Welcome to 2nd Grade

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The second grade teachers would like to welcome you and your child to second grade at WMES. I hope that through our mutual cooperation, your expectations, and your child's fullest potential will be reached this year. Our goal for this year is that your child will develop and demonstrate the skills needed to achieve mastery of the $2^{\rm nd}$ grade South Carolina College and Career-Ready Standards.

Momework

Homework is a very important part of your child's success in school. It is important that you make sure homework is done completely, correctly, and neatly. Homework is an extension of what we are covering in the classroom. You play an important role in your child's homework; however, please have your child complete it on his/her own. You can then go over it for accuracy. This is a way for you to see what your child is capable of doing. A grade will be taken for homework being completed.

Classroom Rules

- 1. Have all of your supplies ready.
- 2. Be on time!
- 3. Stay in your seat.
- 4. Listen and follow directions.
- 5. Respect the teacher and classmates.

Birthday Parties

It is a school policy that NO birthday parties will be allowed. You may not send any goodies (cupcakes, treat bags, etc.) on your child's birthday It is our goal at WMES to utilize every possible moment in the classroom to educate your child. Also, if you are planning a party outside of school, only send invitations to school to be passed out if you have one for **every** child in the class. Again, this is the policy of WMES, and we hope that you understand the reasons why we are asking this from you. If you have any further questions, please feel free to contact your child's teacher.

Grading Policy

The following is how grades will be weighted in 2nd grade for each subject.

30% Class Participation – (Ex. AR tests, math facts, review skills, practice work, etc.)

40% Formative Assessments – (Ex. Spelling tests, daily work, and quizzes)

30% Summative Assessments – (Ex. Writing prompts, projects, unit tests, and all other major assignments)

Elementary Related Arts:

E- Excellent (100%- 80%)

S- Satisfactory (79% - 60%)

U- Unsatisfactory (59% or below)

Music, Art, PE, and Health grades are based upon participation and behavior, not skill. These grades do not affect Honor Roll or Principal's List.

Attendance

To be considered for promotion, a student must be present for 170 days or meet requirements of the district's attendance policy. Attendance will be taken daily. After two days absent, parents will be contacted to verify absences. Please send in an excuse with your child as soon as he/she returns from an absence. The District's Attendance Policy will be enforced.
