- B. Vision Statement: OCS staff members, students, and families strive to create a culture of acceptance and belonging where all students are honored. OCS Community members will be given the tools and support to positively impact their local and global communities by being Empowered, Ethical, and Informed.

- C. <u>FY24-25 Preliminary Budget (presentation only</u>). The final budget is to be voted on at June's meeting
  - Budget Challenges: The governor and legislature are dealing with large budget deficits for the current and the next two years, with an initial gap of

\$45 billion reduced to \$28 billion after early actions.

- Education Funding:
  - The May revision of the budget, like the earlier proposal in January, aims to protect K-14 education from cuts by fully depleting the Proposition 98 Rainy Day Fund.
  - A controversial method called the "Prop 98 maneuver" is proposed to handle funding, spreading \$8.8 billion in excess allocations over five years, starting in 2025-26, without impacting the minimum guarantee calculations.
  - The governor supports maintaining K-14 programs and funding a 1.07% statutory cost of living adjustment (COL4).
- Other Government Spending:
  - Significant budget cuts are proposed for other government operations and programs, with a pause on new investments.
  - These measures are in response to slow economic growth at both the state and national levels.
- Impact on OCS: 2024-2025 budget assumptions for a specific school (OCS):
  - Enrollment is set at 440 with an attendance rate of 94.5%.
  - Budget includes various funding allocations like Prop 28 Arts and Music Funds and an Expanded Learning Opportunity Program.
  - Introduction of new revenue streams and changes in expenses, such as an increase in fundraising revenue, changes in health insurance contributions, and adjustments in teacher salaries.
- Potential Issues and Adjustments:
  - No relief seen for transitioning teacher-kindergarten ratios from 12:1 to 10:1 by 2025-26 due to state funding constraints.
  - While there are no ongoing reductions to core K-12 programs, such measures might be considered to balance the budget.
  - Final budget adjustments and the outcome of the "Prop 98 maneuver" will be crucial, with potential implications on the school's budget and operations if the maneuver is rejected.
