

2022-23 Quality, Currency, Availability of Textbooks and Other Instructional Materials

Happy Valley Elementary held a public hearing on September 14, 2022, and determined that each school within the district had sufficient and good quality textbooks, instructional materials, or science lab equipment pursuant to the settlement of Williams vs. the State of California. All students, including English learners, are given their own individual standards-aligned textbooks or instructional materials, or both, in core subjects for use in the classroom and to take home. Textbooks and supplementary materials are adopted according to recommendations by the California Department of Education. Materials approved for use by the State are reviewed by all teachers and a recommendation is made to the School Board by a selection committee composed of teachers and administrators. All recommended materials are available for parent examination at the district office prior to adoption. A performing arts stage was funded jointly by the Parents' Club and community donations and built with volunteer labor. The music/art center was funded and built the same way. The Resource/Speech room houses our Resource Specialist and Speech Therapist. The multipurpose classroom provides space for small groups as well as Board meetings, community events, performing arts, and physical education.
