The 2021 Eastern Randolph Hall of Fame Class has been released. These inductees will be recognized and entered along with the 2020 Class. The 2020 Hall of Fame will be honored before the game and the 2021 will be entered at halftime on September 24, as the Wildcats host West Stanley.

**Charles Arrington**-1984 graduate- 2-sport athlete—football and baseball. -He was a State Championship as a player in 1983 and Coach in 2006—played College football and baseball at Guilford College.

**Kenny Ray Dark**—1981 Graduate--An outstanding baseball player. He was a lefty and left a lot of batters standing at the plate. He was selected to the Greensboro Daily News-All-state Team, Randolph All-County Team—State Runner-up in 1981 NCHSAA.

**Derrick Collins**—2000 Graduate-played his college career at Elon University-Derrick was a 3-year varsity starter as a middle linebacker. He received a scholarship where he played 4-years for the Fighting Phoenix. Derrick was voted as A.P. All-State Linebacker in 1999; nominated and participated in the North Carolina and South Carolina Shrine Bowl.

**Brittany Young**—2007 Graduate—Brittany was a two- sport athlete of volleyball and basketball. An incredible talent who excelled in so many different areas, she was an all-tournament selection in all three years she played (2004-06).

**Craig Whitley**--2001 Graduate, was voted as A.P. All-State Offensive Tackle in 2000. Craig is at present to be last jersey retired by Eastern Randolph. According to the staff, Craig was one the best offensive lineman to ever play at Eastern. He went on to play at Wingate University.

**Ron Berbaum**—is well known as the “Voice of the Wildcats.” He served Eastern Randolph from 1993-2009 and has made several cameo appearances upon his retirement. Ron served in the United States Air Force from 1967-1971. He was employed and retired from Randolph County Schools. Past Eastern Randolph standout, James Lowe stated, “He’s not just the VOICE of Eastern Randolph Athletics, he is Eastern Randolph Athletics.

**Cecil Mock**- 1979 Graduate and a 2-sport athlete. He earned All-County in football and best defensive player of the year for Eastern Randolph. He continued to wrestle at Pembroke State University, now UNC-Pembroke. He began working with the program in 1982 as a trainer and coach in football, wrestling, and baseball. He assisted Coach Burton Cates and Coach Greg Hardin for more than 25 years.
