Administration Report by Mrs. Griffiths:

- A huge thank you to Mary Garced from Just Read Florida for providing additional training to ensure our upcoming visit is a successful one as we adjust our small group instruction with reading.
- Our fourth graders rocked it out with the NAEP testing. A huge shout out to Mrs. Alexander and our fourth-grade teachers!
- Our first graders did an outstanding job with their IB Showcase and their performance.
 Thank you to our special area teachers for their collaboration with our first-grade teachers to make this a success.
- We appreciate the third-grade families who came out to support our third-grade reading night! Special thanks to Mrs. Finnell, Mrs. Borders, Mrs. Yates, Mrs. Zyneshia Walker, and Mrs. Ballentine for supporting this night.
- Thank you to Mrs. Alexander for her work with the PYP Mentor Night for our fifth-grade exhibition.
- We are thankful for Varsity Tutoring as this will be an excellent resource for our families.
 Shout out to our fourth grade as they have 39 students that are currently active during spring break! We also had Original Ink come out to support our families for uniforms for next school year. They even had adorable earrings to support our school. That was a hit with our families during our Family Picnic Day. Shout-out to SLA for an amazing job specifically- Mrs. Maldonado.
- JHW had a book fair the week before spring break so students would have books to read over the break. There will be a third book fair with a buy one book get a free one for the summer.
- Mrs. Griffiths has shared with the Foundation board and the LW School Board the progress made with the Read 20/AR program. A copy of the graph has been provided to

- Our African American went from an F to a C; Hispanics went from a D to a C; Whites went from an F to a C; Economically Disadvantaged went from a D to a C; ESOL went from an F to a C. Overall our Federal Index improved from 36% to 42%.
- There is concern about our ESE and FIN has been actively involved this school year due to the decrease from a D to an F. We have also added additional positions to support this subgroup.

PYP Update- Presented by Brittany Alexander

- Super thankful for our consultant with Katie Poulsen
- Mrs. Poulsen went through our units. We were instructed to do it piece by piece. We have made revisions. She did classroom visits to see if evidence supports the IB PYP philosophy.
- Major shout out to second grade, fifth grade, and Kindergarten for rocking it out.
- The teachers had the interview prep. The teachers got a lot of good feedback and practice their key elements.
- The consultant would like board members and central office to come to IB trainings and be involved when here. We have requested an August training for all. We are waiting for the proposal.
- Our third, fourth, and fifth grade showcase will focus on the following: Third- endangered species; fourth Florida Landmarks; 5th- grade into Earth Day. JHW decided to do an adopt a park project. The city is allowing us to adopt Frazier Park. Proposal has been sent in. There will be community hours will involve the students by cleaning the project. Also, we would like to have a reflection path to add a word or stone into the path. We would also like to add the book box to include the Read 20.
- Over the summer, teachers will use the summer to work with administration to go through three units.
- We are anticipating authorization in Fall of 2024 of the 2024-2025 school year.

Just Read Florida and FIN Update- Presented by Kim Griffiths

- The school is moving to deeper questioning. Our teachers are still bearing too much of the cognitive load.
- Our intermediate teachers need to ensure we are not summarizing the test for them and all tasks come from the text.
- We need to increase our use of specific praise and we have completed our FDOE Corrective Feedback training. We will continue to monitor for implementation.
- We will continue to look for no round robin reading
- We will continue to reinforce that paragraphs in a text have a central idea and direct them where to look in the text.
- JWH will continue to look at what are the students learning and how are they learning it (is it research based).
- JHW continues to make progress with our FIN visits. We have signs posted in our general
 education classrooms and we will continue to make improvements utilizing the FIN rubric when
 they visit. We are scheduling our inclusive scheduling for the 24/25 school year and our general
 education teachers need to be training for Access standards.


