- 4. Maintain a positive and professional attitude.


Safety Rules

1. Wear Proper Safety Gear Required by Class: Safety glasses, gloves, aprons, closed-toed shoes, etc.

2. Report Hazards Immediately: Inform instructors of spills, broken tools, or unsafe conditions.

3. Use Equipment Responsibly: Only use tools you have been trained to operate.

4. Stay Focused: No horseplay, distractions, or use of personal devices in the shop.

- -Return tools and materials to their designated locations.
- -Do not misuse or damage equipment.
- -Conserve resources like welding rods, paint, and fuel.



Professional Behavior

- Use appropriate language at all times.
- Show respect to everyone, regardless of skill level.
- Handle conflicts calmly and maturely.
- Be open to feedback and willing to improve.
