* be respectful of teacher, self and others at all times

Assignments: See Schoology and check planner for daily assignments. Work is due on the due dates assigned. For every day the assignment is turned in late, students lose a letter grade. Attendance: For ultimate success, students need to be in class. If a student misses class, a parental note with an explanation should be brought to the office. Make-up work is the responsibility of the student.

Tardies: Students must report to school and to each class on time. If you are late to class, it is considered <u>unexcused</u> unless otherwise noted by a teacher. Lunch Detention will be given for patterned tardies and/or further disciplinary action, if needed.

Make-Up Work Policy: It is the responsibility of the student, to obtain any missed concepts, notes, assignments, etc. This may require time spent at lunch. Students have two days per day(s) absent to make-up the work. Students have one day per absence (plus 2 additional days) to make up the work ASSIGNED on those days!

Example: 1 day Absent = 3 days Make-Up 3 days Absent = 5 days Make-Up **Test or Major Project assigned BEFORE absence = due the day you get back.

- → CHECK Schoology a great tool for making up work while absent.
- → FIND A FRIEND: Arrange to have a friend help you.
- → TEACHER HELP: You arrange with me time before/after school or at lunch.

Late Work Policy: Students will lose a letter grade for each day an assignment is late. (Exceptions, discretion of teacher) Late Work Deductions: 1 day = 1 letter grade, 2 days = 2 letter grades, 3 days = 3 letter grades after that = 0%

Academic Honesty: Students must observe standards of academic honesty and integrity. Those in violation will result in disciplinary action.

Tutoring/Help Needed: Students may arrange time with me for tutoring before or after school. I am also available during lunch.
