Bids are expected to be received May 8, 2017. Results of the bid will be presented to the board May 16, 2017. Onsite construction is scheduled to occur between June 12 and July 31, 2017.

ERHS Maintenance and Operations Building Project – Rachlin Partners

• The new District Architectural Services Agreement is under review by the Architect. Design activities will begin upon completion of the agreement. A schedule will be created in coordination with ERHS 38-Classroom construction.

ERHS Concourse Concrete Replacement – Rachlin Partners

• The new District Architectural Services Agreement is under review by the Architect. Construction is anticipated to occur during summer 2017.

3. Pioneer Valley High School Construction Projects

C2004 District Performing Arts Center – BCA Architects





Approval of Classified Bargaining Unit Tentative Agreement on Work Calendars for 2017/18

Tentative AGREEMENT between the CALIFORNIA SCHOOL EMPLOYEES ASSOCIATION AND ITS CENTRAL COAST CHAPTER 455 and the SANTA MARIA JOINT UNION HIGH SCHOOL DISTRICT

May 5, 2017

The following Agreement reflects the full and complete agreement of the Santa Maria Joint Union High School District (hereinafter "District") and the California School Employees Association and its Central Coast Chapter 455 (hereinafter "CSEA") regarding the 2017-18 bargaining unit work calendar.

The parties agree on the following:

- The "2017-18 School Year Calendar" (Attachment #1 of this Agreement) shall be used to recognize the 2017-18 holidays for the Association bargaining unit as provided in Article 6.1.1 of the Collective Bargaining Agreement between the District and the Association.
- 2. The number of work days for each less than 12-month bargaining unit classification as well as their start date and end date for the 2017-18 fiscal year is listed on Attachment #2 of this Agreement.
- 3. For bargaining unit members assigned to a Monday through Friday schedule, the following holidays will be observed on alternate dates due to the date on which the holidays fall:

Veteran's Day Holiday will be observed on Friday, November 10, 2017. Admission Day Holiday will be observed on Friday, December 22, 2017. Christmas Day Holiday will be observed on Monday, December 25, 2017. Christmas Eve Holiday will be observed on Tuesday, December 26, 2017. New Year's Eve Holiday will be observed on Friday, December 29, 2017.

For those bargaining unit members working a non-traditional work-week, the holidays are specified in Article 6.

- 4. The number of paid days for 12-month bargaining unit members for the 2017-18 fiscal year is 260 days. They shall be paid each month their same base monthly salary amount regardless of the number of work days in each month. The monthly base salary is reflected on Appendix C of the Collective Bargaining Agreement.
- 5. Bargaining unit members who are employed by the District during times outside of the dates they are normally in paid status shall receive compensation and benefits on a pro rata basis that are applicable to the classification of the additional assignment or service during their regular work year in accord with Education Code 45102.

6. Any disputes of any of the provisions contained herein shall be resolved utilizing the Grievance Procedures outlined in the Collective Bargaining Agreement. Additionally, violations of statute may be addressed using those resolution processes.

Tentatively agreed to this 5th day of May 2017. This Tentative Agreement shall become final upon ratification by the membership of the Association (as outlined in the Association's Internal Policy 610) and adoption/ratification by the Santa Maria Joint Union High School District Board of Education.
