World History

Course Description

The high school world history course provides students with a comprehensive, intensive study of major events and themes in world history. Students begin with a study of the earliest civilizations worldwide and continue to examine major developments and themes in all regions of the world. The course culminates in a study of change and continuity and globalization at the beginning of the 21st century.

Text

As a student of this course, you will be required to complete assigned reading and tasks from the listed text. *World History*. You must have uninterrupted access to the text's material. We offer the assigned text in both digital and hardcopy formats. You may choose not to request a hardcopy and in doing so fully understand it is your responsibility to maintain digital access to the text's material. If at any time you or your teacher feel you cannot guarantee this, a hardcopy will be issued to you. If the hardcopy text becomes damaged or lost, you will be responsible for the cost of replacement (as set by HCBOE).

Be aware that access to the textbook can be made through the county SSO.

Technology

Canvas can be accessed through the student chromebook or by downloading the app on iPhone or Android.
