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TTK and Kindergarten

We're off to a great start to the read-a-thon! Reading goals are 30 minutes per day, including weekends. Please return the reading logs each day in your child's planner or yellow folder so I can count the minutes. I am keeping track of minutes read at school on each student's reading log that is kept at school. I will update you on your child's progress towards their goal of 870 minutes for the month. Our classroom goal is for everyone to make their personal goal.

Kindergarteners continue learning teen numbers. Ten ones and two ones equals twelve ones, and so on. They write the teen numbers in a number bond and write a number sentence.

Kindergarteners are learning the tricky words of, the, all, and, a. They are also learning about farms. So far, they have learned about why we need farms and what kinds of crops farmers grow.

TK is working on their Habitats unit. They learned about the woodlands and the types of animals that lived there. This week, they are learning about pond habitats.

Students will be going up to Evergreen State College where they will listen to a presentation about water testing and salmon, then they will present our results to other students before enjoying a fun and educational session of their choice in the afternoon.

Students trekked up to our capital city for Olympia Junior Programs this week. Students enjoyed the play experience listening to stories from abroad.

The Read-a-Thon is well under way! In order for students to meet their individual goals, they must read for 30 minutes every night- including on the weekends. In order for minutes to count, the reading log must be filled in completely and **signed by an adult.** Logs are collected every Friday, new logs are then sent home. I try to attach updated minutes to logs on Mondays and send the updates home in Boomerang Folders.

Please continue to work on money and time skills with students. First graders are now deep into their geometry study of two and three dimensional shapes. Second graders are using measurement and data.

Next week we will investigate seasons and spring! Wishing all of you a very happy last weekend of winter!
