We hope to use this scholarship to inspire a deserving high school senior and honor his love of life, his integrity and his many accomplishments.

Criteria: Candidates for the Donald Fetsko Memorial Scholarship are: individuals who are Wyoming Area graduating seniors, who have been accepted to a 2 or 4 year college or trade school. Preference will be given to those candidates who have participated in varsity Track or Basketball, or have had consistent part time jobs after school.

The \$2000 scholarship will be given thusly: \$500 will be awarded at the Celebration of Scholarships and \$1500 at the end of the first semester paid to the school which recipient is attending, with all enrolled-in courses passed with at least a C, and QPA of 2.75 at that time. The Donald Fetsko selection committee will make the final decision for the award.
