WHAT ARE WE LEARNING AT JES?

PreK: dinosaurs, museums, measurement, pre-reading skills

K: tricky words, spelling, consonant sounds, Columbus and the Pilgrims, Numbers 11-20 1: ELA - singular/plural nouns, suffixes -ed and -ing, reading fluency and comprehension, animals and their habitats; Math - adding tens to a 2 digit number

2: Skills- We will be beginning Skills 6 where we will focus on informational texts, text features, and tricky spellings.
