# ECAAPS

ECAAPS (Early College Admission for Avoyelles Parish Students) is a dual enrollment program with Louisiana State University at Alexandria for eligible juniors and seniors of the Avoyelles Parish Schools.

## Fees

1. The APSB will pay all total tuition cost per student per semester.
2. The APSB will pay any associated course fees, such as textbooks.

## Academic Requirements

1. Must be classified as high school junior or senior with a minimum of 14 Carnegie units.
2. Must have successfully completed and passed the EOC exam in Algebra I, Geometry, Biology, English II and English III prior to enrolling in a DE English course at LSUA.
3. Must meet the ACT/PLAN requirements set by LSUA.
4. All college courses taken will articulate to a high school course in accordance with the articulation agreement with LSUA.

## Enrollment Requirements

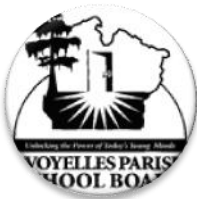
1. A student may enroll in up to five college course per semester.
2. A student must enroll in a minimum of two college courses per semester.
3. DE juniors must return to their high schools and complete the entire day. They will not be eligible for early release. DE seniors will be eligible for early release according to board policy on early release of seniors.

## Transportation

1. Transportation will be provided to and from respective high schools at no cost to ECAAPS students.
2. Students will be allowed to provide their own transportation according to established board policy.

## Food Services

1. Breakfast and lunch will be offered to each ECAAPS.

## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q: When does a student need to choose a diploma pathway?

A: Students must decide during the Spring of his/her 10<sup>th</sup> grade year.

Q: Could a student change from university diploma to the Jump Start diploma or vice versa after spring of the 10<sup>th</sup> grade year:

A: Yes, but in order to a student to earn the remaining credits and/or credentials, the student may need a 5<sup>th</sup> year of high school.

Q: Could a University Diploma student take a Jump Start class?

A: Yes. The Jump Start class would count as an elective.

Q: Do students need to pass End-Of-Course tests to graduate:

A: Yes, End of Course testing is required for all pathways.
