10. PUBLIC – AGENDA/NON-AGENDA ITEMS

Alyson Martorano, 34 South Home Avenue, Gibbstown, NJ said the 5th graders are not allowed on the playground equipment and it doesn't give them a whole lot of stuff to do. She also stated she "heard" it wasn't safe. Scott Campbell asked her where she heard it wasn't safe because the facilities department does regular safety checks on all the equipment. Dr. Jennifer Foley-Hindman said she cannot comment on that subject of 5th graders not being allowed on the playground equipment until she can get more information on that.

Ms. Martorano then asked whether the "specials" were going back to normal meaning the K-2 will be moving from classroom to classroom which would give them a little movement instead of sitting in a classroom all day? **Dr. Foley-Hindman** again said she would need more information on that subject before she comments but she doesn't see why we can't go back to that.

Ms. Martorano said the kids are using chromebooks now but is there going to be a time when they are going to get back into the computer lab with a desktop computer and a mouse to be taught other skills? **Dr. Foley-Hindman** responded that they will be transferring those skills into the classroom so there will be no need to have a separate computer lab for that.

Ms. Martorano then asked if they heard anything back from Lifetouch if we are going to be receiving refunds for the yearbooks that were never received? **Dr. Foley-Hindman** said she believes **Mike Grelli** put out information about the refund and she will follow up with him about it to make sure it was communicated to the parents effectively.

Ms. Martorano asked why we don't have "STEAM" for the older grades at Broad Street? Dr. Foley-Hindman said it was because they get Science. The "STEAM" was to try and pull some of our expertise that we had in the older grades and bring it down to the lower grades. They do have a dedicated lab now. Ms. Martorano asked if there is going to be a time when we will bring clubs and fun things back to Broad Street like Family Fun Night or Family Fitness Night, Art or Italian Club etc.? Dr. Foley-Hindman responded that we have had teachers sign up for clubs here at Nehaunsey and there is money allocated for clubs but if we don't have advisors signing up for them, then we can't have them.

Ms. Martorano then asked how we can get parents back into the schools? She realizes we can't bring snacks in for our child's birthday but would we be able to read a book to the class? **Dr. Foley-Hindman** said they are looking at ways to do that but every time we allow people in the building, it is a security issue. She will meet with **Mrs. Whitcraft** to see when we can look at doing that.

Jessica Folker DelTufo, 907 Mullen Avenue, Gibbstown, NJ asked about having room parents in the classrooms. She said sometimes it is nice to have a different face in the classroom. Even during the holidays where a parent can come and help out with a craft. **Dr. Foley-Hindman** again said that she and Mrs. Whitcraft will look into it to see what can be done. Violet Gregg, teacher at Nehaunsey Middle School, said at Swedesboro-Woolwich Township Schools, they don't have parents come in for birthdays but they do have "mystery readers" where you sign up in the beginning of the school year and it is either a parent or guardian that comes in and reads to the class. She believes it is only for Kindergarten and Grade 1 and it is done maybe once every other week.
