### Curriculum Corner:

Hello CHES family!!

It's officially Fall!! We are excited about all the community events that signal the beginning of fall but we are equally excited about the great things happening at CHES. Last month, we launched a new assessment platform in the district. Grades K - 5 took "i-Ready" diagnostic assessments in Reading and Math. i-Ready is an adaptive assessment that utilizes strategic and research based questioning to determine a student's grade level based on their responses. The information from the assessment is then used to personalize instruction with targeted lessons in reading and math to supplement their in-class instruction. A copy of your child's results was sent home. If you did not receive a copy, please reach out to his/her homeroom teacher.

This month, we will be wrapping up the majority of our Fall testing with assessments in the following grades. (Pre-K: myIGDIs), (Kindergarten: Kindergarten Readiness Assessment (KRA)), (3rd, 4th, 5th: TE21 benchmark assessment in Reading and Math) and (4th: TE21 in Science).

Fall is a busy time at CHES but we are putting academics at the forefront while providing enriching activities to support the development of our scholars.
