Narrative Section

Scope of Work/Narrative

The Liberty County School District qualifies for funding awarded by the General Appropriations Act, the Early Childhood Music Education Incentive Program (s. 1003.481, F.S.) The superintendent certifies to the department, in a format prescribed by the department, that Hosford Elementary and Junior High Schools has established a comprehensive music education program that:

- ✓ Includes all students at the school enrolled in kindergarten through grade 2.
 - o See appendix for complete class list
- ✓ Is staffed by certified music educators.
 - o Miranda Ellis, Certification #1003808
- ✓ Provides music instruction for at least 30 consecutive minutes 2 days a week.
 - o See appendix for weekly teacher schedule
- ✓ Complies with class size requirements under s. 1003.03.
 - See appendix for complete class list
- ✓ Complies with the department's standards for early childhood music education programs for students in kindergarten through grade 2.
 - See appendix for standards alignment.

Hosford School has 102 students in Kindergarten through 2nd grade enrolled in a comprehensive music education program who qualify to receive a maximum of \$150 per fulltime equivalent (\$15,300).

The district qualifies based on prioritization #3. The implementation of new or support of existing K-2 music programming in districts with Title 1. The additional FTE will be used to support existing programs.

Project Abstract and Summary

This application narrative addresses how the school district will achieve the project objectives as described above including:

- ✓ detailed description of the project need including the activities to be implemented
 - O The project will continue to implement Music Play resources and lesson for Kg-2nd grade students using resources purchased during the 2023-24 grant cycle. The project will use new funds to purchase additional student music instruments (see attached list).
- ✓ the overall goals and objectives for 2024-2025 and specifically detail its related impact on Florida students and teachers
 - o The program overall goals and objectives will be to increase student achievement and knowledge of elements of music. This goal will be achieved through grade specific objectives (see appendix for examples).
- ✓ the program management structure and a detailed description of the positions, related job responsibilities, and salaries included in this grant.

 The program management structure will include fiscal oversight by the LCSB CFO and Grant Manager and the day-to-day operations will be managed by the school-based music teacher. All salaried positions are paid from the LCSB general fund.

Project Design

The LCSB application narrative provides information specific to the project design and the project activities to be implemented, including:

- ✓ a description of the target population, program recruiting process, community partners, exposure within the community, and credentials of participating teachers.
 - o The target population is all Kg-2nd grade students at Hosford School. There is no recruitment process.
 - o Community partnerships and exposure within the community include the Liberty Arts Council and District Advisory Council, as well as quarterly music programs open to the public.
- ✓ what work will be accomplished within this grant year and when, including information on any trainings or programming.
 - o New music instruments to support instructional materials will be purchases as soon as the grant funds are received.
 - o Pre and post testing data will be collected as units are completed.
 - o There will not be any related trainings.
- ✓ plan for teachers selected for the program and how/when they will be meeting together and supported by the district arts specialist or leadership.
 - There is only one music teacher in the school, she was selected to participate in the grant and met with the district grant manager to plan and implement the program.
- ✓ programming descriptions and relevant information on when programming will occur throughout the year.
 - The Music Play program provides easy to follow sequenced lessons including videos and all applicable materials. This program was purchased during the 2023-24 academic year and will be continued with expansion of music instruments during the 2024-25 academic year.
- ✓ information regarding what program development and improvement is scheduled to take place this year (this should include: length of programs and content to be covered, identification of alignment to Florida's state academic standards, processes, and procedures, etc.).

- ✓ identify targeted number of students to be served through onsite programming and detail how this information will be captured and reported.
 - All 102 Kg-2nd grade students at Hosford Elementary and Junior High School have been identified as targeted students to be served through onsite programming. This information will be captured and reported using FOCUS.
- ✓ identify targeted number of relationships with Florida teachers and school district administration and how this information will be captured and reported.
 - o The one school teacher will work with the one district administrator who manages all grants and curriculum for the district.
- ✓ identify targeted goal for curriculum alignment and development and how this information will be captured and reported.
 - o The music teacher will utilize the Kg-2nd grade curriculum to scaffold students' knowledge of music instruments and standards, in order to prepare them for the intermediate and secondary grade level programs, which she also teaches.

Deliverable Requirements
