

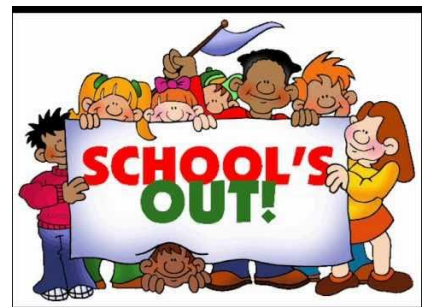


Field Day Fun

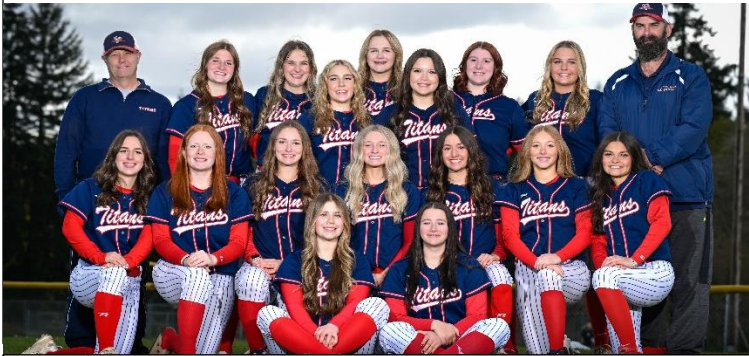

PWV Titans Fastpitch First in League

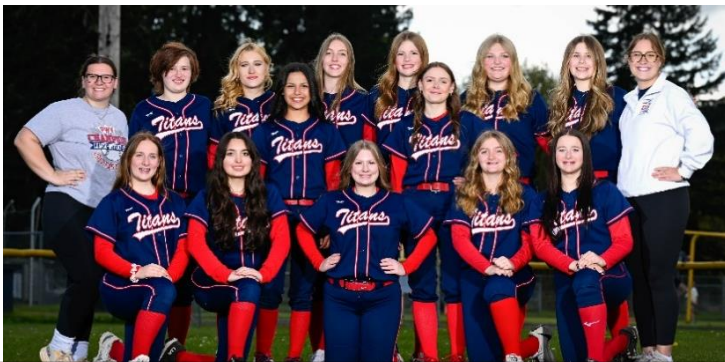

Both teams had to come back the next day to play one inning, where the only hit by either team was a home run by PWV's Karli Phelps. The Titans ended up taking 2nd in districts with a final score of 16-12. However, due to their tough schedule, league standing, and dominant hitting throughout the season, PWV was seeded 2nd heading into the state tournament in Yakima.

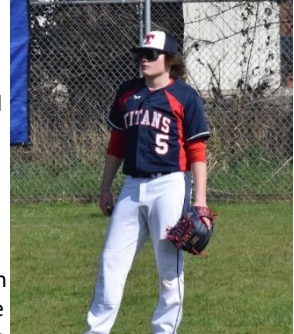

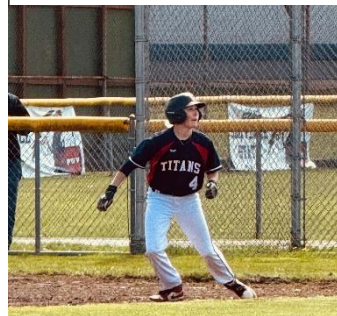

PWV BASEBALL TEAM ACHIEVEMENTS

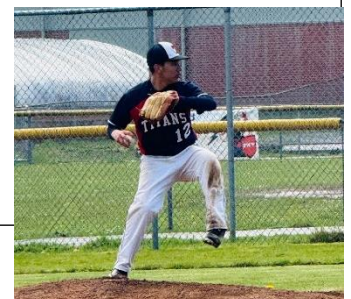
