# **Current Students (Re-Enrollment)**

## Early Bird Rate

- January 19, 2022 (estimated opening) February 28, 2022
- The re-enrollment fee is \$350 (first child) and \$275 (per additional child) during the early re-enrollment period.
- The re-enrollment fees are non-refundable.

# Regular Rate

- Begins Tuesday, March 1, 2022
- The re-enrollment fee is \$400 per child.

- \$150 application fee
- \$200 enrollment fee

- The application fee is \$150 (non-refundable).

**Mrs. Christina Dabulskis** is one of our assistant principals at SJRCS. An educator for 17 years, Mrs. Christina Dabulskis has been working at SJRCS for three years, two years as a teacher and now as an assistant principal. She has previously served as an elementary school teacher, in both the public and private school systems. Mrs. Dabulskis began her career at Towson University Childcare Center, immediately following her graduation from Towson University. There she mentored the student teachers as well as taught a class of her own.

After two years, Mrs. Dabulskis had the opportunity to serve as an elementary school teacher at Little Flower Catholic School in southern Maryland and from there taught in Frederick County Public Schools for 11 years. She has been a kindergarten teacher, here at SJRCS, for the last 2 years. During her teaching career, Mrs. Dabulskis has served additional roles such as new teacher mentor, peer coaching, as well as being involved in a variety of committees.

Mrs. Dabulskis, a native of southern Maryland, has resided in the Frederick area for 12 years with her husband, Stephen and their daughter, Hannah, who is currently pursuing an early childhood education degree. Mrs. Dabulskis believes in enjoying life by being of service to others. She has served her community in a variety of ways, including CASA and the City of Frederick Food Bank. **Dr. Annette Jones** has served in various roles in Catholic education for over 25 years. In Indianapolis, she worked as a principal for 17 years and also as an assistant principal and teacher. In 2015, Dr. Jones and her husband, Martin, moved to Maryland where Dr. Jones

worked as the Assistant Director of Leadership Development and School Leadership at the National Catholic Educational Association (NCEA).

Dr. Jones continues to be engaged in national and international education by presenting at conferences and publishing articles and resources for professional organizations. As a two-time Fulbright awardee, she traveled to Finland in 2005 and Argentina in 2011. She presently serves as the elected President of the National Capital Area Chapter (NCAC) of the Fulbright Association and is a board member of Friends of Fulbright Alumni Council.

Dr. Jones holds a Doctor of Education degree in educational administration and supervision and a Specialist in Education degree in school superintendency from Ball State University. Her doctoral research centered on building teacher leadership capacity in National Blue Ribbon Catholic schools throughout the United States. She completed a Master's degree in educational administration and supervision from Butler University and a Bachelor's degree in elementary education and French education (minor) from Wittenberg University.

Dr. and Mr. Jones are the parents of two grown children, Matthew and Allison, who attended Catholic elementary and high schools in Indianapolis, then graduated from Purdue University. The Jones family enjoyed a wonderful fall of 2022! Allison and her husband, Zach, welcomed their daughter, Valerie, in October and Matthew married his sweetheart, Chelsea, in November. In her leisure time, Dr. Jones enjoys traveling, spending time with her family and friends, exercising, gardening, and baking.

Mrs. Kelly Weeks has served in various roles in Catholic schools for 15 years and began serving as Assistant Principal for St. John's this school year. After undergraduate graduation, Mrs. Weeks returned to her elementary Alma Mater at Saint Mary's School in Rockville, Maryland as a special educator. After two years, Mrs. Weeks began teaching first grade at Holy Cross Elementary School in Garrett Park, Maryland. In 2019, Mrs. Weeks and her family moved to Frederick and she continued her administrative career as the Director of Enrollment at Saint John's Catholic Prep in Buckeystown.
