PASTOR'S COLUMN

Let us conclude St. Therese's "On the waves of confidence and love."



I had the happiness of contemplating for a long time the marvels Jesus is working by means of my dear Mother. I see that suffering alone gives birth to souls, and more than ever before these sublime words of Jesus unveil their depths to me: "Amen, amen, I say to you, unless the grain of wheat falls into the ground and dies, it remains alone; but if it dies, it will bring forth much fruit." What an abundant harvest you have reaped! You have sown in tears, but soon you will see the result of your works, and you will return filled with joy, carrying sheaves in your arms. O Mother,

among these ripe sheaves is hidden the little white flower; however, in Heaven she will have a voice with which to sing of your gentleness and your virtues which she sees you practice every day in the darkness and the silence of life's exile!

Yes, for the past two years I have understood very well the mysteries hidden from me until then. God showed me the same mercy He showed to King Solomon. He has not willed that I have one single desire which is not fulfilled—not only my desires for perfection but those too, whose vanity I have understood without having experienced it.

As I have always looked upon you, dear Mother, as my ideal, I desired to be like you in everything; when I saw you do beautiful paintings and delightful poems, I said to myself: How happy I would be if I were able to paint and to know how to express my thoughts in verse and thus do good to souls. I would not have wanted to ask for these natural gifts, and my desires remained hidden away at the bottom of my heart. Jesus, hidden also in this poor little heart, was pleased to show it that everything is vanity and affliction of spirit under the sun. To the great astonishment of the Sisters, I was told to paint, and God permitted that I profit by the lessons my dear Mother gave me. He willed also that I write poems and compose little pieces that were considered beautiful. And just as Solomon, when he considered all the works of his hands in which he had placed so much useless toil, saw that all is vanity and affliction of spirit, in the same way I recognized from EXPERIENCE that happiness consists in hiding oneself, in remaining ignorant of created things. I understood that without love all works are nothing, even the most dazzling, such as raising the dead to life and converting peoples.

Instead of doing me any harm, of making me vain, the gifts which God showered upon me (without my having asked for them) drew me to Him; and I saw that He alone was unchangeable, that He alone could fulfill my immense desires.

A Decision of Faith

In the readings today, we are presented with a recurring theme: the choice to follow God with unwavering faith, even when His ways are difficult to understand. The first reading from Joshua captures a pivotal moment in Israel's history. Joshua gathers the tribes and presents them with a choice: to serve the gods of their ancestors or to serve the Lord. In response, the people recall the mighty deeds of God, proclaiming, "We will serve the Lord, for He is our God." This declaration is not made lightly; it is a conscious decision to commit to the God who has delivered them from bondage and guided them through the wilderness.


The Psalmist echoes this sentiment in Psalm 34, inviting us to "taste and see that the Lord is good" and declaring that "the Lord hears the cry of the poor." This psalm is a call to trust in God's goodness and to seek refuge in Him, confident that He delivers the righteous

from all their troubles. The choice to follow God is not without challenges, but is rooted in the assurance of His constant presence and protection.


In the New Testament reading from Ephesians, St. Paul speaks of the profound mystery of Christ's relationship with the Church, likening it to the intimate bond between husband and wife. This relationship is one of mutual love and sacrifice, where Christ's love for the Church is demonstrated through His willingness to give Himself up for Her. The Gospel reading from John brings us to a moment of crisis among Jesus's followers. After delivering His teaching on the Eucharist—where He declares that His flesh is true food and His blood true drink—many of His disciples find His words intolerable. They murmur, "This is a hard saying; who can listen to it?" **Jesus, aware of their struggle, does not soften His message.** Instead, He turns to the Twelve and asks, "Do you also want to leave?" **This question underscores the gravity of the choice before them: to accept Him fully, with all that His teaching entails, or to walk away.**

Peter's response is one of profound faith: "**Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life.**" In this moment, the apostles choose to trust in Jesus, even when His teachings are difficult to understand. This choice to stay with Christ, despite the challenges, is a powerful act of faith that mirrors the decision of the Israelites to serve the Lord in Joshua's time. It is a reminder that true discipleship involves not only belief but also a willingness to embrace the mysteries of faith, trusting that Jesus is indeed the Way, the Truth, and the Life.

