



Curriculum at our School




The State establishes high achievement standards for students:

- Science EOG 8th grade
- EOG Tests - ELA & Math grades 6-8
- 6-8 NC Check-Ins (3x's throughout the school year)
- ACCESS for ELs
- 8th grade CPR Test
