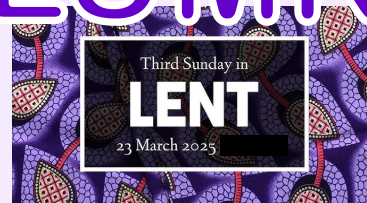

PASTOR'S COLUMN

Dear Parishioners of St. Therese, I want to share with you **St. John Paul II's reflections on the three practices of Lent: prayer, fasting and almsgiving.**

He gave these **at his Wednesday general audiences during his first Lent as Pope in 1979.** The first one below is on **prayer.** —Fr. Peter



“First, then, the way of prayer. I say ‘first,’ because I wish to speak of it before the others. But saying ‘first,’ I want to add that in the complete work of our conversion—that is, of our spiritual development—prayer is not isolated from the other two ways which the Church defines with the evangelical term of ‘fasting and almsdeeds.’ The way of prayer is perhaps more familiar to us. We understand more easily, perhaps, that, without it, it is not possible to be converted to God, to remain in union with Him, in that communion which makes us mature spiritually. There are certainly among you, who are now listening to me, a great many who have their own experience of prayer, who know its various aspects, and can make others share it.

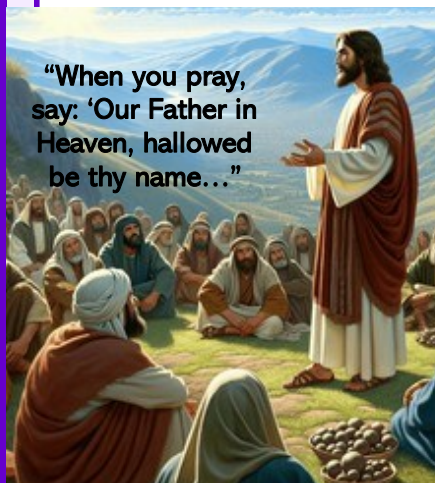
“We learn to pray, in fact, by praying. The Lord Jesus taught us to pray first of all by Himself praying: ‘all night He continued in prayer’ (Luke 6:12); another day, as St Matthew writes, ‘He went up on the mountain by Himself to pray. When evening came, He was there alone’ (Matthew 14:23). Before His passion and death, He went to the Mount of Olives and encouraged the Apostles to pray, and He Himself knelt down and prayed. A prey to anguish, he prayed more intensely (Luke 22:39-46). Only once, when requested by the disciples: ‘Lord, teach us to pray’ (Luke 11:1), He gave them the simplest and the deepest content of His prayer: the ‘Our Father.’

“Since it is impossible to include in a short speech all that can be said or that has been written on the subject of prayer, I would like to stress only one thing. All of us, when we pray, are disciples of Christ, not because we repeat the words that He once taught us—sublime words, the complete content of prayer—we are disciples of Christ even when we do not use these words. We are His disciples only because we pray: ‘Listen to the Master praying; learn to pray. He prayed, in fact, for this reason, to teach people to pray,’ St. Augustine affirms (Enarrationes in Psalm 56, 5).

“And a modern author writes: ‘Since the end of the way of prayer is lost in God, and no one knows the way but the One who comes from God, Jesus Christ, it is necessary (...) to fix our eyes on Him only. He is the Way, the Truth and the Life. Only He has traveled along the way in both directions. We must put our hand in His and start out’ (Y. Raguin, *Chemins de La contemplation*, Desclée de Brouwer, 1969, p. 179). To pray means speaking to God—I

would venture to say even more—to pray means finding oneself again in that One eternal Word through which the Father speaks, and which the Word speaks to the Father. This Word became flesh, so that it would be easier for us to find ourselves again in Him even with our human word of prayer.

“This word may sometimes be very imperfect, sometimes we may even lack it, but this incapacity of our human words is continually completed in the Word that became flesh in order to speak to the Father with the fullness of that mystical union which every man who prays forms with Him, which all those who pray form with Him. In this particular union with the Word lies the greatness of prayer, its dignity and, in some way, its definition.”

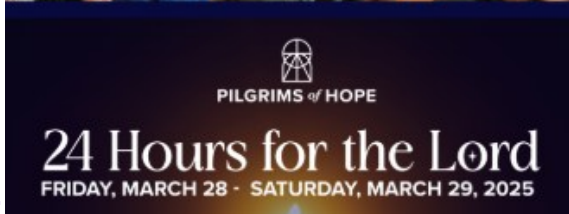

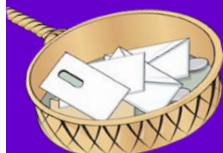

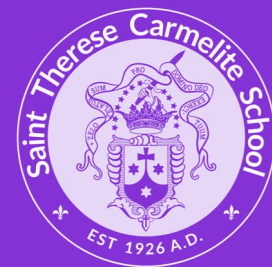

BEWARE OF SCAMMERS!

As reported before, beware of scammers who send emails/texts pretending to be clergy and ask you to purchase gift cards or wire money. They get parishioners' names from the websites and online bulletins of churches throughout the world—including ours! They then set up fake emails under the names of priests and deacons and send emails to the names they've gotten, pretending to be those persons. They will ask you to contact them when it is "convenient" for you. They also hack into phone companies and create temporary, untraceable fake cell phone numbers. If you respond, they'll ask you to buy gift cards, saying they're for hospital patients, etc.

SCAM ALERT

Be assured, NONE of our priests, deacons, etc., will EVER asking anyone to purchase anything or to send money. Just block, delete, and otherwise ignore these people. They are most times working for sham companies from foreign countries to try to steal money.

Because anyone can create fake emails in other people's names (there is no real process used to prove one's identification for gmail, yahoo, etc.), there is nothing we can do other than to warn you.

National Eucharistic Revival



Do This in Remembrance of Me, Part 29:

The Creed as Statement of Faith in the Trinity

"The Creed is divided into three parts: 'the first part speaks of the first divine Person and the wonderful work of creation; the next speaks of the second divine

Person and the mystery of his redemption of men; the final part speaks of the third divine Person, the origin and source of our sanctification' " (Catechism, no. 190).

Charles Belmonte expands this introduction to the three parts of the Creed:

- A confession of faith in God, the Father, our Creator, maker of Heaven and earth...
- A confession of faith in Christ, our Lord. He is God, who by the power of the Spirit became incarnate [of] the Virgin Mary and was made man. Then we focus on Christ's Passion and Death on the Cross; His Resurrection, Ascension, and participation in the judgment to reign forever, as it was announced by the angel to the Virgin Mary (Luke 1:33).
- A confession of faith is the means of salvation, supplied by God, the Holy Spirit, the giver of supernatural life. We declare how he works through the Church (*Understanding the Mass*, p. 100-101).

Continuing through the last part of the Creed, Belmonte writes, "[I] believe in one holy, catholic, and apostolic Church. [The word] catholic means 'universal' (and is not capitalized in this instance)—a reminder that the Church exists throughout the world and embraces the entire revelation of God... The Church is apostolic because she traces her origins back to Christ through the apostles and always teaches the message the apostles received from Him" (*Understanding the Mass*, p. 101). The Church is one and holy because it is founded by Christ and led by the Holy Spirit toward the unity and holiness that Jesus calls all Christians to live. We call this list the 'Four Marks of the Church.' These characteristics are like landmarks or distinguishing features that help us to know the one true Church of Jesus.