As we reflect on these Scriptures, we are called to consider our own response to Christ's teachings. Are we willing to follow Him, even when His words challenge our understanding? Like the Israelites, we must choose whom we will serve. Like the apostles, we must decide whether we will stay with Christ, trusting in His promise of eternal life. This decision requires faith, courage, and a deep commitment to the God who has loved us with an everlasting love. **May we, like Peter, recognize that there is no one else to whom we can turn, for only in Christ do we find the words of eternal life.**


Want to Coordinate the Annual Women's Retreat?

"LET ME INTRODUCE YOU..." By Fr. Stephen F. Watson OCD



“¿Quién causa tanta alegría? La concepción de María.” (Who is the cause of so much joy? The Conception of Mary.”) The festival of La Gritería is an old tradition in Nicaragua to pay homage to the Immaculate Conception of the Virgin Mary, national patron saint of that country. The festival is celebrated in December in connection with the feast of the Immaculate Conception. This tradition originated with the arrival of Pedro Alonso Sánchez de Cepeda y Ahumada (brother of St. Teresa of Jesus, founder of the Order of the Discalced Carmelites) to Nicaragua with the image of Our Lady of the Immaculate Conception. The people begged Don Pedro to leave the image in Nicaragua. I learned about this tradition when I was

pastor of St. Therese over thirty years ago, when we had a sizeable number of parishioners from Nicaragua. **Otto and Martha Lacayo** were among them. This is their story.

Otto and Martha met in 1976 in Managua, Nicaragua, their birthplace. At the time, the political climate was very unstable and social activities were limited. After dating for a few years, by 1979 the civil war in Nicaragua became life-threatening, prompting Martha's family to receive political asylum and move to Los Angeles where one of her brothers was residing. Otto knew that he wanted to marry Martha and decided to follow her to Los Angeles in 1980. On March 28, 1981, Otto and Martha got married at All Souls Catholic Church in Alhambra, with the consent and blessings from their parents and the entire family. They became St. Therese Parishioners in 1981 and have since been involved in different ministries, serving the Church and the Community.

Otto and Martha were blessed with two beautiful children with big hearts, Otto, Jr., and Gabriella, who both attended St. Therese School from kindergarten to 8th grade. Both Otto and Gaby participated in many extracurricular activities, including serving as Altar Servers in both the Carmel and the Church, playing on Volleyball teams, and enjoying the lifelong friendships they made at St. Therese. Otto, Jr., the oldest, attended Loyola High School and Cal State LA University and now lives in Brooklyn, New York. As the owner of a Volleyball Club in Brooklyn, Otto proudly serves his community as a coach and mentor to many young kids. Gabriella, the youngest, went to Flintridge Sacred Heart Academy and continued to the Catholic University of San Diego. She has always loved helping others by working in the non-profit industry and currently works for the USO (United Services Organization, Inc.) as Marketing and Communications Manager, Event Planner and Fundraiser, supporting America's military service members and their families. She married Nathon Coyle in 2017 and they now have two beautiful children, Liam Joseph and Lucy Jean, who was just born this past July.

Martha is a co-founder of a Pregnancy Help Center and is a Natural Family Planning Practitioner at St. Therese. Martha previously worked for Avon Products in the accounting department for over 30 years until they closed their Pasadena Headquarters. She currently works for the Knights of Columbus Southern California Insurance Agency in Pasadena. Otto worked for the United States Postal Service for 33 years until he retired from Management in March 2023. Otto is a member of our OCDS Community and a Knight of Columbus.



National Eucharistic Revival

Do This in Remembrance of Me | Part 13: Liturgy of the Word



Every Mass, after the Collect, we all sit down and begin the part of the Mass called the Liturgy of the Word, which includes:

- First Reading, usually taken from the Old Testament
- A sung or recited Responsorial Psalm
- On Sundays and Solemnities: A Second Reading from the New Testament (other than the Gospels)
- The Alleluia or Gospel Acclamation
- A reading from the Gospels

A Three-Year Cycle: Sunday readings are divided into a three-year cycle. (The readings for daily Mass are on a two-year cycle with one reading from various parts of the Bible and a Gospel reading each day.) For the Sunday readings, **Cycle A** focuses on the Gospel according to St. Matthew, **Cycle B** focuses on St. Mark, and **Cycle C** focuses on St. Luke. The Old Testament readings correspond to the subject of the Gospel.

The Second Reading, which follows a different type of arrangement, is most often from a Letter of St. Paul to a community or an individual.




