ences were gathered from the wars and the starvation of nations that we saw on television. We were the media generation, too.






The Next Thing







Great Expectations
















Pennies From Heaven

"Have you ever seen a miljon of anything?" was the question that Ms. Turner asked her first and third period classes one day. They had heard of a class in California who had raised a million pennies, but it had taken them four years to reach their goal. The idea sounded like a great one, so Ms. turner's classes decided to bring in their spare pennies for the rest of the semester. Eventually, the rest of the school heard of the project, and they soon became interested in it. the two classes then decided to expand the project even further. Other teachers began collecting pennies from their classes for the "Pennies from Heaven" project.

After a couple of weeks, the popularity had evolved to the extent where many companies around the county wanted to

become part of the project. By this time, Ms. Turner classes had decided to use the money to buy Christmas presents for thirty-seven underprivileged children. Many of the teachers had contests with each other, seeing which classes could bring in the most pennies. The local newspaper had frequent articles on the project, and Knoxville Channel 10 News came twice to report on the project.

After nearly two months, the project finished with over 750,000 pennies, a significantly shorter time than the California school. The students had about one-hundred eighty dollars to spend on each child. Gifts included books, clothes, and toys. After it was over, the classes realized that a simple idea could change the lives of many people.






THE YEARBOOK EXPERIENCE


Colophon

Parents, with help from their doctor, select the gender of their baby using a technique called MicroSort, which separates X-bearing (female-determining) and Y-bearing (male-determining) sperm. The success rate is about 92 percent for females and 69 percent for males.



A new board game, Infection, hits stores in July Fun and educational, players race around the board catching diseases, described in detail, and trying to



In October, Sea Launch Company, a multi-national consortium, launches the first commercial satellite into space from a floating platform in the Pacific Ocean. Boeing is a major partner in the venture, along with companies in Russia, Ukraine and Norway.



In October, biologists isolate one of the enzymes that sets Alzheimer's disease in motion. This scientific discovery will lead to new treatments and, possibly, a cure. Over 4 million Americans, including former President Ronald Reagan, are living with the disease.
