Each week a behavior sheet will be used to document students' behavior. It will be sent to parents in Tuesday folders for signatures. Verbal warnings and reteaching of expected behavior will be used. Conduct checks on behavior sheet will reflect students' misbehavior. If a student receives a conduct check or checks, and behavior does not improve, an SBR (Student-Behavior-Report) will be completed and sent home. 3 Conduct checks in one week cumulative from both classes will result in an SBR.




