
Inclement Weather Conditions



In the event of snow, ice or other inclement weather conditions it may be necessary to adjust school starting time or cancel classes. In these kinds of situations please listen to your local radio stations and News Channels. We try very hard to make decisions by

6:30a.m. Once the decision is made it is posted to the Flash Alert website and they send it out to all local TV and Radio Stations. You can also go to https://flashalert.net and check for delays and closures there. If the alert states that we will be on snow routes, this means that there are roads the bus will not go down (Please see attached flier for our snow routes and info). If you DO NOT hear any information regarding Evaline School you must assume school will be in session as usual. In the case of unplanned early dismissals due to emergencies students will either be transported home on the bus or will need to be picked up by their parent/guardian right away. This would include instances of sudden loss of power, water, or accumulation of snow. In the event of a late start, these days will always be two hours late. Therefore school will start at 10:30am and the bus will be picking up students two hours later than the normally scheduled pick up time. There will be no breakfast served on late start days.

TK and Kindergarten Mrs. Tinnin

This week, kindergarten students learned the letters n, h, f, and s. They should now also be familiar with the sounds for a, c, d, g, i, m, o, and t. We've been practicing how to sound out and blend words using the letters we've learned so far—an exciting step toward reading!

In math, kindergarten is exploring the number 10. We're finding different ways to make 10 and comparing other numbers to it through games and hands-on activities.

TK students continued their unit on Families. We're learning about different family members, the roles they play, and how everyone contributes to the family unit. In math, TK is focusing on numbers 1–5, practicing counting, recognition, and one more/one less.

We had a great time at the Pumpkin Patch. The weather was lovely. It was fun to see all of the families and siblings who joined us!

Families, you should have received a conference time via ClassDojo as well as a paper copy inside of students' Boomerang Folders. I am looking forward to meeting with all of you to discuss ways we can partner together to support your children's learning and success. It is such a gift to work with you and your children this school year!

Students continue to fly through their ELA and math units. Second graders are beginning Chapter 5 in math. They will be applying addition and subtraction strategies. First graders are deep into Chapter 4's study on addition concepts.

Please continue to read aloud with your child for 30 minutes every night. Students who are reading picture books should be taking an AR test every day. Students reading chapter books should be taking tests at least once a week.

All students should be at or above Leap 1 at this point. If they have not reached Leap 1 by Friday, November 7th, they will be assigned to a reading nook during Lion Paw group time.

Third and Fourth Grade Classroom Mrs. Mars

Both 3rd and 4th graders have finished their units on multiplication and moved onto division. We will continue to practice their multiplication skills daily as having their facts memorized is essential to continued success in math.

In science this week students explored how different thicknesses of lava create different types of volcanoes.
