



The energy was electric and the stakes were higher than ever as the athletes competed for their opportunity to move on to the next round of districts. Several athletes qualified for quad districts and the Pe Ell boys team took home the District Championship Trophy with the highest score. 

# **PWV Titans Fastpitch First in League**



However, due to their tough schedule, league standing, and dominant hitting throughout the season, PWV was seeded 2nd heading into the state tournament in Yakima.




## **PWV BASEBALL TEAM ACHIEVEMENTS**
