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IMPORTANT TO KNOW THIS YEAR...

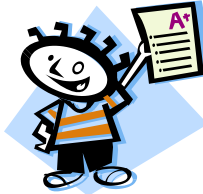
This year is a great time for your child to continue to build independent work and study skills to enhance their educational experience. Keeping track of their materials and using resources wisely will help them feel confident in their abilities. There are several ways we will work on this:

- **Student Planners** Everyday each student is expected to keep a written record of what is done in class and the assignments given. Sometimes these assignments are finished in class, and sometimes they are homework. To keep you informed, I ask that you initial their planner every night and then have the student bring it back to school everyday. The students are required to keep the planner all year.



- **Assignment Deadlines** All assignments have a deadline. Any assignments that are not turned in by their deadline will result in a zero on that assignment. If a student has an unplanned absence from school, they are required to make up all of the missed assignments. If a student has a planned absence from school, they need to collect any of the work they will miss before they leave and return it when they return to school. No extra time will be allowed to complete missed assignments for a planned absence.

- **Grading and PowerSchool** In 5th Grade, PowerSchool is used for recording grades, attendance, and other important information. It allows families to view grades, attendance, and any fees online anytime using their login. I highly encourage you to use it. It is a wonderful way for you to keep track of your student's progress. This can be accessed on Troy School District's website on the Parent Portal.



- **Email** Throughout the year, I will be sending numerous emails and newsletters describing important upcoming events, and other significant information. Please let me know if you are not receiving any emails from me or if your email address changes during the school year.



- **Flag Duty** Fifth grade students are responsible for raising and lowering the American and Idaho flags on the outside flagpole daily. This is an opportunity for them to exhibit good citizenship. Being disrespectful is not acceptable and will result in the students involved losing their privilege to participate in flag duty.



- **Supplies** Students need to keep all of their own supplies in their desk or provided supply bin. I am providing a Chromebook, computer mouse, and headphones for the students to use this year. Those will also remain at or in their desk throughout the school day. We will return the Chromebooks to the cart at the end of the day so they can charge for the following day.



- **Reading at Home** Students need to read one book per month and complete a book project. More information will be sent home about this.
- **Spelling Packets** Packets will be sent home every two weeks. They will contain the spelling words the students need to learn and activities to go along with the words. Packets are due every other Thursday.



• Expectations

I do need to let you know that I have high expectations for the students in my classroom and hold them accountable for their actions. School is a collaborative effort and we will work with the students in any way we can to help them achieve or overcome a difficulty. I also view 5th graders as role models to the younger students, and I ask that they present themselves in such a manner, not only in the classroom, but in the lunchroom, hallway, and on the playground. If students are being disruptive or disrespectful, they will receive a verbal warning. If the behavior continues, they will be asked to take some time to rethink their behavior and refocus so they can join the rest of the class again. If the behavior still continues, parents will be notified. Please contact me if you have questions or concerns.

• Items from Home

Unless it is on the 5th grade school supply list, please leave items at home. This includes headphones, all toys, and additional supplies not on the supply list including markers.
