Students and staff exposed to COVID-19 no longer need to quarantine until and unless they develop symptoms. This is regardless of vaccination status. The CDC does recommend that those who have been exposed wear a mask for 10 days while indoors in public settings and get tested at least five days after exposure. If they are symptomatic, they should get tested sooner.

What if I'm exposed at school?

MCPSS is no longer requiring that students or staff who have been exposed at school be placed on quarantine. For students, the school nurse should send a letter home notifying the parents of exposure.

Those who have been exposed should monitor themselves for symptoms and take the precautions they deem necessary. If an exposed student or staff member becomes symptomatic, he or she should stay home for at least five days. They should be fever-free for at least 24 hours without medication before returning.

TEST COVID-19

As with any illness, those who are sick should stay home. This includes those who have tested positive and/or who exhibit COVID symptoms: fever, cough, runny nose, sinus congestion, trouble breathing, persistent pain or pressure in the chest, abdominal pain, stomachache, lack of taste or smell, diarrhea, vomiting, and/or sore throat.

Those who test positive should notify their school and stay home for at least five days. They should be fever-free for at least 24 hours without medication before returning. They should contact their healthcare provider.
