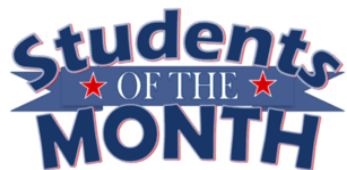

Students are continuing to observe and journal the growth of their very own seed that they planted right before Spring break. By now everyone's seed is growing so it's fun to compare the differences between the plants and watch them get taller each day.

We are finishing up a unit in reading this week. Students learned about tricky words that don't follow the rules- of, all, one, a, from, and was. They also learned about double consonants at the end of a word and that 'ck' never goes in the front of a word.
