The children brought their favorite thing from home to show the other classrooms. The virtual Children participated in all the activities as well.



Early Intervention for Infants/toddlers (Ages birth to age 3) and Special Services for children (Ages 3-5)

Very young children have lots of new skills to learn-learning to move, learning to communicate, etc. Families are often concerned when a child's development seems slower than expected. If you are worried your child may be delayed in his/her development, share your concerns with the classroom teacher or special education coordinator. The idea behind early intervention is that a child's developmental delays can be addressed best when they are discovered early.

<u>Tips for Parents: CREATING</u> ROUTINES FOR LEARNING -

Routines are important opportunities for learning.

Daily routines are typically thought of as only everyday upkeep activities: meal time,



getting ready for bed, taking baths, etc. But these everyday actions are rich opportunities to support your child's learning and development, while having fun. Routines offer the chance to build self-confidence, curiosity, social-skills, self-control, communication skills and more.

Routines help babies, toddlers and preschoolers learn <u>self-control</u>. Consistent routines, activities that happen at about the same time and in the same way each day, provide comfort and a sense of safety to young children. Routines help your child predict what will happen next. Routines support and develop children's **social skills**.

Examples of Simple Routines that are Learning Opportunities

- * Greetings, good-byes and short chats are examples of routine interactions that teach social skills.
- *Bedtime routines can help make transitions easier.. Would you like to brush your teeth now or after we get your pajamas on? Special rituals to help with this routine can be use a book, song or special game to prepare child for next steps to routine. Special rituals
- *Clean-up time- "I know you want a cracker. But it is clean up time now, Remember, after clean-up, it is snack time"
- *Play-time and mealtime are two routines that are very social times for children and parent alike. Through talking, taking turns, sharing toys, learning to wait, young children learn important social skills that will help them later on in school.

PLEASE NOTE: Routines provide the two key ingredients for learning: <u>relationships</u> and <u>repetition</u>. So enjoy these "ordinary" moments with your child. If he/she is having fun with you, he/she is learning, too!





As we continue our fight to keep our DEC campus free of the Covid-19 virus and its variants, I want to take this opportunity to thank all the parents and families. You are all doing a great job in registering your children for Covid-19 testing bi-weekly at the center. In addition, kudos to parents that have chosen to vaccinate your 5-year old children. I know it has been a challenge for parents to keep up with all the new ways to register. DEC is fortunate to have parents and families doing their part to keep all our staff, your children and all their friends at school safer.

In this Covid-19 world we now live in, be aware that procedures, protocols and policies are continuously changing. The LDoE Liason, DEC Interim Director and I are working to ensure that parents are aware when changes occur. We continue to protect your child and family by maintaining confidentiality in all aspects regarding Covid-19.

As of April 19, we have received a new protocol. When a student is showing Covid-19 symptoms, he/she will be sent home and parents notified.

For 5-year old students:

- 1. Severe Symptoms headache, nausea, body aches, sore throat, coughing, fever. DEC will inform parents that student will need to get a Covid-19 test 2 days after symptoms begin. Student will stay home and will not return to school until they have a negative test results.
- 2. Mild Symptoms example: runny nose. DEC will inform parents that student will need to get a Covid-19 test 3 days after symptoms begin. The student may return to school if feeling better, wearing a KN95 mask. Ms. Katrina Riley will inform Mrs. Iris Gallegos/Ms. Ruth Hidalgo of test results.

For students 4 years and under:

1. Mrs. Iris Gallegos/Ms. Ruth Hidalgo will notify Ms. Katrina Riley when a student is sent home with symptoms. Ms. Katrina Riley, in turn, will notify the EOC and she will also notify Mrs. Iris Gallegos/Ms. Ruth Hidalgo once she receives the Covid-19 test results. If you have any questions, please contact Ms. Katrina Riley.

A few reminders, in collaboration with the Laguna EOC and the Laguna Department of Education, we ask that you continue to practice the following:

- 1. As of February 17, 2022, the Pueblo of Laguna continues to enforce its face mask requirements under the current Executive Order Amendment No. 5. Parents please wear your mask when bringing your children to the bus and while dropping off or picking up your children at the center.
- 2. Keep a 6-feet social distance.
- 3. If your child is having symptoms, do not send them to school. Keep them home, monitor their symptoms and get them tested for Covid-19.
- 4. If your child is absent on DEC's day of testing, please make sure you have your child tested within that week at the Mesita pod. Your confirmation code is still valid, present the code along with your child's birthdate to the testers at the pod. Katrina Riley will

- notify Mrs. Iris Gallegos/Ms. Ruth Hidalgo of your results. Testing times at the Mesita pod are Mondays and Wednesdays from 12:00pm to 4:00pm; and Thursdays and Friday from 10:00am to 2:00pm.
- 5. If your child has turned 5-years old, consider getting them started on their Covid-19 vaccinations. Any eligible child (5 years old and up) who is not fully vaccinated will be put on a schedule to Covid-19 test weekly. Vaccinations are available at the Mesita pod every Tuesday from 12:00pm to 2:00pm BY APPOINTMENT ONLY.
